## THE PARTICULARS

North Texas is back on the road as they face the Troy Trojans. The game will be televised on the Troy ISP Network. George Dunham and Hank Dickenson have the call on the Mean Green Radio Network as the kickoff is set for 2:30 p.m.

### THE PRINCIPALS

The Mean Green is looking to end its five-game losing streak while Troy is riding a four-game winning streak. North Texas has lost its last two games by four-points in each contest. Meanwhile Troy sits tied atop the Sun Belt Conference standings with a 3-0 record in league play after a 42-33 win on the road at Florida International. Three of the five North Texas losses have been by four points or less this season. Troy is a perfect 2-0 at home this season.

## THE SERIES

Troy leads the overall series with North Texas 5-1 and has won four straight meetings. The two teams first met in 2001 before the Trojans were members of the Sun Belt Conference. The lone North Texas win came in 2003, a 21-0 shutout of the Troy in Denton. On the road North Texas is 0-3 at Troy. Last year the Trojans came to Denton and won 45-17.

## **NEXT GAME**

North Texas returns home for a Halloween battle against Western Kentucky while the Trojans continue their homestand hosting ULM.

## A CLOSER LOOK AT TROY TROJANS

**Head Coach Larry Blakeney** – The longtime head coach of the Trojans, Blakeney is in his 19th season with Troy. Since his first season in 1991, Blakeney has guided Troy through the ranks of Division II, I-AA, and now into the FBS. He has led the Trojans to eight win seasons in three straight years and at least a share of the conference title in three straight seasons as well. He is just two wins shy of 150 for his career and has racked up a winning percentage of over 66 as the head coach at Troy.

The Matchup – North Texas hits the second half of the season riding a five-game losing streak while Troy has won four straight games. The Mean Green offense has been bolstered by the emergence of Lance Dunbar who has rushed for 425 yards in the last two games. Dunbar is 17th in the country in rushing and third in the nation in scoring as he has seven touchdowns in the last two games. The special teams unit for North Texas has been better on kickoffs as Royce Hill is 17th in the nation, averaging just over 28 yards a return. The Mean Green offensive line continues to protect the quarterback as they are third in the nation in allowing the fewest sacks on the season. Troy has been powered by quarterback Levi Brown who has powered the Trojans to the 15th best passing offense in the nation and the tops in the conference. Troy has the top offense in the league as well, putting up 420 yards a game. During their four-game winning streak, Troy has averaged 32.5 points a game.

### Media Information Post-Game Interviews

The North Texas locker room is closed to all members of the media. Head coach Todd Dodge and requested players will be available for interviews following a brief cooling off period. Postgame interviews at Fouts Field will be held in the media interview room below the east stands.

### **Credentials For Media**

Those wishing to cover North Texas must contact Eric Capper or Steven Bartolotta for credentials for home and away games. Seating is very limited at Fouts Field and requests for North Texas home games need to be made at least one week prior to the contest.

### **Media Availability for Players**

All player interviews will be conduted following the teams practice on Tuesday afternoon at the Athetic Center. Requsts for players should be made in advance through the sports information office. No interviews will be granted on Monday or Wednesday post practice. Special exemptions may be granted to those media wishing to interview a specific student-athlete before parctice at the discretion of the media relations office.

### **Sun Belt Teleconference**

The Sun Belt Conference will conduct a weekly teleconference with each of the eight head coaches each Monday throughout the season. Coach Dodge will be on the call from 11:08-11:14 a.m. each week.

### Post-Practice

Dodge will be available to media immediately following Tuesday's practice at the Darrell Dickey Practice Facility. Requests should be made in advance of practice to the media relations office.

### Out of Town Media

Dodge and his assistant coaches are also available by request to out-of-town media Monday through Wednesday from 11 a.m.-12 noon. Contact the media relations office to arrange these requests.

### Practice Coverage

Media has limited access to North Texas football practice. Viewing is available outside the fence of the practice facility. Video and still photography can be shot during the first 30 minutes of practice. Players and coaches are available for interviews following practice on Tuesday. All requests for interviews must be made in advance through the athletic media relations office.

### **Quick Hitters on This Week's Matchup**

North Texas will face the top offense in the Sun Belt Conference this week as Troy enters the game averaging 420.2 yards per game... North Texas is averaging a Sun Belt-best 220.7 yards rushing in conference games, while the Troy defense leads the league by allowing just 72.3 yards on the ground against Sun Belt opponents... Troy leads the Sun Belt in passing offense with an average of 282.8 yards per game, while North Texas leads the league in pass defense efficiency... The Mean Green leads the conference in sacks allowed with just three. The Troy defense is second in the league in sacks with 14... Troy is last in the Sun Belt in penalties committed with an average of 83.7 penalty yards per game.

### **Gaining Yards in Chunks**

The North Texas offense averaged a season-high 8.6 yards per play in the loss to Florida Atlantic last week. That average included an average of 7.5 yards per rush and 10.2 yards per pass. The Mean Green had averaged just 5.5 yards per play in the four games leading up to the FAU game.

### **Outgaining Opponents**

Despite a 1-5 record after six games, North Texas has outgained four of its six opponents in total offense. If you throw out the lopsided 523-187 advantage that No. 1 Alabama had against the Mean Green, the total offense average per game for North Texas is 448.6 while its opponents are averaging 364.0. Since Dodge took over at North Texas in 2007, North Texas is 2-11 when outgaining its opponent in total offense. Last season North Texas lost the only two games when it outgained its opponents (Florida International and Louisiana-Monroe).

### **Holding Leads**

In three of its five losses this year, North Texas has been unable to protect a double-digit lead. The Mean Green was up 17-6 over Ohio in the third quarter before the Bobcats scored two unanswered touchdowns to take a 20-17 fourth-quarter lead in a game Ohio eventually won in double overtime. Against Louisiana-Lafayette, North Texas led 34-24 early in the fourth quarter but was outscored 14-0 in the last 9:30 of the game to lose 38-34. Last week against Florida Atlantic, North Texas held its largest lead of the season when it was up 13-0, but the Mean Green allowed 30 second-quarter points and had to battle back in the second half. North Texas eventually took a 40-37 lead in the fourth quarter, but couldn't stop the Owls late and lost 44-40.

### **Damaging Turnovers**

Turnovers have made a huge difference in the end result of three games for North Texas this season. In losses to Ohio, Louisiana-Lafayette and Florida Atlantic the Mean Green combined to commit 10 turnovers, while only gaining four. Those three opponents scored on seven of the 10 possessions that resulted from a North Texas turnover. Also in those two games, North Texas threw an interception that was returned for a touchdown – one by Nathan Tune against Ohio and one by Riley Dodge against Louisiana-Lafayette. Below is a look at the opponent points off turnovers in those three games:

### **More Costly Mistakes**

In addition to turnovers by the offense, North Texas has made mistakes on special teams and defense that have been costly to the team's success. Against Louisiana-Lafayette, North Texas had a blocked punt returned for a touchdown and had three Ragin' Cajun fourth-down conversion attempts kept alive by penalties – all three of which resulted in touchdowns. In an overtime loss to Ohio the Mean Green defense allowed a touchdown on 4th-and-Goal from the 15-yard line and also roughed the passer to set up the Bobcats winning two-point conversion from the 1-yard line. In a comeback effort against Middle Tennessee, North Texas had a field goal attempt blocked in the first quarter and then trailed by nine points and needed a fourth quarter stop when it committed an unsportsmanlike penalty that kept a drive alive and allowed Middle Tennessee to score on the next play to seal the victory. Against Florida Atlantic, North Texas missed two PAT attempts and kicked three kickoffs out-of-bounds.

### No Sack Attack

The North Texas offensive line has done a tremendous job protecting the quarterback, allowing just three sacks in six games. The Mean Green is third in the nation with an average just .5 sacks allowed per game. When you look at the ratio of sacks per pass attempt, North Texas has allowed just three sacks in 207 pass attempts for an average of .0144 sacks per pass attempt. Only Iowa State (three sacks in 213 pass attempts) has a better ratio of sacks allowed per pass attempt than North Texas at .0140.

### **Red Zone Defense**

The North Texas defense has not stopped an opponent from scoring inside the red zone since the season opener at Ball State. The last five Mean Green opponents are a perfect 21-of-21 on scoring opportunities inside the North Texas 20-yard line. Florida Atlantic was 6-for-6 inside the North Texas red zone, including five touchdowns and one field goal. The 92 percent success rate in the red zone allowed by the Mean Green defense ranks 107th nationally.

### Fourth Down Unfriendly

Converting fourth downs has been a bugaboo for the North Texas offense this year. The Mean Green has only successfully converted 1-of-7 fourth down attempts and was 0-for-2 last week against Florida Atlantic. The one successful conversion came on a 15-yard run by Lance Dunbar on 4th-and-1 against Louisiana-Lafayette on a drive that was capped by a touchdown. Of the other six fourth down conversion attempts, three have been unsuccessful rushing plays and three have been unsuccessful passing plays. On five of the seven fourth down plays, the North Texas offense had no gain or was thrown for a loss and on the other unsuccessful attempt it gained one yard.

### **Big Plays Coming from Youngsters**

In six games, North Texas has 24 plays that have covered 25 yards or more, including six rushing plays, eight passing plays, nine kick returns and one interception return. Of those 24 plays, 17 have come from freshmen and sophomores and only one has come from a senior (running back Cam Montgomery). Sophomore defensive back Royce Hill leads the way with eight plays of more than 20 yards, including seven kick returns and one interception return. Sophomore running back Lance Dunbar has seven – five rushing and two receiving.

### **Balanced Attack**

Mean Green head coach Todd Dodge has always said that his offense has a better chance at being successful if it is balanced between rushing and passing production. After six games, North Texas has 1,134 yards rushing and 1,296 yards passing which is a 47 to 53 percent balance. Last season, rushing accounted for 35 percent of the total offense while passing accounted for 65 percent.

### **Third Down Conversions**

The last two games, North Texas has had its best third down conversion success of the season. Two weeks ago against Louisiana-Lafayette, the Mean Green had its best third down conversion percentage of the year at 50 percent (8-of-16). The Mean Green followed that performance up with an even better 60 percent (6-of-10) versus Florida Atlantic. In the three games prior to playing Louisiana-Lafayette, North Texas had converted just 24 percent of its third down attempts (10-of-41).

### A New Home For The Mean Green

North Texas has called Fouts Field home since 1952, but those days are nearing an end. In



2011 the Mean Green will move into a new stadium located on-campus. Construction is set to begin on the stadium in January of 2010 and the stadium will have a capacity of 30,000 with the ability for future expansion to raise the total to 50,000. North Texas partnered with HKS to build the stadium - the same company that designed the American

Airlines Center in Dallas and the new Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas.

### **Big Guys With Experience**

While the Mean Green battled inexperience and youth in 2008, the 2009 North Texas offensive line is about as battled tested as you could want. The starting five have combined for a total of 99 career starts. The good thing about the group of Santiago (28 career starts), Bailey (19 career starts), Johnson (18 career starts), Drake (18 career starts), and Gill (16 career starts) is that only one is a senior (Bailey). In fact of the 10 offensive linemen in the two deep, only two are seniors, while four are juniors, three are sophomores and there is one freshman.

### A Good Distributor

One of the areas that Coach Todd Dodge has emphasized this year is getting the ball in the hands of as many different people as possible. The last two seasons, wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald led the nation in receptions with over 110 each year. This year Dodge would like those receptions to be divided between two or even three receivers. So far, the plan is working, with three different wide receivers having over 20 catches. Last season after six games, only two receivers had more than 20 catches. In all, 13 different receivers have made at least one catch for the Mean Green this season.

### Going For A Three-Peat

Todd Dodge has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. The Mean Green has never had three straight seasons of 4,000 or more yards of total offense before. North Texas is also going after its second 3,000-yard passing season in the last three years which has never happened before in school history.

### **Coaches Picks**

Troy was chosen as the 2009 Preseason favorite to win the Sun Belt Conference as voted on by the leagues head coaches. The Trojans received five of the nine first-place votes. The Trojans were followed by Arkansas State, Florida Atlantic, Middle Tennessee, Florida International, Louisiana-Lafayette, ULM, North Texas, and Western Kentucky. Florida Atlantic, Florida International, Louisiana-Lafayette, and ULM picked up the remaining first-place votes.

### Coaches Up/Coaches Down

North Texas will put three assistant coaches in the press box during games and will have six assistants along with head coach Todd Dodge on the sideline. In the press box will be offensive coordinator Todd Ford, along with defensive coordinator Gary DeLoach. Cornerbacks coach Carlton Buckels and safeties coach Chuck Peterson will join DeLoach in the press box. Linebackers coach David Rausch and defensive line coach Mike Nelson will be on the sidelines. Wide Receiver coach Clayton George and offensive line coach Spencer Leftwich will be on the sidelines along with special teams/running backs coach Shelton Gandy. Graduate assistant coaches Brian Morgan and Kevin Barbay will also be in the press box.

### Well Represented in the NFL

North Texas has had more players drafted to play professional football than any other team in the Sun Belt Conference. Since the first NFL draft in 1936, North Texas has had 77 players drafted, including seven players picked in the first round. Arkansas State is second among Sun Belt Schools which have had players drafted with 46. Joe Greene is the highest drafted player ever from North Texas when he was selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers with the fourth overall pick in 1969.

### TV Time

North Texas is scheduled to play on television eight times in 2009. The Mean Green will be shown in the Dallas/Fort Worth market on KTXA 21 for the Ohio and Army games as part of two-game deal with the station. The season opener at Ball State was played before a national audience on ESPNU and the game at Alabama was shown across the SEC Regional Network. The game at Louisiana-Lafayette and two home games with Florida Atlantic and Western Kentucky are being shown as part of the Sun Belt Conference package. The game at Troy will be broadcast by the Troy ISP Network. KTXA 21 will also air the North Texas games that are being broadcast as part of the Sun Belt package.

### **Charr-ging Them Up**

One of the new additions to North Texas this offseason was that of a strength and conditioning coach for football. Aaron Ausmus started the program in January before leaving to take the same position at Tennessee. Todd Dodge then turned to Charr Gahagan to replace Ausmus. Gahagan was at the University of Washingon and spent eight seasons at USC before that. He was a three-time national champion in powerlifting while at Louisiana Tech. The results have been noticable. Defensive lineman Eddrick Gilmore put on 29 pounds in the offseason, going from 240 to 269 in the new program. Offensive lineman Nate Jenkins went from 379 down to 349 pounds this season.

### **Did You Know**

North Texas has its share of players on the roster that have great genes of their own but some have even better bloodlines. Wide receiver Alex Lott is the son of former Oklahoma All Big 8 quarterback Thomas Lott. His older brother just finished up his college career at Rice. Freshman wide receiver Desmond Brigham is the nephew of current Arizona Cardinals wide receiver Jamaica Rector. And if that wasn't enough freshman defensive back Jeremy Phillips is the younger brother of Jason Phillips, last season's Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year and a former linebacker at TCU.

### **Following In Footsteps**

North Texas head coach Todd Dodge is one of only 56 known major college head coaches who have had the rare opportunity to coach his son in college. There are only three other current sets of father-and-son duos on Football Bowl Subdivision teams, Dan and Cody Hawkins at Colorado, Ricky and Brad Bustle at Louisiana-Lafayette and Steve and Scott Spurrier at South Carolina. Todd and Riley make only the 22nd father-and-son, quarter back-and-coach tandem in FBS history.

### Lack of Senioritis

The North Texas roster has only 12 seniors for the 2009 season. Only six teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision have fewer seniors on their roster than North Texas, and only three of those teams (Boise State, Miami (OH), and Idaho) are non-BCS teams.

### **Record Enrollment**

The University of North Texas marked its ninth consecutive year of record-breaking student population when the fall 2009 enrollment was announced at 36,206. This year's numbers reflect the largest single-year increase since 2002 and continue to secure North Texas as the fourth-largest university in the state of Texas.

### One Overtime Not Enough

North Texas has played in just two overtime games since the NCAA introduced the format in 1996. The Mean Green is 1-1 in its two overtime games, defeating Florida International 25-22 in seven overtimes in 2006 and losing to Ohio 31-30 in two overtimes this year. The Mean Green is the only FBS team that has never had a game decided in the first overtime period.

## MEAN GREEN OFFENSIVE INDIVIDUAL NOTES

### **Getting it Dun**

Sophomore running back Lance Dunbar is setting the bar higher each week. Coming in off the bench against Middle Tennessee in week four Dunbar rushed for a career-high 101 yards. In his first collegiate start against Louisiana-Lafayette the following week, he shattered that mark with 187 yards and tied a North Texas record with four rushing touchdowns. Continuing the trend, Dunbar set a new career mark for the third week in a row last week against Florida Atlantic, rushing for 238 yards and three more scores. Dunbar has 10 of the team's 14 rushing touchdowns and is averaging 175.3 yards per game against Sun Belt opponents.

### **Dodging Bullets**

Redshirt freshman Riley Dodge has started exactly five games as a college quarterback. While he has had his struggles this season, his numbers still stack up very well with other former Mean Green freshman quarterbacks. In five games, Dodge has a completion percentage of 64.5 and a pass efficiency rating of 115.5. Here is a look at how some other Mean Green quarterbacks did in their freshman year:

### Tuned Up

Backup quarterback Nathan Tune has been called into action three times this year when starter Riley Dodge has left with an injury. Tune came in during the second half of the Ohio game and led a comeback that took the game into overtime. He started and played the entire game against No.1-ranked Alabama, completing 16-of-23 passes with one touchdown and no interceptions. Playing the entire second half against Florida Atlantic, Tune had his best game, completing 13-of-17 passes for 129 yards and a touchdown with no interceptions for a pass efficiency rating of 159.6.

### Cam Closing In

Senior running back Cam Montgomery is closing in on the cracking the top 10 career rushing leaders list at North Texas. Montgomery has not played the last two weeks while nursing a hamstring injury and still has 244 yards for the season and 1,172 yards for his career. Montgomery needs 692 to get on the exclusive top 10 rushing list, which is led by Patrick Cobbs with 4,050. If he makes the list, Montgomery will be knocking a legend from the top 10 list. Ranking 10th all-time in rushing yards is Abner Haynes with 1,864 yards from 1957-59.

### **Transfer Targets**

Junior college transfer wide receivers Jamaal Jackson and Michael Outlaw have made an immediate impact on the North Texas offense. Both are in the starting lineup and they rank first and second on the team in receiving yards. Jackson has a team-high 37 catches for 368 yards while Outlaw has 21 catches for 224 yards. Outlaw is averaging 10.7 yards per catch, while Jackson is close behind at 9.9.

### Money on the Line

Despite several interchanging parts, the North Texas offensive line has held up admirably this season. In all, eight different offensive linemen have played in the six games, and the unit ranks third in the nation in sacks allowed with just three.

### **Learning Fast**

True freshman wide receiver Darius Carey has steadily improved each week and is now a fixture in the starting lineup and a featured target of Mean Green quarterbacks. Carey is second on the team in receptions (23) and third in receiving yards (213). He is also working his way into the return game, returning a punt 62 yards for a touchdown that was called back against Middle Tennessee.

### **Linebackers Leading Way**

Senior Tobe Nwigwe and junior Craig Robertson have been the defensive leaders as starting linebackers for North Texas this season. Nwigwe leads the team with 62 tackles and Robertson is close behind with 54. Nwigwe leads the Sun Belt Conference in tackles per game with an average of 10.3 while Robertson ranks seventh (9.0). Robertson posted a career-high in tackles with 12 against Ball State in the season-opener and Nwigwe had a career-best the following week against Ohio with 15. Nwigwe also is tied for the lead on the team in tackles for loss with six. The two also led the team last season in tackles with Nwigwe posting 111 and Robertson close behind with 94.

### Coming of Age

North Texas still has a very young defensive secondary, with all four starters either in their first or second year with the Mean Green. Sophomores Royce Hill and DaWaylon Cook are starters at cornerback and safety after playing extensively as true freshmen last season. Adryan Adams transferred to North Texas last year, but is in his first year as a full-time starter at cornerback. Fellow transfer Ira Smith is in his first year at North Texas and is the other starter at safety. The foursome has held up admirably in six games - they lead the Sun Belt Conference and rank 44th nationally in pass defense efficiency with a rating of 118.3, which includes just 1,271 yards through the air.

### **Cook Coming On**

Sophomore safety DaWaylon Cook is feeling comfortable in his second year and his new position. As a true freshman last year, Cook was a backup cornerback and totaled 10 tackles in 11 games. After a year of experience and an offseason move to safety, Cook has become a leader in the secondary. After one tackle in the season opener, Cook has averaged 8.2 tackles in the last four games, including a career-best 11 against Alabama. He is third on the team with 42 tackles and 32 of those are solo stops.

### Weighty Up Front

One of the biggest areas, literally, that North Texas addressed in the offseason was the defensive line. The Mean Green brought in six new players to help the defensive line and added a lot of size. Transfers Kelvin Jackson and Shavod Atkinson are the regular starters at defensive tackle, weighing in at 309 and 307 pounds respectively. John Weber is also a transfer who can play both tackle and end and weighs 288 pounds. True freshman defensive tackle Kyle White, who tips the scales at 309 pounds, saw his first action against Alabama. Add 301-pound redshirt freshman Tevinn Cantly to give you the fourth interior defensive lineman that are all playing this year. Last year North Texas didn't play any defensive lineman that weighed 300 pounds or more.

### A.K. More Than O.K.

Sophomore Brandon Akpunku (whose nickname is A.K.) is feeling more and more comfortable at his new defensive end position. Akpunku spent his true freshman year as a backup linebacker who saw limited action on special teams, but has earned a spot as a starter at defensive end this year. He is tied for the team lead and ranks sixth in the Sun Belt in sacks with three and tackles for loss with six. The only problem is all of his sacks and tackles for loss have come in home games for North Texas, he is still looking for his first stop behind the line on the road.

## **Good Will Punting**

True freshman punter Will Atterberry has been a pleasant surprise for North Texas this season. Through six games, Atterberry is second Sun Belt Conference with 14 punts (of his 30 attempts) downed inside the opponent 20-yard line. He is averaging 41.9 yards per attempt, which ranks fourth in the Sun Belt. He also has six punts of 50 yards or more, which ranks second in the league.

### **Return Drought Continues**

It has been 127 games and counting since North Texas has returned a kickoff for a touchdown. Broderick McGrew was the last Mean Green player to do so when he took a kickoff and returned it 100 yards in a 28-27 loss to Utah State on Nov. 14, 1998. North Texas' current active streak ranks as the seventh-longest in the nation - led by Air Force, which hasn't brought a kick back for a score in 281 games.

## HEAD COACH TODD DODGE

Todd Dodge understands. The North Texas head football coach understands that he was


hired to turn around a program that had slumped. He understands that, as he enters his third year, the pace of improvement has not come at the rate that many Mean Green fans had hoped for. But he has not wavered from his plan and the only pressure to hasten the timeline for progress comes from within his own uncompromising commitment to success. Dodge understands his role in the development of the North Texas football program and he is fully invested.

In two years at the helm, Dodge has tried to establish a foundation that would lead to victory. The baseline of success on the field has been set and now Dodge believes he has the pieces in place to show that his work has not been futile. He has quietly assembled a team of coaches and players that he believes can thrive in his system. It has been a two-year process of molding young men and tweaking a staff that will serve as the groundwork for developing his program.



On the field, Dodge's influence has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. Dodge is now at least partially responsible for three of North Texas' top 10 total offensive performances, with 4,901 as a head coach in 2007 and 4,031 as an assistant coach in 1993 added to last year's performance.

One of the best success stories during the Dodge era will always be of wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald. Fitzgerald came to North Texas as a walk-on and spent his first two seasons in obscurity while seeing little action in a run-based offense. In his first year of Dodge's

Dodge, 45, officially assumed control of the North Texas football program on Dec. 26, 2006 - three days after he had coached his Southlake Carroll High School football team to its fourth state championship in five years. As one of the most widely respected high school football coaches in the nation, Dodge led Southlake Carroll to a 79-1 record over his final five years, with the only loss coming by a single point in the 2003 state championship game. Dodge closed his high school career with an amazing 48-game winning streak.

Dodge had already been familiar with the Mean Green, having served as an offensive assistant coach

in 1992 and 1993. During his tenure he helped direct the Mean Green offense to a per-game average of 348 yards and 26 points. He oversaw the progression of quarterback Mitch Maher, who holds numerous Mean Green offensive records, including pass completions, passing yards, and total offense. Maher went on to play for the Canadian Football Leagues' Shreveport Pirates.

Prior to coming to North Texas, Dodge's name had become synonymous with high school football success on the national scale. In addition to winning four class 5A state championships in five years, Southlake Carroll was recognized as national champions by USA Today in 2004 and 2006, and by PrepNation.com in 2005. Dodge amassed a 98-11 record overall at Carroll after taking over in 2000. In 2005, the Dragons set the Texas 5A state record for most points in a single season by tallying 764.

Dodge was named National Coach of the Year by Schutt Sports in 2004 and by USA Today in 2005. In 2006 PrepNation.com named him the Southwest Region coach of the year.



## September 3, 2009 Scheumann Stadium • Muncie, Indiana

MUNCIE, Ind. (9/3/09) - The North Texas football team left the '08 season in the rear view mirror, downing Ball State 20-10 in the season opener on Thursday night.

The Mean Green (1-0) won just its second season opener since 1997, and its first non-conference road game since 1999, with a gritty performance in front of 16,054 fans at Scheumann Stadium and a national TV audience on ESPNU. The win snapped the Cardinals (0-1) 14-game regular season winning streak that dated back to Nov. of 2007.

Needing to respond to a Ball State fourth-quarter game-tying touch-



down, the Mean Green did just that. On the ensuing drive, Riley Dodge hooked up with Jamaal Jackson for 59 yards to take NT down to the one. Two plays later Dodge found Michael Outlaw in the corner of the end zone to put North Texas up 17-10.

Dodge made the most of his first collegiate action by completing his first 11 passes. The redshirt freshman drove the Mean Green 55 yards before Lance Dunbar punched into the end zone on a three yard dive to open the scoring on their first possession.

He was aided by a potent running game led by Cam Montgomery, who broke lose for 149 yards on 8.8 yards per carry. North Texas piled up 296 rushing yards and racked up 512 total yards.

The defense pitched a first half shutout thanks to third-down stops and a key turnover. Just inside the second quarter Royce Hill jumped in front of a Kelly Page pass on the six yard line and returned it to the house.

Dodge & Co. controlled the edge of the field and the play clock for the entire first half. NT rushed for 160 yards in the half, most coming off left tackle behind captain Victor Gill.

The Mean Green defense held the Cardinals on a lengthy drive midway through the third quarter. Ball State got as far as the 1-yard line before the NT defense forced a short field goal to cut the lead to 10-3.

## **September 12, 2009** Fouts Field • Denton, Texas

DENTON, Texas (9/12/09) - Ohio connected on a two-point conversion in the second overtime to give the Bobcats a 31-30 victory against North Texas on Saturday night at Fouts Field.

On a rain-soaked field, the Mean Green and the Bobcats both struggled to hold onto the ball. The two teams combined for seven turnovers. Each team threw an interception and both resulted in touchdowns.

North Texas took an early 10-0 advantage, but Ohio pecked away at the lead. The Bobcats took their first lead, 20-17, in the fourth quar-

ter, and North Texas sent it into overtime with a field goal. The two teams exchanged field goals in the first overtime period, and North Texas took the first lead in the second overtime with a touchdown and an extra point.


After North Texas went ahead, 30-23, on a Cam Montgomery touchdown in the second overtime, Theo Scott connected with Taylor Price twice to secure the win. First, Scott hit Price on fourth down from 15 yards out to come within one point of NT, 30-29.

The Bobcats went for the twopoint conversion from the twoyard line after a roughing the passer penalty against North Texas. Scott connected with Price again for the win.

Montgomery rushed for 88 yards on 22 carries in the game. Riley Dodge completed 12 of 20 passes for 117 yards and one touchdown, while Nathan Tune went 9-for-14 for 69 yards. Tune came in the game at the end of the third quarter after Dodge hurt his shoulder and had to come out of the game.

Jeremy Knott tied the game, 20-20, in regulation with an 18-yard field goal with 46 seconds left in the game. The Mean Green had reached the one-vard line off a nine-yard pass from Tune to Montgomery but was unable to get into the endzone on the next two rushes.

Kenny Jackson gave Ohio its first lead of the game, 20-17, with a 69-yard interception return for a touchdown with 8:44 left in the game. It was the first time that North Texas has trailed this season.

### **September 19, 2009** Bryant-Denny Stadium • Tuscaloosa, Alabama

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. (9/19/09) - The North Texas football team couldn't keep up with the Crimson Tide, falling to No. 4 Alabama 53-7 on Saturday.

Alabama (3-0) struck early and often, rolling up 523 yards of total offense and scores on nine of their 11 drives. The Crimson Tide defense was as good as advertised, holding the Mean Green (1-2) to 187 total yards and just 61 rushing yards.

Quarterback Nathan Tune led the Mean Green on a smooth scoring drive late in the third. The junior hooked up with Michael Outlaw for 32 yards

on an improvised roll out, and found Lance Dunbar just two plays later in the left flat. Dunbar rocketed 34 vards untouched into the endzone.

The touchdown pass was the first in Tune's career, and capped off a 5-play, 78-yard drive. Tune was efficient against the Crimson Tide, completing 16-of-23 attempts for 126 yards and a score.

The North Texas defense made things interesting out of the gate. On the game's opening play, Sam Owusu-Hemeng's speed rush fired him around the Crimson Tide left tackle and into quarter-

back Greg McElroy, who coughed up the football. Brandon Akpunku scooped it up for the Mean Green, leaving the crowd of 92,012 stunned.

Alabama struck first when McElroy, a former Southlake Carroll quarterback under NT head coach Todd Dodge, led the Crimson Tide on a 13-play, 95-yard drive. The junior capped the drive with a two-yard plunge over the right endzone pylon to put Alabama on top 7-0.


McElroy would lead the Crimson Tide on three more touchdown drives, and 352 yards of offense in the opening half alone.

North Texas receiver Darius Carev was the Mean Green's most effective offensive weapon. The freshman caught five passes for 34 vards. James Hamilton found success running the ball late, grinding out 31 yards on seven touches.



DENTON, Texas (9/26/09) - Middle Tennessee quarterback Dwight Dasher threw two touchdown passes and rushed for two of his own to lead the Blue Raiders to a 37-21 victory against North Texas on Saturday night at Fouts Field.

Middle Tennessee jumped out to a 30-7 halftime lead and held on for the victory despite being outscored, 14-7 in the second half by the Mean Green. North Texas scored two touchdowns in the third quarter but was unable to continue the offensive output in the fourth. NT was hurt by five turnovers in the game.

Dodge scored the first one on a four-yard scamper, while Dunbar posted his second rushing touchdown of the day with an 18-yard sprint. The Mean Green defense held Middle Tennessee to just one first down in the third quarter.

North Texas started the game on a positive note with Royce Hill returning the opening kickoff 73 yards to the Middle Tennessee 25-vard line. The Mean Green was unable to get a first down, attempted a field goal but had it blocked.



The Mean Green scored three straight times to regain the lead, 40-37, in the fourth quarter for the first time since the first quarter. Carey caught his first touchdown reception of the game in the Mean Green comeback and Dunbar recorded his second and third touchdown runs.


