THE PARTICULARS

North Texas travels to Tuscaloosa, Ala. to take on the Alabama Crimson Tide. The game will be televised in the Dallas-Fort Worth area on the TXA 21 and can be heard on the Mean Green Radio Network. Kickoff is set for 11:21 a.m.

THE PRINCIPALS

The Mean Green hit the road for the second time in the this season and are looking to bounce back from a 31-30 double-overtime loss to Ohio. North Texas is 1-0 on the road this season while Alabama is in the middle of a three-game homestand. The Crimson Tide is coming off of a 40-14 victory over Florida International and hold a current 14-game regular season winning streak.

THE SERIES

North Texas trails Alabama in the all-time series 0-2, with the last meeting coming in 2002 and resulting in a 33-7 victory for the Crimson Tide. Both games have been played at Alabama.

NEXT GAME

The Mean Green will return home to face the Middle Tennessee Blue Raiders in the Sun Belt Conference opener for both teams. Alabama will continue it's homestand by playing host to Bobby Petrino and the Arkansas Razorbacks.

A CLOSER LOOK AT ALABAMA

Head Coach Nick Saban - Saban is entering his third season at the helm of the Alabama program. After a 7-6 finish in his first season, Saban took the Crimson Tide to a 12-0 regular season finish in 2008 before losing in the SEC Championship game and the Sugar Bowl. Entering the 2009 season Saban ranks fifth in win percentage, 68.6, among active coaches who have been around for at least 10 seasons. Before arriving in Tuscaloosa, Saban spent on year with the NFL's Miami Dolphins going 9-7. He has shown a knack for winning in the SEC though, taking the LSU Tigers to the SEC Championship three times, winning two of those contests, and collecting one national title (2003).

The Matchup – The Mean Green enters the game with looking to rebound off of a tough loss at home to Ohio, while the Crimson Tide comes in having defeated Sun Belt Conference member Florida International. The North Texas defense continues its improvement as the Mean Green are ranked 38th in total defense in the nation. Alabama racked up 516 yards of offense against FIU and is averaging 271.5 yards of rushing per game. The Crimson Tide running game has two players averaging over 100 yards a game in the young season led by Mark Ingram. Quarterback Greg McElroy is averaging 235 yards per game passing and hitting over 61 percent of his passes. The Alabama defense has allowed only 19 points a game and is giving up just 184.5 yards of offense.

Media Information Post-Game Interviews

The North Texas locker room is closed to all members of the media. Head coach Todd Dodge and requested players will be available for interviews following a brief cooling off period. Postgame interviews at Fouts Field will be held in the media interview room below the east stands.

Credentials For Media

Those wishing to cover North Texas must contact Eric Capper or Steven Bartolotta for credentials for home and away games. Seating is very limited at Fouts Field and requests for North Texas home games need to be made at least one week prior to the contest

Media Availability for Players

All player interviews will be conduted following the teams practice on Tuesday afternoon at the Athetic Center. Requsts for players should be made in advance through the sports information office. No interviews will be granted on Monday or Wednesday post practice. Special exemptions may be granted to those media wishing to interview a specific student-athlete before parctice at the discretion of the media relations office.

Sun Belt Teleconference

The Sun Belt Conference will conduct a weekly teleconference with each of the eight head coaches each Monday throughout the season. Coach Dodge will be on the call from 11:08-11:14 a.m. each week.

Post-Practice

Dodge will be available to media immediately following Tuesday's practice at the Darrell Dickey Practice Facility. Requests should be made in advance of practice to the media relations office.

Out of Town Media

Dodge and his assistant coaches are also available by request to out-of-town media Monday through Wednesday from 11 a.m.-12 noon. Contact the media relations office to arrange these requests.

Practice Coverage

Media has limited access to North Texas football practice. Viewing is available outside the fence of the practice facility. Video and still photography can be shot during the first 30 minutes of practice. Players and coaches are available for interviews following practice on Tuesday. All requests for interviews must be made in advance through the athletic media relations office.

Familiar Faces

North Texas head coach Todd Dodge and Alabama quarterback Greg McElroy will be on opposite sidelines after sharing the same sideline throughout McElroy's high school career at Southlake Carroll. With McElroy starting all 16 games for Dodge in 2005, Carroll won the Texas 5A state championship and the mythical national championship. Dodge was named the National Coach of the Year by Prep Nation and McElroy was named the Texas 5A Player of the Year. Dodge's son Riley, the current North Texas quarterback was a backup to McElroy as a sophomore that year.

Defense Strong in Loss

The North Texas defense only allowed 232 yards of total offense in the 31-30 loss to Ohio last week and 23 of those yards came in overtime. After the regulation four quarters, the Mean Green defense had only allowed 209 yards of total offense. The last time a North Texas defense allowed less than 232 yards of offense and still lost the game was against TCU in 2002 when the Mean Green allowed just 178 yards of total offense in a 16-10 loss.

What's the Rush

The Mean Green defense allowed just 63 yards rushing against Ohio in the double-overtime loss, which was the fewest rushing yards by a North Texas opponent since Louisiana-Lafayette was held to 40 yards on the ground in 2006. After two games, North Texas ranks third in the Sun Belt Conference in rushing defense, allowing an average of 116.0 per game. Last season the Mean Green ranked last in the conference, allowing an average of 207.1.

Tackles For Loss

The Mean Green defense recorded 10 tackles for a loss against Ohio, which was the most by a North Texas defense since it had 12 vs. Florida International in the 2007 season finale. Six different North Texas defenders had at least one tackle for a loss in the game, led by sophomore defensive end Brandon Akpunku with 2.5.

NCAA Improvement

While it is still very early in the season, North Texas has made a dramatic improvement this season in its NCAA ranking for team statistics. In the 17 team statistical categories that the NCAA keeps, North Texas ranks in the top 50 in eight categories and ranks below 100 in just one category (punt returns). Last season, the Mean Green ranked in the top 50 in just one category (pass offense) and below 100 in 12 categories.

Losing Late Lead

North Texas had not trailed on the scoreboard at any time this season until the 8:44 mark of the fourth quarter against Ohio last week. The Mean Green led from start to finish in the win over Ball State and led through three quarters against Ohio. The last time North Texas lost a game after leading to begin the fourth quarter was a 31-27 loss at Arkansas State in 2007.

Balanced Attack

Mean Green head coach Todd Dodge has always said that his offense has to be balanced in order to be successful. After two games, North Texas has 411 yards rushing and 402 yards passing which is a 51 to 49 percent balance. Last season, rushing accounted for 35 percent of the total offense while passing accounted for 65 percent.

Battle Front

This week's game at Alabama will be a tremendous test for the offensive line of North Texas. The front five for the Mean Green have been successful in the first two games, allowing just two quarterback sacks and helping the team rush for an average of 205 yards per game both of which rank in the top 30 among FBS teams. The Alabama defensive front has been outstanding in its first two games, averaging five quarterback sacks and allowing just 33 yards rushing per game. The Crimson Tide ranks second and fifth respectively in those two categories nationally.

Season Opening Victory

North Texas' win at Ball State was just the second win in a season opener in the last 13 years. Since the 1997 season, the Mean Green had been just 1-11 in season-opening games, with the only win coming at Middle Tennessee in 2005. Eight of those 11 losses came at the hands of a Big XII Conference school, including Texas three times and Oklahoma three times.

Non-Conference Road Win

The victory over Ball State was also a rare non-conference road win for the Mean Green, which had won just five of those games in the last 14 years before beating the Cardinals last week. Technically speaking, the last non-conference road win for North Texas before last week was the 51-40 win at Western Kentucky last season when the Hilltoppers were in their last year of transitioning into the Sun Belt Conference. Prior to that, the last non-conference road win was a 13-0 win at UL-Lafayette in 2000 when the Mean Green was a member of the Big West Conference. There was also two wins at Texas Tech in 1999 and 1997 as well as a 24-21 win at Northern Illinois in 1996. The trend that North Texas will try to break with this latest victory is that each of those previous four non-conference road wins came in losing seasons.

Holding it Down

The 10 points that North Texas allowed Ball State in the season-opener was the lowest scoring output by a Mean Green opponent since it held Louisiana-Lafayette to seven points in a 16-7 win in 2006. Over the past two years the North Texas defense allowed an average of 46.3 points per game and didn't hold any opponent in 2008 below 33 points.

Special Improvement

Last season North Texas ranked 114th in the nation with a kickoff return average of 18.5 yards and it ranked dead last in the nation in kickoff return coverage, allowing an average of 30.9 yards per return. Insert new special teams coach Shelton Gandy. In the win over Ball State, North Texas averaged 20.0 yards per return and allowed an average of 16.8 yards per return.

Conversion Difference

What a difference a week makes. In the win over Ball State, North Texas converted 7-of-15 third down attempts (47 percent) and held the Cardinals to just 2-of-13 on third downs (15 percent). Last week against Ohio, North Texas was 2-of-14 on third downs (14 percent) while Ohio was 5-of-18. After two games North Texas has a 31 percent success rate on third down while holding its opponents to a 23 percent success rate. Last season, North Texas was 38 percent converting its own third down attempts and opponents were successful 47 percent of the time on third down.

A New Home For The Mean Green

North Texas has called Fouts Field home since 1952, but those days are nearing an end. In 2011 the Mean Green will move into a new stadium located on-campus. Construction is set to



begin on the stadium in January of 2010 and the stadium will have a capacity of 30,000 with the ability for future expansion to raise the total to 50,000. North Texas partnered with HKS to build the stadium - the same company that designed the American Airlines Center in Dallas and the new Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas.

Big Guys Starting A Trend

While the Mean Green battled inexperience and youth in 2008, the 2009 North Texas offensive line is about as battled tested as you could want. The starting five have combined for a total of 81 career starts. The good thing about the group of Santiago (24 career starts), Bailey (15 career starts), Johnson (14 career starts), Drake (14 career starts), and Gill (14 career starts) is that only one is a senior (Bailey). In fact of the 10 offensive linemen in the two deep, only two are seniors, while four are juniors, three are sophomores and there is one freshman.

Forming A Committee

The offensive line might boast the most experienced, but the running back unit for North Texas is a close second. The Mean Green returns four or its top five rushers from last season and takes the redshirt off a promising young freshman. Senior Cam Montgomery is back after rushing for 928 yards last season. Backing up Montgomery is a host of players led by sophomore Lance Dunbar, junior Micah Mosely, sophomore James Hamilton and freshman Jeremi Mathis.

A Good Distributor

One of the areas that Coach Todd Dodge has emphasized this year is getting the ball in the hands of as many different people as possible. The last two seasons, wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald led the nation in receptions with over 110 each year. This year Dodge would like those receptions to be divided between two or even three receivers. So far, the plan is working, with four different wide receivers having seven or more catches. In all, seven different receivers have made at least one catch for the Mean Green this season.

Going For A Three-Peat

Todd Dodge has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. The Mean Green has never had three straight seasons of 4,000 or more yards of total offense before. North Texas is also going after its second 3,000-yard passing season in the last three years which has never happened before in school history.

Coaches Picks

Troy was chosen as the 2009 Preseason favorite to win the Sun Belt Conference as voted on by the leagues head coaches. The Trojans received five of the nine first-place votes. The Trojans were followed by Arkansas State, Florida Atlantic, Middle Tennessee, Florida International, Louisiana-Lafayette, ULM, North Texas, and Western Kentucky. Florida Atlantic, Florida International, Louisiana-Lafayette, and ULM picked up the remaining first-place votes.

Coaches Up/Coaches Down

North Texas will put three assistant coaches in the press box during games and will have six assistants along with head coach Todd Dodge on the sideline. In the press box will be offensive coordinator Todd Ford, along with defensive coordinator Gary DeLoach. Cornerbacks coach Carlton Buckels and safeties coach Chuck Peterson will join DeLoach in the press box. Linebackers coach David Rausch and defensive line coach Mike Nelson will be on the sidelines. Wide Receiver coach Clayton George and offensive line coach Spencer Leftwich will be on the sidelines along with special teams/running backs coach Shelton Gandy. Graduate assistant coaches Brian Morgan and Kevin Barbay will also be in the press box.

Well Represented in the NFL

North Texas has had more players drafted to play professional football than any other team in the Sun Belt Conference. Since the first NFL draft in 1936, North Texas has had 77 players drafted, including seven players picked in the first round. Arkansas State is second among Sun Belt Schools which have had players drafted with 46. Joe Greene is the highest drafted player ever from North Texas when he was selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers with the fourth overall pick in 1969.

TV Time

North Texas is scheduled to play on television eight times in 2009. The Mean Green will be shown in the Dallas/Fort Worth market on KTXA 21 for the Ohio and Army games as part of two-game deal with the station. The season opener at Ball State was played before a national audience on ESPNU and the game at Alabama will be broadcast across the SEC Regional Network. The game at Louisiana-Lafayette and two home games with Florida Atlantic and Western Kentucky will be shown as part of the Sun Belt Conference package with ESPN Regional. The game at Troy will be broadcast by the Troy ISP Network. KTXA 21 will also air the North Texas games that are being broadcast as part of the Sun Belt package.

Charr-ging Them Up

One of the new additions to North Texas this offseason was that of a strength and conditioning coach for football. Aaron Ausmus started the program in January before leaving to take the same position at Tennessee. Todd Dodge then turned to Charr Gahagan to replace Ausmus. Gahagan was at the University of Washingon and spent eight seasons at USC before that. He was a three-time national champion in powerlifting while at Louisiana Tech. The results have been noticable. Defensive lineman Eddrick Gilmore put on 29 pounds in the offseason, going from 240 to 269 in the new program. Offensive lineman Nate Jenkins went from 379 down to 349 pounds this season.

Did You Know

North Texas has its share of players on the roster that have great genes of their own but some have even better bloodlines. Wide receiver Alex Lott is the son of former Oklahoma All Big 8 quarterback Thomas Lott. His older brother just finished up his college career at Rice. Freshman wide receiver Desmond Brigham is the nephew of current Arizona Cardinals wide receiver Jamaica Rector. And if that wasn't enough freshman defensive back Jeremy Phillips is the younger brother of Jason Phillips, last seasons Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year and a former linebacker at TCU.

Drop the "S"

The Mean Green vs. Crimson Tide game this week has a rare feature to it. It is one of only six games where two of the 12 Football Bowl Subdivision face off head to head. The 12 teams that differentiate themselves from the 120 other members are the Alabama Crimson Tide, North Texas Mean Green, Illinois Fighting Illini, Marshall Thundering Herd, Navy Midshipmen, NC State Wolfpack, Nevada Wolfpack, Notre Dame Fighting Irish, Stanford Cardinal, Syracuse Orange, Tulane Green Wave and Tulsa Golden Hurricane.

Early Dominance

The Mean Green has come out of the locker room strong thus far in 2009. Through two games, the defense has allowed a mere 216 total yards and three points in the first half of play. The offense on the other hand, has racked up 344 yards and put 10 points on the board in both games. North Texas has yet to trail in a first half this season.

Following In Footsteps

North Texas head coach Todd Dodge is one of only 56 known major college head coaches who have had the rare opportunity to coach his son in college. There are only three other current sets of father-and-son duos on Football Bowl Subdivision teams, Dan and Cody Hawkins at Colorado, Ricky and Brad Bustle at Louisiana-Lafayette and Steve and Scott Spurrier at South Carolina. Todd and Riley make only the 22nd father-and-son, quarter back-and-coach tandem in FBS history.

Lack of Senioritis

The North Texas roster has only 12 seniors for the 2009 season. Only six teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision have fewer seniors on their roster than North Texas, and only three of those teams (Boise State, Miami (OH), and Idaho) are non-BCS teams.

MEAN GREEN OFFENSIVE/INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Dodge Injured

Redshirt freshman Riley Dodge was injured in the third quarter against Ohio and did not see action in the Mean Green's last six possessions of the game. He suffered a sprain to his non-throwing shoulder and left the game having completed 12 of 20 passes for 117 yards and one touchdown. The severity of his injury has not been disclosed and his availability for return is unknown as of Monday.

Tuned Up

Junior quarterback Nathan Tune was pressed into duty after Riley Dodge went down with an injury. Tune his most extensive playing time in a North Texas uniform as he had nine completions and 15 attempts. Tune had 69 yards, which is a career-best Coming into the year Tune had played in just seven combined games in his first two seasons. He has never made a start at the collegiate level but isn't new to playing the position. In high school, Tune led Celina to a perfect 16-0 record in 2005 and a state title

Learning Fast

True freshman Darius Carey had six catches for 47 yards against Ohio. Despite playing just his second FBS game, Carey is becoming a favorite target of North Texas quarterbacks. His six catches were the most by a true freshman for the Mean Green since the 2007 season.

Best Back-To-Back For Cam

Running back Cam Montgomery has put together his best back-to-back games in a North Texas uniform to start the 2009 season. Montgomery followed up his 149-yard effort against Ball State with 88 yards against Ohio. Cam's best three-game stretch came last season when he rushed for 314 yards against ULM, Troy, and Western Kentucky. Montgomery leads the Sun Belt in rushing and his 118.5 yard average per game is 13th in the nation heading into Alabama. That will get tested this week as Alabama is fifth in the nation in rushing defense, allowing only 32 yards game.

Backs in Business

Depth at running back will not be a problem for North Texas this season. All-Conference candidate Cam Montgomery is leading the team in rushing, but sophomore backup Lance Dunbar would be the primary back for many FBS teams. Along with Dunbar is junior Micah Mosely who has played in 19 games and has over 115 career carries and freshman Jeremi Mathis who has played in both games this season.

First TD In FBS

Junior Jamaal Jackson was just a few yards shy of his first career TD at the FBS level against Ball State but he found pay-dirt against Ohio for the first time. Jackson's 16-yard TD grab was his first and he joined fellow junior Michael Outlaw as the two TD recipients this season for North Texas. The two junior college transfers have started both games for North Texas and have accounted for a combined 16 catches and 182 yards.

A Top 10 In Sight

Running back Cam Montgomery has topped the 1,000 yard rushing mark for his career and has his sights set on joining the top 10 all-time at North Texas. Montgomery is just 700 yards from entering the top 10 all-time for most rushing yards in a career. If he does so this year Montgomery will be knocking a legend from the top 10 list. Ranking 10th all-time in rushing yards is Abner Haynes with 1,864 yards from 1957-59.

Nwigwe Serving Notice

Senior linebacker Tobe Nwigwe has develop into one of the top linebacker in the Sun Belt Conference after a breakout year in 2008. Nwigwe led North Texas and ranked 22nd in the nation last year with an average of 9.3 tackles per game and his 111 total tackles was the most by any linebacker since 2003. After two games this season, Nwigwe ranks first in the Sun Belt and fifth in the nation in tackles with an average of 13.0 per game. He had a career-high 15 tackles in the double over.

Coming of Age

North Texas still has a very young defensive secondary, with all four starters either in their first or second year with the Mean Green. Sophomores Royce Hill and DaWaylon Cook are starters at cornerback and safety after playing extensively as true freshmen last season. Adryan Adams transferred to North Texas last year, but is in his first year as a full-time starter at cornerback. Fellow transfer Ira Smith is in his first year at North Texas and is the other starter at safety. The foursome has held up admirably in two games, allowing opponents just 154 yards passing per game. They lead the Sun Belt Conference in pass defense efficiency with a rating of 90.2, which includes two interceptions and just two touchdowns allowed.

Weighty Up Front

One of the biggest areas, literally, that North Texas has tried to address in the offseason was the defensive line. The Mean Green brought in six new players to help the defensive line and a lot of it was size. If you compare the starting front four to this seasons projected starting four the Mean Green has added nearly 20 pounds. Last season's starting defensive line averaged 265 pounds up front, this season the lineup of Brandon Akpunku, Shavod Atkinson, Kelvin Jackson and Tevinn Cantly check in at an average of 285 pounds. Atkinson and Jackson are both junior college transfers who weigh in at 307 and 309 pounds at the tackle spot.

True Debut

True freshman punter Will Atterberry has been a pleasant surprise for North Texas this season. Through two games, Atterberry leads the Sun Belt Conference with seven punts (of his nine attempts) downed inside the opponent 20-yard line. He is averaging 42.6 yards per attempt, which ranks third in the Sun Belt and includes punting in wet, miserable conditions against Ohio.

Special Teams Improvement

North Texas last season had its struggles on special teams. Of 119 Football Bowl Subdivision teams last year, North Texas ranked 111th in punt returns, 114th in kickoff returns, 109th in punt coverage and 119th in kickoff coverage. While it is still very early, the Mean Green has shown vast improvement in those areas. After two games, North Texas ranks 101st in punt returns, 89th in kickoff returns, 69th in punt coverage and 41st in kickoff coverage.

Knott A Problem

Plackicker Jeremy Knott tied his career-high with three field goals against Ohio and he is hitting on 71 percent of his kicks this season. Knott is right on his average as he connected on 70.6 percent of his field goals last season. Knott from under 40-yards is 11-for-12 in his North Texas career. From 40-yards or more he is 6-for-12.

Return Drought Continues

It has been 123 games and counting since North Texas has returned a kickoff for a touchdown. Broderick McGrew was the last Mean Green player to do so when he took a kickoff and returned it 100 yards in a 28-27 loss to Utah State on Nov. 14, 1998. North Texas' current active streak ranks as the fifth-longest without a kickoff return for a score.

HEAD COACH TODD DODGE

Todd Dodge understands. The North Texas head football coach understands that he was


hired to turn around a program that had slumped. He understands that, as he enters his third year, the pace of improvement has not come at the rate that many Mean Green fans had hoped for. But he has not wavered from his plan and the only pressure to hasten the timeline for progress comes from within his own uncompromising commitment to success. Dodge understands his role in the development of the North Texas football program and he is fully invested.

In two years at the helm, Dodge has tried to establish a foundation that would lead to victory. The baseline of success on the field has been set and now Dodge believes he has the pieces in place to show that his work has not been futile. He has quietly assembled a team of coaches and players that he believes can thrive in his system. It has been a two-year process of molding young men and tweaking a staff that will serve as the groundwork for developing his program.



On the field, Dodge's influence has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. Dodge is now at least partially responsible for three of North Texas' top 10 total offensive performances, with 4,901 as a head coach in 2007 and 4,031 as an assistant coach in 1993 added to last year's performance.

One of the best success stories during the Dodge era will always be of wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald. Fitzgerald came to North Texas as a walk-on and spent his first two seasons in obscurity while seeing little action in a run-based offense. In his first year of Dodge's

Dodge, 45, officially assumed control of the North Texas football program on Dec. 26, 2006 - three days after he had coached his Southlake Carroll High School football team to its fourth state championship in five years. As one of the most widely respected high school football coaches in the nation, Dodge led Southlake Carroll to a 79-1 record over his final five years, with the only loss coming by a single point in the 2003 state championship game. Dodge closed his high school career with an amazing 48-game winning streak.

Dodge had already been familiar with the Mean Green, having served as an offensive assistant coach

in 1992 and 1993. During his tenure he helped direct the Mean Green offense to a per-game average of 348 yards and 26 points. He oversaw the progression of quarterback Mitch Maher, who holds numerous Mean Green offensive records, including pass completions, passing yards, and total offense. Maher went on to play for the Canadian Football Leagues' Shreveport Pirates.

Prior to coming to North Texas, Dodge's name had become synonymous with high school football success on the national scale. In addition to winning four class 5A state championships in five years, Southlake Carroll was recognized as national champions by USA Today in 2004 and 2006, and by PrepNation.com in 2005. Dodge amassed a 98-11 record overall at Carroll after taking over in 2000. In 2005, the Dragons set the Texas 5A state record for most points in a single season by tallying 764.

Dodge was named National Coach of the Year by Schutt Sports in 2004 and by USA Today in 2005. In 2006 PrepNation.com named him the Southwest Region coach of the year.


