## THE PARTICULARS

The Mean Green return to Fouts Field to take on the Florida Atlantic Owls for homecoming. The game will be televised on the Sun Belt Network along with ESPN Gameplan and ESPN360. The Mean Green Radio Network will also carry the game, with George Dunham and Hank Dickenson making the call. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m.

## THE PRINCIPALS

Both teams enter the game struggling as North Texas has lost four straight while Florida Atlantic is winless on the season. The Mean Green is 0-2 in league play while FAU is 0-1. North Texas is 0-2 at home this season while the Owls are winless on the road this season at 0-2. The Owls are coming off a bye week and have not played since a two-point loss to Wyoming on Oct. 3.

## THE SERIES

Florida Atlantic leads the all-time series with North Texas 5-0. The last meeting came Nov. 8 2008, in Boca Raton, Fla., where the Owls won 46-13. In Denton the Owls have won three times but all three of those wins have been by 10 points or less.

## **NEXT GAME**

North Texas will hit the road once again, this time to Troy, Ala., to face off with the Trojans of Troy. Florida Atlantic will make the trip to Louisiana-Lafayette for their next game with the Ragin' Cajuns.

## A CLOSER LOOK AT FLORIDA ATLANTIC OWLS

Head Coach Ricky Schnellenberger - The legendary coach of the Owls enters his ninth season as the head coach with FAU. He started the program in 1998 and has coached every game the program has ever played starting in 2001. Schnellenberger has led the Owls to back-to-back Bowl games and victories in 2007 and 2008. Schnellenberger is most remebered for his national championship as the head coach at Miami in 1983. After Miami he spent 10 seasons at Louisville then one year at Oklahoma. He is just two wins shy of 150 for his career.

**The Matchup** – Both teams are struggling heading into the matchup having lost four straight. North Texas featuers the top ranked defense in the Sun Belt Conference, allowing 363 yards per contest. The battle will feature the second best passing offense in the league in Florida Atlantic while North Texas is the top-ranked pass defense in the Sun Belt this season. The Owls are led by Co- Preseason Player of the Year in quarterback Rusty Smith. He has thrown for 944 yards this season and five touchdowns. Lance Dunbar's performance against Lousiana-Lafayette has vaulted him to third in the Sun Belt in rushing at 77 yards a game. His seven touchdowns lead the conference and he is 16th in the country in scoring. Through four games the Owls defense has allowed almost 448 yards a game. Smith though has powered FAU to the 24th ranked passing game in the country.

## Media Information Post-Game Interviews

The North Texas locker room is closed to all members of the media. Head coach Todd Dodge and requested players will be available for interviews following a brief cooling off period. Postgame interviews at Fouts Field will be held in the media interview room below the east stands.

## **Credentials For Media**

Those wishing to cover North Texas must contact Eric Capper or Steven Bartolotta for credentials for home and away games. Seating is very limited at Fouts Field and requests for North Texas home games need to be made at least one week prior to the contest.

## **Media Availability for Players**

All player interviews will be conduted following the teams practice on Tuesday afternoon at the Athetic Center. Requsts for players should be made in advance through the sports information office. No interviews will be granted on Monday or Wednesday post practice. Special exemptions may be granted to those media wishing to interview a specific student-athlete before parctice at the discretion of the media relations office.

## **Sun Belt Teleconference**

The Sun Belt Conference will conduct a weekly teleconference with each of the eight head coaches each Monday throughout the season. Coach Dodge will be on the call from 11:08-11:14 a.m. each week.

## Post-Practice

Dodge will be available to media immediately following Tuesday's practice at the Darrell Dickey Practice Facility. Requests should be made in advance of practice to the media relations office.

## Out of Town Media

Dodge and his assistant coaches are also available by request to out-of-town media Monday through Wednesday from 11 a.m.-12 noon. Contact the media relations office to arrange these requests.

## Practice Coverage

Media has limited access to North Texas football practice. Viewing is available outside the fence of the practice facility. Video and still photography can be shot during the first 30 minutes of practice. Players and coaches are available for interviews following practice on Tuesday. All requests for interviews must be made in advance through the athletic media relations office.

#### **Quick Hitters on This Week's Matchup**

North Texas leads the Sun Belt Conference in total defense allowing an average of 363.0 yards per game. The Mean Green allowed an average of 484 yards per game over the previous two years... The Mean Green leads the Sun Belt in pass defense average (192.6 ypg) and pass defense efficiency (112.6) while Florida Atlantic ranks second in the league in passing offense (263.8 ypg)... North Texas leads the Sun Belt in kickoff returns with an average of 22.1 per return. FAU is second in the league in kickoff coverage... Florida Atlantic is second in the conference in third down conversion percentage (42.1) while North Texas leads the conference in third down defense, holding opponents to 33.3 percent... These two teams rank at the bottom in turnover margin, with FAU having a margin of -0.75 per game and North Texas coming in last at -1.60 per game.

#### **Battle of Sophomore Backs**

Florida Atlantic and North Texas both have sophomore running backs who are leading the way for the team this year. The Owls' Alfred Morris leads the Sun Belt Conference with an average of 94.2 yards per game while North Texas' Lance Dunbar ranks third with an average of 77.0 yards per game. Dunbar has seven touchdowns compared to two for Morris and Dunbar averages 5.9 yards per carry compared to 4.6 for Morris.

## **Dunbar Earns Player of the Week Honors**

North Texas sophomore running back Lance Dunbar made the most of his first collegiate start last week against Louisiana-Lafayette. The Haltom City, Texas native was named the Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Week and National Running Back of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards. Dunbar rushed for a career-high 187 yards and tied a North Texas record with four rushing touchdowns against the Ragin' Cajuns. It was the 14th-best single game performance by a running back in the nation this year and he became just the fourth Football Bowl Subdivision back to rush for four touchdowns in a game this season. He is one of just eight running backs in Sun Belt Conference history to rush for four touchdowns in a game.

## **Homecoming Games**

This week's game with Florida Atlantic will be Homecoming for North Texas. The Mean Green is 39-19-1 all-time in Homecoming games, but has lost the last two. There have been some great homecoming games over the years, including the 24-21 win over Middle Tennessee in 2001 when North Texas entered the game 0-5 and the Blue Raiders came in 5-0. In 1998 North Texas held off a high-powered Nevada team 27-21 behind great defense and a rushing attack led by this week's North Texas Hall of Fame inductee Ja'Quay Wilburn who rushed for 131 yards and a score. Perhaps one of the biggest games in North Texas homecoming history came in 1976 when Hayden Fry's team led Florida State and first-year coach Bobby Bowden 20-13 late in the fourth quarter, but couldn't keep the Seminoles from scoring a touchdown and two-point conversion with 2:13 remaining to steal the victory.

#### Hall of Fame Induction

This week's Homecoming festivities are highlighted by the North Texas Athletics Hall of Fame induction ceremony Saturday morning. Among the 2009 class of inductees is former North Texas running back Ja'Quay Wilburn, who finished his career in 2000 as the school's all-time leading rusher. Wilburn totaled 3,120 rushing yards in his career and still ranks as the third-leading rusher in school history (having been surpassed by Patrick Cobbs and Jamario Thomas). He is the only back in North Texas history to lead his team in rushing in four consecutive years.

## **Outgaining Opponents**

Despite a 1-4 record after four games, North Texas has outgained four of its five opponents in total offense. If you throw out the lopsided 523-187 advantage that No. 2 Alabama had against the Mean Green, the total offense average per game for North Texas is 431.8 while its opponents are averaging 323.0. Since Dodge took over at North Texas in 2007, North Texas is 2-10 when outgaining its opponent in total offense. Last season North Texas lost the only two games when it outgained its opponents (Florida International and Louisiana-Monroe).

## **Holding Leads**

In losses to Ohio and Louisiana-Lafayette this year, North Texas has been unable to protect a double-digit lead in the second half. The Mean Green was up 17-6 over Ohio in the third quarter before the Bobcats scored two unanswered touchdowns to take a 20-17 fourth-quarter lead in a game the Bobcats eventually won in double overtime. Against Louisiana-Lafayette, North Texas led 34-24 early in the fourth quarter but was outscored 14-0 in the last 9:30 of the game to lose 38-34. Last year North Texas was 1-0 when leading at the half, but in the 2 ½ years under Todd Dodge, the Mean Green is just 3-5 when leading at the half.

## **Red Zone Improvement**

North Texas entered the Louisiana-Lafayette game having scored just 70 percent of the times it had been in the red zone (12-of-17). Only seven of those 12 scores (58 percent) were touchdowns for the Mean Green. Against the Ragin' Cajuns, North Texas made four trips inside the red zone and scored all four times, including three touchdowns.

## **Damaging Turnovers**

Turnovers have made a huge difference in the end result of two games for North Texas this season. In losses to Ohio and Louisiana-Lafayette, the Mean Green combined for eight turnovers – four each game. Also in those two games, North Texas threw an interception that was returned for a touchdown – one by Nathan Tune against Ohio and one by Riley Dodge against Louisiana-Lafayette. Those two opponents scored on five of the eight possessions that resulted from a North Texas turnover. The two losses came by a combined five points and the two opponents scored 23 points off of the eight turnovers.

## **More Costly Mistakes**

In addition to turnovers by the offense, North Texas has made mistakes on special teams and defense that have been costly to the team's success. Last week against Louisiana-Lafayette, North Texas had a blocked punt returned for a touchdown and had three Ragin' Cajun fourth-down conversion attempts kept alive by penalties – all three of which resulted in touchdowns. In an overtime loss to Ohio the Mean Green defense allowed a touchdown on 4th-and-Goal from the 15-yard line and also roughed the passer to set up the Bobcats winning two-point conversion from the 1-yard line. In a comeback effort against Middle Tennessee, North Texas had a field goal attempt blocked in the first quarter and then trailed by nine points and needed a fourth quarter stop when it committed an unsportsmanlike penalty that kept a drive alive and allowed Middle Tennessee to score on the next play to seal the victory.

## No Sack Attack

The North Texas offensive line has done a tremendous job protecting the quarterback, allowing just three sacks in the first five games. The Mean Green is tied for fourth in the nation with an average just .6 sacks allowed per game. When you look at the ratio of sacks per pass attempt, North Texas has allowed just three sacks in 183 pass attempts for an average of .016. Only Iowa State (two sacks in 177 pass attempts) and Cincinnati (three sacks in 188 pass attempts) have a better ratio of sacks allowed per pass attempt than North Texas. Below is a look at the top teams in the number of sacks allowed per pass attempt.

## **Big Plays Coming from Youngsters**

In five games, North Texas has 28 plays that have covered more than 20 yards, including six rushing plays, eight passing plays, 13 kick returns and one interception return. Of those 28 plays, 23 have come from freshmen and sophomores and only one has come from a senior (running back Cam Montgomery). Sophomore defensive back Royce Hill leads the way with 10 plays of more than 20 yards, including nine kick returns and one interception return. Sophomore running back Lance Dunbar has five – three rushing and two receiving.

## **Balanced Attack**

Mean Green head coach Todd Dodge has always said that his offense has to be balanced in order to be successful. After four games, North Texas has 864 yards rushing and 1,050 yards passing which is a 45 to 55 percent balance. Last season, rushing accounted for 35 percent of the total offense while passing accounted for 65 percent.

#### Third Down Conversions

In the three games leading up to last week's game against Louisiana-Lafayette, North Texas had converted just 24 percent of its third down attempts (10-of-41). Against the Ragin' Cajuns, the Mean Green had its best third-down conversion game of the year, moving the chains on 8-of-16 third down attempts for 50 percent. A big part of the success has to do with the success on first and second down to stay away from long yardage situations on third down. Against the Cajuns, North Texas faced third and long seven times in 18 third downs (39 percent). In the previous three games, the Mean Green faced third and long 19 times in 41 third downs (46 percent).

## A New Home For The Mean Green

North Texas has called Fouts Field home since 1952, but those days are nearing an end. In



2011 the Mean Green will move into a new stadium located on-campus. Construction is set to begin on the stadium in January of 2010 and the stadium will have a capacity of 30,000 with the ability for future expansion to raise the total to 50,000. North Texas partnered with HKS to build the stadium - the same company that designed the American Airlines Center in Dallas and the new Cowboys Stadium in Arlington,

Texas.

## **Big Guys With Experience**

While the Mean Green battled inexperience and youth in 2008, the 2009 North Texas offensive line is about as battled tested as you could want. The starting five have combined for a total of 94 career starts. The good thing about the group of Santiago (27 career starts), Bailey (18 career starts), Johnson (17 career starts), Drake (17 career starts), and Gill (15 career starts) is that only one is a senior (Bailey). In fact of the 10 offensive linemen in the two deep, only two are seniors, while four are juniors, three are sophomores and there is one freshman.

## A Good Distributor

One of the areas that Coach Todd Dodge has emphasized this year is getting the ball in the hands of as many different people as possible. The last two seasons, wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald led the nation in receptions with over 110 each year. This year Dodge would like those receptions to be divided between two or even three receivers. So far, the plan is working, with five different wide receivers having 10 catches or more. In all, 11 different receivers have made at least one catch for the Mean Green this season.

## Going For A Three-Peat

Todd Dodge has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. The Mean Green has never had three straight seasons of 4,000 or more yards of total offense before. North Texas is also going after its second 3,000-yard passing season in the last three years which has never happened before in school history.

#### Coaches Up/Coaches Down

North Texas will put three assistant coaches in the press box during games and will have six assistants along with head coach Todd Dodge on the sideline. In the press box will be offensive coordinator Todd Ford, along with defensive coordinator Gary DeLoach. Cornerbacks coach Carlton Buckels and safeties coach Chuck Peterson will join DeLoach in the press box. Linebackers coach David Rausch and defensive line coach Mike Nelson will be on the sidelines. Wide Receiver coach Clayton George and offensive line coach Spencer Leftwich will be on the sidelines along with special teams/running backs coach Shelton Gandy. Graduate assistant coaches Brian Morgan and Kevin Barbay will also be in the press box.

#### Well Represented in the NFL

North Texas has had more players drafted to play professional football than any other team in the Sun Belt Conference. Since the first NFL draft in 1936, North Texas has had 77 players drafted, including seven players picked in the first round. Arkansas State is second among Sun Belt Schools which have had players drafted with 46. Joe Greene is the highest drafted player ever from North Texas when he was selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers with the fourth overall pick in 1969.

#### TV Time

North Texas is scheduled to play on television eight times in 2009. The Mean Green will be shown in the Dallas/Fort Worth market on KTXA 21 for the Ohio and Army games as part of two-game deal with the station. The season opener at Ball State was played before a national audience on ESPNU and the game at Alabama was shown across the SEC Regional Network. The game at Louisiana-Lafayette and two home games with Florida Atlantic and Western Kentucky will be shown as part of the Sun Belt Conference package. The game at Troy will be broadcast by the Troy ISP Network. KTXA 21 will also air the North Texas games that are being broadcast as part of the Sun Belt package.

#### **Charr-ging Them Up**

One of the new additions to North Texas this offseason was that of a strength and conditioning coach for football. Aaron Ausmus started the program in January before leaving to take the same position at Tennessee. Todd Dodge then turned to Charr Gahagan to replace Ausmus. Gahagan was at the University of Washingon and spent eight seasons at USC before that. He was a three-time national champion in powerlifting while at Louisiana Tech. The results have been noticable. Defensive lineman Eddrick Gilmore put on 29 pounds in the offseason, going from 240 to 269 in the new program. Offensive lineman Nate Jenkins went from 379 down to 349 pounds this season.

#### **Did You Know**

North Texas has its share of players on the roster that have great genes of their own but some have even better bloodlines. Wide receiver Alex Lott is the son of former Oklahoma All Big 8 quarterback Thomas Lott. His older brother just finished up his college career at Rice. Freshman wide receiver Desmond Brigham is the nephew of current Arizona Cardinals wide receiver Jamaica Rector. And if that wasn't enough freshman defensive back Jeremy Phillips is the younger brother of Jason Phillips, last season's Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year and a former linebacker at TCU.

## Following In Footsteps

North Texas head coach Todd Dodge is one of only 56 known major college head coaches who have had the rare opportunity to coach his son in college. There are only three other current sets of father-and-son duos on Football Bowl Subdivision teams, Dan and Cody Hawkins at Colorado, Ricky and Brad Bustle at Louisiana-Lafayette and Steve and Scott Spurrier at South Carolina. Todd and Riley make only the 22nd father-and-son, quarter back-and-coach tandem in FBS history.

## Lack of Senioritis

The North Texas roster has only 12 seniors for the 2009 season. Only six teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision have fewer seniors on their roster than North Texas, and only three of those teams (Boise State, Miami (OH), and Idaho) are non-BCS teams.

## **Record Enrollment**

The University of North Texas marked its ninth consecutive year of record-breaking student population when the fall 2009 enrollment was announced at 36,206. This year's numbers reflect the largest single-year increase since 2002 and continue to secure North Texas as the fourth-largest university in the state of Texas.

## **One Overtime Not Enough**

North Texas has played in just two overtime games since the NCAA introduced the format in 1996. The Mean Green is 1-1 in its two overtime games, defeating Florida International 25-22 in seven overtimes in 2006 and losing to Ohio 31-30 in two overtimes this year. The Mean Green is the only FBS team that has never had a game decided in the first overtime period.

## **Getting it Dun**

Sophomore running back Lance Dunbar is setting the bar higher each week. Coming in off the bench against Middle Tennessee in week four Dunbar rushed for a career-high 101 yards. In his first collegiate start last week against Louisiana-Lafayette, he shattered that mark with 187 yards and tied a North Texas record with four rushing touchdowns. Dunbar has five of the team's 18 plays of 25 yards or more including a season-long 66-yard touchdown rush against Middle Tennessee. He is averaging 5.9 yards per carry and has scored eight of the team's 13 touchdowns.

## **Dodging Bullets**

Redshirt freshman Riley Dodge has started exactly four games as a college quarterback. While he has struggled in his last two outings against Middle Tennessee and Louisiana-Lafayette, his numbers still stack up very well with other former Mean Green freshman quarterbacks. In four games, Dodge has a completion percentage of 64.8 and a pass efficiency rating of 109.3. Here is a look at how some other Mean Green quarterbacks did in their freshman year:

#### **Cam Closing In**

Senior running back Cam Montgomery is closing in on the cracking the top 10 career rushing leaders list at North Texas. Montgomery did not play last week against Louisiana-Lafayette while nursing a hamstring injury and still has 244 yards for the season and 1,172 yards for his career. Montgomery needs 692 to get on the exclusive rushing list, which is led by Patrick Cobbs with 4,050. If he makes the list, Montgomery will be knocking a legend from the top 10 list. Ranking 10th all-time in rushing yards is Abner Haynes with 1,864 yards from 1957-59.

## **Transfer Targets**

Junior college transfer wide receivers Jamaal Jackson and Michael Outlaw have made an immediate impact on the North Texas offense. Both are in the starting lineup and they rank first and second on the team in both receptions and receiving yards. Jackson has a team-high 32 catches for 283 yards while Outlaw has 19 catches for 178 yards. Outlaw is averaging 9.4 yards per catch, while Jackson is close behind at 8.8.

## Money on the Line

Despite several interchanging parts, the North Texas offensive line has held up admirably this season. An injury to starting left tackle Victor Gill forced Matt Tomlinson into the lineup and the sophomore didn't allow a single sack in starts against Alabama and Middle Tennessee. In all, eight different offensive linemen have played in the five games. After sitting out last season with an injury, junior guard Kelvin Drake has come back strong, playing 369 snaps and recording 16 knock-downs and six pancakes in the first five games. Junior Esteban Santiago had his best game of the season last week against Louisiana-Lafayette, grading out on the coaches grading sheet above 100 percent.

## **Learning Fast**

True freshman wide receiver Darius Carey has steadily improved each week and is now a fixture in the starting lineup and a featured target of Mean Green quarterbacks. Carey is third on the team in both receptions (18) and receiving yards (152). He is also working his way into the return game, returning a punt 62 yards for a touchdown that was called back against Middle Tennessee.

## Linebackers Leading Way

Senior Tobe Nwigwe and junior Craig Robertson have been the defensive leaders as starting linebackers for North Texas this season. Robertson leads the team with 46 total tackles, with Nwigwe close behind at 44. The duo ranks sixth and seventh in the Sun Belt Conference. Robertson posted a career-high in tackles with 12 against Ball State in the season-opener and Nwigwe had a career-best the following week against Ohio with 15. The two also led the team last season in tackles with Nwigwe posting 111 and Robertson close behind with 94.

## Coming of Age

North Texas still has a very young defensive secondary, with all four starters either in their first or second year with the Mean Green. Sophomores Royce Hill and DaWaylon Cook are starters at cornerback and safety after playing extensively as true freshmen last season. Adryan Adams transferred to North Texas last year, but is in his first year as a full-time starter at cornerback. Fellow transfer Ira Smith is in his first year at North Texas and is the other starter at safety. The foursome has held up admirably in five games, allowing opponents just 192.6 yards passing per game to rank first in the Sun Belt Conference. They lead the Sun Belt Conference and rank 35th nationally in pass defense efficiency with a rating of 109.8, which includes just 963 yards through the air.

## **Cook Coming On**

Sophomore safety DaWaylon Cook is feeling comfortable in his second year and his new position. As a true freshman last year, Cook was a backup cornerback and totaled 10 tackles in 11 games. After a year of experience and an offseason move to safety, Cook has become a leader in the secondary. After one tackle in the season opener, Cook has averaged 8.8 tackles in the last four games, including a career-best 11 against Alabama. He is third on the team in tackles and 29 of his 36 total stops are solo efforts.

## Weighty Up Front

One of the biggest areas, literally, that North Texas addressed in the offseason was the defensive line. The Mean Green brought in six new players to help the defensive line and added a lot of size. Transfers Kelvin Jackson and Shavod Atkinson are the regular starters at defensive tackle, weighing in at 309 and 307 pounds respectively. John Weber is also a transfer who can play both tackle and end and weighs 288 pounds. True freshman defensive tackle Kyle White, who tips the scales at 309 pounds, saw his first action against Alabama. Add 301-pound redshirt freshman Tevinn Cantly to give you the fourth interior defensive lineman that are all playing this year. Last year North Texas didn't play any defensive lineman that weighed 300 pounds or more.

## A.K. More Than O.K.

Sophomore Brandon Akpunku (whose nickname is A.K.) is feeling more and more comfortable at his new defensive end position. Akpunku spent his true freshman year as a backup linebacker who saw limited action on special teams, but has earned a spot as a starter at defensive end this year. He leads the team and ranks fourth in the Sun Belt in sacks with three and ranks fourth in the league in tackles for loss with six. The only problem is all of his sacks and tackles for loss have come in the two home games for North Texas, he is still looking for his first stop behind the line on the road.

## **Good Will Punting**

True freshman punter Will Atterberry has been a pleasant surprise for North Texas this season. Through five games, Atterberry leads Sun Belt Conference with 14 punts (of his 28 attempts) downed inside the opponent 20-yard line. He is averaging 41.1 yards per attempt, which ranks fifth in the Sun Belt and he had his first touchback of the year last week against Louisiana-Lafayette. He also has five punts of 50 yards or more.

## **Return Drought Continues**

It has been 126 games and counting since North Texas has returned a kickoff for a touchdown. Broderick McGrew was the last Mean Green player to do so when he took a kickoff and returned it 100 yards in a 28-27 loss to Utah State on Nov. 14, 1998. North Texas' current active streak ranks as the fourth-longest without a kickoff return for a score.

## HEAD COACH TODD DODGE

Todd Dodge understands. The North Texas head football coach understands that he was


hired to turn around a program that had slumped. He understands that, as he enters his third year, the pace of improvement has not come at the rate that many Mean Green fans had hoped for. But he has not wavered from his plan and the only pressure to hasten the timeline for progress comes from within his own uncompromising commitment to success. Dodge understands his role in the development of the North Texas football program and he is fully invested.

In two years at the helm, Dodge has tried to establish a foundation that would lead to victory. The baseline of success on the field has been set and now Dodge believes he has the pieces in place to show that his work has not been futile. He has quietly assembled a team of coaches and players that he believes can thrive in his system. It has been a two-year process of molding young men and tweaking a staff that will serve as the groundwork for developing his program.



On the field, Dodge's influence has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. Dodge is now at least partially responsible for three of North Texas' top 10 total offensive performances, with 4,901 as a head coach in 2007 and 4,031 as an assistant coach in 1993 added to last year's performance.

One of the best success stories during the Dodge era will always be of wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald. Fitzgerald came to North Texas as a walk-on and spent his first two seasons in obscurity while seeing little action in a run-based offense. In his first year of Dodge's





Dodge, 45, officially assumed control of the North Texas football program on Dec. 26, 2006 - three days after he had coached his Southlake Carroll High School football team to its fourth state championship in five years. As one of the most widely respected high school football coaches in the nation, Dodge led Southlake Carroll to a 79-1 record over his final five years, with the only loss coming by a single point in the 2003 state championship game. Dodge closed his high school career with an amazing 48-game winning streak.

Dodge had already been familiar with the Mean Green, having served as an offensive assistant coach

in 1992 and 1993. During his tenure he helped direct the Mean Green offense to a per-game average of 348 yards and 26 points. He oversaw the progression of quarterback Mitch Maher, who holds numerous Mean Green offensive records, including pass completions, passing yards, and total offense. Maher went on to play for the Canadian Football Leagues' Shreveport Pirates.

Prior to coming to North Texas, Dodge's name had become synonymous with high school football success on the national scale. In addition to winning four class 5A state championships in five years, Southlake Carroll was recognized as national champions by USA Today in 2004 and 2006, and by PrepNation.com in 2005. Dodge amassed a 98-11 record overall at Carroll after taking over in 2000. In 2005, the Dragons set the Texas 5A state record for most points in a single season by tallying 764.

Dodge was named National Coach of the Year by Schutt Sports in 2004 and by USA Today in 2005. In 2006 PrepNation.com named him the Southwest Region coach of the year.



MUNCIE, Ind. (9/3/09) - The North Texas football team left the '08 season in the rear view mirror, downing Ball State 20-10 in the season opener on Thursday night.

The Mean Green (1-0) won just its second season opener since 1997, and its first non-conference road game since 1999, with a gritty performance in front of 16,054 fans at Scheumann Stadium and a national TV audience on ESPNU. The win snapped the Cardinals (0-1) 14-game regular season winning streak that dated back to Nov. of 2007.

Needing to respond to a Ball State fourth-quarter game-tying touch-



down, the Mean Green did just that. On the ensuing drive, Riley Dodge hooked up with Jamaal Jackson for 59 yards to take NT down to the one. Two plays later Dodge found Michael Outlaw in the corner of the end zone to put North Texas up 17-10.

Dodge made the most of his first collegiate action by completing his first 11 passes. The redshirt freshman drove the Mean Green 55 yards before Lance Dunbar punched into the end zone on a three yard dive to open the scoring on their first possession.

He was aided by a potent running game led by Cam Montgomery, who broke lose for 149 yards on 8.8 yards per carry. North Texas piled up 296 rushing yards and racked up 512 total yards.

The defense pitched a first half shutout thanks to third-down stops and a key turnover. Just inside the second quarter Royce Hill jumped in front of a Kelly Page pass on the six yard line and returned it to the house.

Dodge & Co. controlled the edge of the field and the play clock for the entire first half. NT rushed for 160 yards in the half, most coming off left tackle behind captain Victor Gill.

The Mean Green defense held the Cardinals on a lengthy drive midway through the third quarter. Ball State got as far as the 1-yard line before the NT defense forced a short field goal to cut the lead to 10-3.

**September 12, 2009** Fouts Field • Denton, Texas

DENTON, Texas (9/12/09) - Ohio connected on a two-point conversion in the second overtime to give the Bobcats a 31-30 victory against North Texas on Saturday night at Fouts Field.

On a rain-soaked field, the Mean Green and the Bobcats both struggled to hold onto the ball. The two teams combined for seven turnovers. Each team threw an interception and both resulted in touchdowns.

North Texas took an early 10-0 advantage, but Ohio pecked away at the lead. The Bobcats took their first lead, 20-17, in the fourth quar-

ter, and North Texas sent it into overtime with a field goal. The two teams exchanged field goals in the first overtime period, and North Texas took the first lead in the second overtime with a touchdown and an extra point.

After North Texas went ahead, 30-23, on a Cam Montgomery touchdown in the second overtime, Theo Scott connected with Taylor Price twice to secure the win. First, Scott hit Price on fourth down from 15 yards out to come within one point of NT, 30-29.

The Bobcats went for the twopoint conversion from the twoyard line after a roughing the passer penalty against North Texas. Scott connected with Price again for the win.

Montgomery rushed for 88 yards on 22 carries in the game. Riley Dodge completed 12 of 20 passes for 117 yards and one touchdown, while Nathan Tune went 9-for-14 for 69 yards. Tune came in the game at the end of the third quarter after Dodge hurt his shoulder and had to come out of the game.

Jeremy Knott tied the game, 20-20, in regulation with an 18-yard field goal with 46 seconds left in the game. The Mean Green had reached the one-vard line off a nine-yard pass from Tune to Montgomery but was unable to get into the endzone on the next two rushes.

Kenny Jackson gave Ohio its first lead of the game, 20-17, with a 69-yard interception return for a touchdown with 8:44 left in the game. It was the first time that North Texas has trailed this season.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. (9/19/09) - The North Texas football team couldn't keep up with the Crimson Tide, falling to No. 4 Alabama 53-7 on Saturday.

Alabama (3-0) struck early and often, rolling up 523 yards of total offense and scores on nine of their 11 drives. The Crimson Tide defense was as good as advertised, holding the Mean Green (1-2) to 187 total yards and just 61 rushing yards.

Quarterback Nathan Tune led the Mean Green on a smooth scoring drive late in the third. The junior hooked up with Michael Outlaw for 32 yards

on an improvised roll out, and found Lance Dunbar just two plays later in the left flat. Dunbar rocketed 34 yards untouched into the endzone.

The touchdown pass was the first in Tune's career, and capped off a 5-play, 78-yard drive. Tune was efficient against the Crimson Tide, completing 16-of-23 attempts for 126 yards and a score.

The North Texas defense made things interesting out of the gate. On the game's opening play, Sam Owusu-Hemeng's speed rush fired him around the Crimson Tide left tackle and into quarter-

back Greg McElroy, who coughed up the football. Brandon Akpunku scooped it up for the Mean Green, leaving the crowd of 92,012 stunned.

Alabama struck first when McElroy, a former Southlake Carroll quarterback under NT head coach Todd Dodge, led the Crimson Tide on a 13-play, 95-yard drive. The junior capped the drive with a two-yard plunge over the right endzone pylon to put Alabama on top 7-0.


McElroy would lead the Crimson Tide on three more touchdown drives, and 352 yards of offense in the opening half alone.

North Texas receiver Darius Carey was the Mean Green's most effective offensive weapon. The freshman caught five passes for 34 yards. James Hamilton found success running the ball late, grinding out 31 yards on seven touches.



DENTON, Texas (9/26/09) - Middle Tennessee quarterback Dwight Dasher threw two touchdown passes and rushed for two of his own to lead the Blue Raiders to a 37-21 victory against North Texas on Saturday night at Fouts Field.

Middle Tennessee jumped out to a 30-7 halftime lead and held on for the victory despite being outscored, 14-7 in the second half by the Mean Green. North Texas scored two touchdowns in the third quarter but was unable to continue the offensive output in the fourth. NT was hurt by five turnovers in the game.

Mean Green quarterback Riley Dodge posted his first 300-yard passing game. He completed 35 of 54 passes for 313 yards, rushed for a touchdown and threw three interceptions.

The Mean Green offense came alive midway through the third quarter with two touchdowns, cutting the lead to 30-21. Dodge scored the first one on a four-yard scamper, while Dunbar posted his second rushing touchdown of the day with an 18-yard sprint. The Mean Green defense held Middle Tennessee to just one first down in the third quarter.

North Texas started the game on a positive note with Royce Hill returning the opening kickoff 73 yards to the Middle Tennessee 25-yard line. The Mean Green was unable to get a first down, attempted a field goal but had it blocked.


# North Texas 34 Louisiana-Lafayette 38

LAFAYETTE, La. (10/10/09) – North Texas let momentum slip away and couldn't stop Louisiana-Lafayette in the closing minutes, falling to the Ragin' Cajuns, 38-34, on Saturday night.

North Texas (1-4, 0-2 Sun Belt) led by 10 points heading into the fourth quarter thanks to a dominating performance from Lance Dunbar, but the Ragin' Cajuns (3-2, 1-0 Sun Belt) got two fourth-quarter scores, including the game-winning 4-yard touchdown pass with 27 seconds remaining.

Dunbar piled up 187-rushing yards and four touchdowns, which are



the most by a North Texas player since Jamario Thomas had four against Idaho in 2004. Three of those touchdowns and 71 yard came in the second quarter alone.

Leading by three points with a minute on the clock, the North Texas defense forced a fourth-and-five at the NT 33-yard line. Instead of kicking the game-tying field goal, the Cajuns opted to go for the win. Chris Masson's pass sailed over the head of his receiver, but a controversial defensive holding penalty gave ULL a new set of downs. Four plays later, Louisiana-Lafayette punched in for the go-ahead touchdown.

The turnovers put the North Texas defense in a tough spot, but the squad responded well when backed into a corner. ULL twice started drives inside the Mean Green 33-yard line, but the NT defense still only allowed two offensive touchdowns and 58 passing yards in the opening half.


