### THE PARTICULARS

North Texas begins a two-game homestand with a visit from Western Kentucky. The Halloween affair will be televised on the Sun Belt Network along with ESPN Gameplan and ESPN360.com. George Dunham and Hank Dickenson have the call on the Mean Green Radio Network as kickoff is slated for 3:15 p.m.

### THE PRINCIPALS

North Texas and Western Kentucky enter the game on losing streaks as the Mean Green has dropped six straight while the Hilltoppers are still in search of their first win of the season at 0-7. North Texas is coming off a road loss to Troy while Western Kentucky lost on the road Middle Tennessee.

## THE SERIES

While the two teams have only met twice before, the games have come down to the last minute. The Mean Green has won both meetings. The first matchup in 2007 was a one-point North Texas win, 27-26 that saw the Mean Green rally from a 13-point halftime deficit. Last season linebacker Tobe Nwigwe intercepted a pass on the final play of the game and returned it 97 yards for a touchdown to seal a 51-40 North Texas victory.

### **NEXT GAME**

North Texas stays at home as they face off against ULM while Western Kentucky returns home to battle Troy.

### A Closer Look at Western Kentucky

**Head Coach David Elson** – In his 14th season with the program overall, Elson is in his seventh season as the head coach. Elson guided the WKU program through the transition phase and into the FBS full-time starting this season. Elson took over the program in March of 2003 and had guided the Hilltoppers to a winning season in five of his six seasons.

The Matchup – The game features two teams looking to breakout of slumps on the defensive side of the ball. North Texas one of the hottest running backs in the league in Lance Dunbar as he is 18th in the nation at 104.8 yards a game. Dunbar continues to rank third in the country in scoring after three more touchdowns at Troy. The North Texas rushing offense is 33rd in the country while the Western Kentucky rushing defense is 119th overall. The Hilltoppers defense overall ranks last in the country while the offense is only 113th. The North Texas defense has fallen to 111 in total defense. Success for the Hilltoppers this season has come on the ground as they rank 54 in the nation in rushing offense. Western Kentucky has allowed at least 28 points in all seven games this season. The Mean Green has scored over 20 points in five of its seven games this season. Receiver Michael Outlaw is coming off his most productive game with 112 yards against Troy. The North Texas kickoff return game continues to lead the Sun Belt Conference in returns at just over 23 yards a return.

#### Media Information Post-Game Interviews

The North Texas locker room is closed to all members of the media. Head coach Todd Dodge and requested players will be available for interviews following a brief cooling off period. Postgame interviews at Fouts Field will be held in the media interview room below the east stands.

#### **Credentials For Media**

Those wishing to cover North Texas must contact Eric Capper or Steven Bartolotta for credentials for home and away games. Seating is very limited at Fouts Field and requests for North Texas home games need to be made at least one week prior to the contest.

#### **Media Availability for Players**

All player interviews will be conduted following the teams practice on Tuesday afternoon at the Athetic Center. Requsts for players should be made in advance through the sports information office. No interviews will be granted on Monday or Wednesday post practice. Special exemptions may be granted to those media wishing to interview a specific student-athlete before parctice at the discretion of the media relations office.

#### **Sun Belt Teleconference**

The Sun Belt Conference will conduct a weekly teleconference with each of the eight head coaches each Monday throughout the season. Coach Dodge will be on the call from 11:08-11:14 a.m. each week.

#### Post-Practice

Dodge will be available to media immediately following Tuesday's practice at the Darrell Dickey Practice Facility. Requests should be made in advance of practice to the media relations office.

#### Out of Town Media

Dodge and his assistant coaches are also available by request to out-of-town media Monday through Wednesday from 11 a.m.-12 noon. Contact the media relations office to arrange these requests.

#### Practice Coverage

Media has limited access to North Texas football practice. Viewing is available outside the fence of the practice facility. Video and still photography can be shot during the first 30 minutes of practice. Players and coaches are available for interviews following practice on Tuesday. All requests for interviews must be made in advance through the athletic media relations office.

#### **Quick Hitters on This Week's Matchup**

North Texas will be facing a Western Kentucky team that ranks last in the Sun Belt Conference and 112th in the nation in scoring offense, averaging 16.4 points per game. It will be a good test for a Mean Green defense that has allowed 42.1 points in its six losses... North Texas ranks second in the league and 33rd in the nation in rushing offense with an average of 180.3 yards per game while the Western Kentucky defense is last in the Sun Belt and 119th nationally in rushing defense, allowing an average of 266.3 yards per game... Western Kentucky ranks last in the nation in total defense allowing 509.1 yards per game. Last year North Texas went into the game with Western Kentucky ranked 118th in total defense, allowing 487.2 yards per game.

#### Sophomores on Display

This week's game will feature a pair of sophomore running backs who are having outstanding years. Western Kentucky's Bobby Rainey and North Texas' Lance Dunbar rank first and second respectively in all-purpose yards in the Sun Belt Conference. Rainey is averaging 146.7 yards per game which includes 446 rushing yards and 550 kick return yards. Dunbar is close behind with an average of 142.3 yards per game, including 734 rushing and 205 receiving. Dunbar leads the league in scoring and ranks second in rushing. Rainey is second in kick return average and sixth in rushing.

#### **Prepare for Second Quarter Fireworks**

North Texas and Western Kentucky have both struggled defensively in the second quarter this season. Both teams have allowed more points in the second quarter than any other quarter, with the Hilltoppers giving up 104 and the Mean Green giving up 103. Western Kentucky has also scored more points in the second quarter than any other quarter with 45 while North Texas' best offensive quarter has been the third with 58 points. The last two games, North Texas has been outscored 47-13 in the second quarter, giving up 30 to Florida Atlantic and 17 to Troy.

#### **Long Scoring Plays**

In the last three weeks, North Texas has been able to break some long scoring plays, including a 69-yard touchdown run and a 60-yard touchdown pass last week against Troy. There has been a total of six touchdown plays of longer than 30 yards and four of longer than 50 yards this year, and the five longest have come in the last three games. Sophomore running back Lance Dunbar is responsible for four of the six long touchdown plays while junior wide receiver Jamaal Jackson is responsible for the other two. In comparison, in all 12 games last year, North Texas had only five touchdown plays of longer than 30 yards and only one that carried more than 50 yards.

#### **Turnover Tales**

Western Kentucky and North Texas both rank dead last in the Sun Belt Conference in turnover margin with both teams entering the game with a -9 margin. Western Kentucky has committed 19 turnovers and gained 10 while North Texas has lost 18 and gained nine. North Texas actually had a +1 turnover margin last week against Troy after having committed 11 and gaining just one in the previous three games.

#### Giving Up Big Plays

The North Texas defense was unable to stop the big play last week against Troy. Coming into the Troy game, the Mean Green defense had allowed a total of 26 plays of 20 yards or more for an average of 4.3 per game. Against the Trojans the North Texas defense surrendered 11 plays of 20 yards or more, nine pass plays and two running plays. The most big plays North Texas had given up in a game this season prior to Troy was seven against No. 2 Alabama.

#### **Quick Scoring Drives**

Going hand-in-hand with big plays, the North Texas defense has allowed a lot of very quick touchdown drives this season. Of the 28 touchdown drives against the North Texas defense, 11 have come in two minutes or less of game clock. The average touchdown drive by North Texas opponents this year has taken exactly 2:46 of game clock. Last week, Troy had six touchdown drives that averaged 2:25 in length, including three that were under two minutes.

#### **Getting First Half Stops**

In the last five games, the North Texas defense has struggled getting stops in the first half. The Mean Green has only forced eight punts in the first half over the last five games after forcing seven punts in the first half during the first two games. In comparison, North Texas has forced 14 punts in the second half over the past five games.

#### **Avoiding Three-and-Out**

The Mean Green offense has been doing better at avoiding three-and-out situations the last few games after struggling to sustain drives earlier in the year. In the first four games, the Mean Green had 17 three-and-out possessions for an average of 4.3 per game. In the last three games, the offense has had just five for an average of 1.7 per game. North Texas didn't have any three-and-out series' against Florida Atlantic and had a season-high seven against Alabama.

#### **Outgaining Opponents**

Despite a 1-6 record, North Texas has outgained four of its seven opponents in total offense. In games against Ball State (512-309), Ohio (301-232), Middle Tennessee (470-456) and Louisiana-Lafayette (444-295) the Mean Green has averaged 431 yards of offense while the opponents have averaged 323 for a difference of 108 yard per game. Since Dodge took over at North Texas in 2007, North Texas is 2-11 when outgaining its opponent in total offense. Last season North Texas lost the only two games when it outgained its opponents (Florida International and Louisiana-Monroe).

#### **Holding Leads**

In three of its six losses this year, North Texas has been unable to protect a double-digit lead. The Mean Green was up 17-6 over Ohio in the third quarter before the Bobcats scored two unanswered touchdowns to take a 20-17 fourth-quarter lead in a game Ohio eventually won in double overtime. Against Louisiana-Lafayette, North Texas led 34-24 early in the fourth quarter but was outscored 14-0 in the last 9:30 of the game to lose 38-34. Lastly, against Florida Atlantic, North Texas held its largest lead of the season when it was up 13-0, but the Mean Green allowed 30 second-quarter points and had to battle back in the second half. North Texas eventually took a 40-37 lead in the fourth quarter, but couldn't stop the Owls late and lost 44-40.

#### **Damaging Turnovers**

Turnovers have made a huge difference in the end result of three games for North Texas this season. In losses to Ohio, Louisiana-Lafayette and Florida Atlantic the Mean Green combined to commit 10 turnovers, while only gaining four. Those three opponents scored on seven of the 10 possessions that resulted from a North Texas turnover. Also in those two games, North Texas threw an interception that was returned for a touchdown – one by Nathan Tune against Ohio and one by Riley Dodge against Louisiana-Lafayette. Below is a look at the opponent points off turnovers in those three games:

#### **More Costly Mistakes**

In addition to turnovers by the offense, North Texas has made mistakes on special teams and defense that have been costly to the team's success. Against Louisiana-Lafayette, North Texas had a blocked punt returned for a touchdown and had three Ragin' Cajun fourth-down conversion attempts kept alive by penalties – all three of which resulted in touchdowns. In an overtime loss to Ohio the Mean Green defense allowed a touchdown on 4th-and-Goal from the 15-yard line and also roughed the passer to set up the Bobcats winning two-point conversion from the 1-yard line. In a comeback effort against Middle Tennessee, North Texas had a field goal attempt blocked in the first quarter and then trailed by nine points and needed a fourth quarter stop when it committed an unsportsmanlike penalty that kept a drive alive and allowed Middle Tennessee to score on the next play to seal the victory. Against Florida Atlantic, North Texas missed two PAT attempts and kicked three kickoffs out-of-bounds.

#### No Sack Attack

The North Texas offensive line has done a tremendous job protecting the quarterback, allowing just four sacks in seven games. The Mean Green ranks second in the nation with an average just .5 sacks allowed per game. When you look at the ratio of sacks allowed per pass attempt, North Texas is also second in the nation behind only Arizona. Below is a look at the national leaders in sacks allowed per pass attempt:

#### **Red Zone Defense**

The North Texas defense will be trying to improve its red zone defense this week. The Mean Green has allowed 28 scores on 31 possessions inside the red zone by opponents for a success rate of 90 percent, which ranks 105th nationally. The last six opponents have scored 27 of the 28 times inside the red zone, including Troy which was 6-of-7 last week. Even more concerning is the number of touchdowns allowed from inside the 20-yard line. Of the 28 red zone scores by opponents, 20 have been touchdowns.

#### Fourth Down Unfriendly

Converting fourth downs has been a bugaboo for the North Texas offense this year. The Mean Green has only successfully converted 1-of-8 fourth down attempts and was 0-for-1 last week against Troy. The one successful conversion came on a 15-yard run by Lance Dunbar on 4th-and-1 against Louisiana-Lafayette on a drive that was capped by a touchdown. Of the other seven fourth down conversion attempts, four have been unsuccessful rushing plays and three have been unsuccessful passing plays. On six of the eight fourth down plays, the North Texas offense had no gain or was thrown for a loss and on the other unsuccessful attempt it gained one yard.

#### **Big Plays Coming from Youngsters**

In seven games, North Texas has 32 plays that have covered 25 yards or more, including seven rushing plays, 12 passing plays, 12 kick returns and one interception return. Of those 32 plays, 19 have come from freshmen and sophomores and only one has come from a senior (running back Cam Montgomery). Sophomore running back Lance Dunbar leads the way with nine plays of more than 25 yards, including six runs and three pass receptions.

#### **Balanced Attack**

Mean Green head coach Todd Dodge has always said that his offense has a better chance at being successful if it is balanced between rushing and passing production. After seven games, North Texas has 1,262 yards rushing and 1,563 yards passing which is a 45 to 55 percent balance. Last season, rushing accounted for 35 percent of the total offense while passing accounted for 65 percent.

#### A New Home For The Mean Green

North Texas has called Fouts Field home since 1952, but those days are nearing an end. In



2011 the Mean Green will move into a new stadium located on-campus. Construction is set to begin on the stadium in January of 2010 and the stadium will have a capacity of 30,000 with the ability for future expansion to raise the total to 50,000. North Texas partnered with HKS to build the stadium - the same company that designed the American Airlines

Center in Dallas and the new Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas.

### **Big Guys With Experience**

While the Mean Green battled inexperience and youth in 2008, the 2009 North Texas offensive line is about as battled tested as you could want. The starting five have combined for a total of 104 career starts. The good thing about the group of Santiago (29 career starts), Bailey (20 career starts), Johnson (19 career starts), Drake (19 career starts), and Gill (17 career starts) is that only one is a senior (Bailey). In fact of the 10 offensive linemen in the two deep, only two are seniors, while four are juniors, three are sophomores and there is one freshman.

#### A Good Distributor

One of the areas that Coach Todd Dodge has emphasized this year is getting the ball in the hands of as many different people as possible. The last two seasons, wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald led the nation in receptions with over 110 each year. This year Dodge would like those receptions to be divided between two or even three receivers. So far, the plan is working, with three different wide receivers having over 25 catches. Last season after seven games, only one receiver (Fitzgerald) had more than 25 catches. In all, 13 different receivers have made at least one catch for the Mean Green this season.

#### Going For A Three-Peat

Todd Dodge has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. The Mean Green has never had three straight seasons of 4,000 or more yards of total offense before. North Texas is also going after its second 3,000-yard passing season in the last three years which has never happened before in school history. At the current pace, the Mean Green is on schedule for 4,836 yards of total offense and 2,676 yards passing.

#### Coaches Up/Coaches Down

North Texas will put three assistant coaches in the press box during games and will have six assistants along with head coach Todd Dodge on the sideline. In the press box will be offensive coordinator Todd Ford, along with defensive coordinator Gary DeLoach. Cornerbacks coach Carlton Buckels and safeties coach Chuck Peterson will join DeLoach in the press box. Linebackers coach David Rausch and defensive line coach Mike Nelson will be on the sidelines. Wide Receiver coach Clayton George and offensive line coach Spencer Leftwich will be on the sidelines along with special teams/running backs coach Shelton Gandy. Graduate assistant coaches Brian Morgan and Kevin Barbay will also be in the press box.

#### Well Represented in the NFL

North Texas has had more players drafted to play professional football than any other team in the Sun Belt Conference. Since the first NFL draft in 1936, North Texas has had 77 players drafted, including seven players picked in the first round. Arkansas State is second among Sun Belt Schools which have had players drafted with 46. Joe Greene is the highest drafted player ever from North Texas when he was selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers with the fourth overall pick in 1969.

#### **Following In Footsteps**

North Texas head coach Todd Dodge is one of only 56 known major college head coaches who have had the rare opportunity to coach his son in college. There are only three other current sets of father-and-son duos on Football Bowl Subdivision teams, Dan and Cody Hawkins at Colorado, Ricky and Brad Bustle at Louisiana-Lafayette and Steve and Scott Spurrier at South Carolina. Todd and Riley make only the 22nd father-and-son, quarter back-and-coach tandem in FBS history.

#### Lack of Senioritis

The North Texas roster has only 12 seniors for the 2009 season. Only six teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision have fewer seniors on their roster than North Texas, and only three of those teams (Boise State, Miami (OH), and Idaho) are non-BCS teams.

#### One Overtime Not Enough

North Texas has played in just two overtime games since the NCAA introduced the format in 1996. The Mean Green is 1-1 in its two overtime games, defeating Florida International 25-22 in seven overtimes in 2006 and losing to Ohio 31-30 in two overtimes this year. The Mean Green is the only FBS team that has never had a game decided in the first overtime period.

## MEAN GREEN OFFENSIVE INDIVIDUAL NOTES

#### **Getting it Dun**

Sophomore running back Lance Dunbar has exploded onto the scene since becoming the featured back when he came off the bench to replace starter Cam Montgomery in week four against Middle Tennessee. He has rushed for over 100 yards every game since that time and broke his career-high in rushing yards in three consecutive weeks. Along with becoming the regular starter at running back, he has established himself as one of the top backs in the Sun Belt Conference. Dunbar has 12 of the team's 16 rushing touchdowns and is averaging a league-best 159.2 yards per game against conference opponents. His average of 7.1 yards per carry ranks second in the NCAA among backs with at least 100 attempts behind only Ryan Matthews of Fresno State (7.3). Below is a look at Dunbar's numbers in the first three games compared to the last four games:

#### **Dodging Bullets**

Redshirt freshman Riley Dodge has started exactly five games as a college quarterback. While he has had his struggles this season, his numbers still stack up very well with other former Mean Green freshman quarterbacks. In five games, Dodge has a completion percentage of 64.5 and a pass efficiency rating of 115.5. Here is a look at how some other Mean Green quarterbacks did in their freshman year:

#### **Tuned Up**

Backup quarterback Nathan Tune has been called into action four times this year when starter Riley Dodge has left with an injury. Tune came off the bench against Ohio and Florida Atlantic and both times brought the team back from a second-half deficit to take a lead. He started games against Alabama and Troy and had the two-best passing performances of his career. His efficiency rating of 135.0 ranks as the fourth-highest in the Sun Belt Conference and his four touchdowns is one better than starter Riley Dodge's three for the year.

#### **Transfer Targets**

Junior college transfer wide receivers Jamaal Jackson and Michael Outlaw have made an immediate impact on the North Texas offense. Both are in the starting lineup and they rank first and second on the team in receiving yards and receptions. Jackson has a team-high 41 catches for 390 yards while Outlaw is close behind with 28 catches for 336 yards. Outlaw is averaging 12.7 yards per catch, and had a career-best seven catches for 112 yards and a touchdown against Troy.

#### Money on the Line

Despite several interchanging parts, the North Texas offensive line has held up admirably this season. In all, eight different offensive linemen have played in the six games, and the unit ranks second in the nation in sacks allowed with just four.

#### **Learning Fast**

True freshman wide receiver Darius Carey has steadily improved each week and is now a fixture in the starting lineup and a featured target of Mean Green quarterbacks. Carey is third on the team in receptions (27) and receiving yards (242). He is also working his way into the return game, having a spectacular 62-yard punt return for a touchdown that was called back against Middle Tennessee.

#### Getting a Kick

North Texas leads the Sun Belt Conference in both kickoff returns and kickoff coverage, which is a dramatic improvement from just a year ago when the Mean Green finished the season ranked dead last in the league in both categories. North Texas is averaging 23.1 yards per kick return, up from 18.1 a year ago. Covering kicks has been an even bigger improvement, with the Mean Green averaging a net of 44.3 yards per kickoff, up from 34.0 yards per kickoff last season.

#### Penson Back in Lineup

Junior linebacker A.J. Penson was back in the starting lineup last week against Troy, replacing injured starter Tobe Nwigwe who was out with a foot injury. Penson was a full-time starter at outside linebacker last year as a sophomore but became a backup when he moved to middle linebacker this year. In his first start of the year against the Trojans, Penson performed well totaling seven tackles, just one behind his career high.

#### **Linebackers Leading Way**

Senior Tobe Nwigwe and junior Craig Robertson have been the defensive leaders as starting linebackers for North Texas this season. Nwigwe missed the Troy game with an injured foot, but ranks 13th nationally with an average of 10.3 tackles per game (62 total). With the one extra game to his credit, Robertson leads the team in total tackles with 64 and ranks 38th nationally with an average of 9.1 per game. Robertson posted a career-high in tackles with 12 against Ball State in the season-opener and Nwigwe had a career-best the following week against Ohio with 15. Nwigwe also is tied for the lead on the team in tackles for loss with six. The two also led the team last season in tackles with Nwigwe posting 111 and Robertson close behind with 94.

#### Coming of Age

North Texas still has a very young defensive secondary, with all four starters either in their first or second year with the Mean Green. Sophomores Royce Hill and DaWaylon Cook are starters at cornerback and safety after playing extensively as true freshmen last season. Adryan Adams transferred to North Texas last year, but is in his first year as a full-time starter at cornerback. Fellow transfer Ira Smith is in his first year at North Texas and is the other starter at safety. The foursome has held up admirably in seven games - they rank third in the Sun Belt Conference in pass defense efficiency with a rating of 124.3, which is dramatically better than last year when the defensive backfield allowed opponents an efficiency rating of 164.8.

#### **Cook Coming On**

Sophomore safety DaWaylon Cook is feeling comfortable in his second year and his new position. As a true freshman last year, Cook was a backup cornerback and totaled 10 tackles in 11 games. After a year of experience and an offseason move to safety, Cook has become a leader in the secondary. After one tackle in the season opener, Cook has averaged 8.2 tackles in the last six games, including a career-best 11 against Alabama. He is third on the team with 50 tackles and 41 of those are solo stops.

#### Weighty Up Front

One of the biggest areas, literally, that North Texas addressed in the offseason was the defensive line. The Mean Green brought in six new players to help the defensive line and added a lot of size. Transfers Kelvin Jackson and Shavod Atkinson are the regular starters at defensive tackle, weighing in at 309 and 307 pounds respectively. John Weber is also a transfer who can play both tackle and end and weighs 288 pounds. True freshman defensive tackle Kyle White, who tips the scales at 309 pounds, saw his first action against Alabama. Add 301-pound redshirt freshman Tevinn Cantly to give you the fourth interior defensive lineman that are all playing this year. Last year North Texas didn't play any defensive lineman that weighed 300 pounds or more.

#### **Return Drought Continues**

It has been 128 games and counting since North Texas has returned a kickoff for a touchdown. Broderick McGrew was the last Mean Green player to do so when he took a kickoff and returned it 100 yards in a 28-27 loss to Utah State on Nov. 14, 1998. North Texas' current active streak ranks as the seventh-longest in the nation - led by Air Force, which hasn't brought a kick back for a score in 282 games.

Todd Dodge understands. The North Texas head football coach understands that he was



But he has not wavered from his plan and the only pressure to hasten the timeline for progress comes from within his own uncompromising commitment to success. Dodge understands his role in the development of the North Texas football program and he is fully invested.

In two years at the helm, Dodge has tried to establish a foundation that would lead to victory. The baseline of success on the field has been set and now Dodge believes he has the pieces in place to show that his work has not been futile. He has quietly assembled a team of coaches and players that he believes can thrive in his system. It has been a two-year process of molding young men and tweaking a staff that will serve as the groundwork for developing his program.



On the field, Dodge's influence has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. Dodge is now at least partially responsible for three of North Texas' top 10 total offensive performances, with 4,901 as a head coach in 2007 and 4,031 as an assistant coach in 1993 added to last year's performance.

One of the best success stories during the Dodge era will always be of wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald. Fitzgerald came to North Texas as a walk-on and spent his first two seasons in obscurity while seeing little action in a run-based offense. In his first year of Dodge's

Dodge, 45, officially assumed control of the North Texas football program on Dec. 26, 2006 - three days after he had coached his Southlake Carroll High School football team to its fourth state championship in five years. As one of the most widely respected high school football coaches in the nation, Dodge led Southlake Carroll to a 79-1 record over his final five years, with the only loss coming by a single point in the 2003 state championship game. Dodge closed his high school career with an amazing 48-game winning streak.

Dodge had already been familiar with the Mean Green, having served as an offensive assistant coach

in 1992 and 1993. During his tenure he helped direct the Mean Green offense to a per-game average of 348 yards and 26 points. He oversaw the progression of quarterback Mitch Maher, who holds numerous Mean Green offensive records, including pass completions, passing yards, and total offense. Maher went on to play for the Canadian Football Leagues' Shreveport Pirates.

Prior to coming to North Texas, Dodge's name had become synonymous with high school football success on the national scale. In addition to winning four class 5A state championships in five years, Southlake Carroll was recognized as national champions by USA Today in 2004 and 2006, and by PrepNation.com in 2005. Dodge amassed a 98-11 record overall at Carroll after taking over in 2000. In 2005, the Dragons set the Texas 5A state record for most points in a single season by tallying 764.

Dodge was named National Coach of the Year by Schutt Sports in 2004 and by USA Today in 2005. In 2006 PrepNation.com named him the Southwest Region coach of the year.

### September 3, 2009 Scheumann Stadium • Muncie, Indiana

MUNCIE, Ind. (9/3/09) - The North Texas football team left the '08 season in the rear view mirror, downing Ball State 20-10 in the season opener on Thursday night.

The Mean Green (1-0) won just its second season opener since 1997, and its first non-conference road game since 1999, with a gritty performance in front of 16,054 fans at Scheumann Stadium and a national TV audience on ESPNU. The win snapped the Cardinals (0-1) 14-game regular season winning streak that dated back to Nov. of 2007.

Needing to respond to a Ball State fourth-quarter game-tying touch-

down, the Mean Green did just that. On the ensuing drive, Riley Dodge hooked up with Jamaal Jackson for 59 yards to take NT down to the one. Two plays later Dodge found Michael Outlaw in the corner of the end zone to put North Texas up 17-10.

Dodge made the most of his first collegiate action by completing his first 11 passes. The redshirt freshman drove the Mean Green 55 yards before Lance Dunbar punched into the end zone on a three yard dive to open the scoring on their first possession.

He was aided by a potent running game led by Cam Montgomery, who broke lose for 149 yards on 8.8 yards per carry. North Texas piled up 296 rushing yards and racked up 512 total yards.

The defense pitched a first half shutout thanks to third-down stops and a key turnover. Just inside the second quarter Royce Hill jumped in front of a Kelly Page pass on the six yard line and returned it to the house.

Dodge & Co. controlled the edge of the field and the play clock for the entire first half. NT rushed for 160 yards in the half, most coming off left tackle behind captain Victor Gill.

The Mean Green defense held the Cardinals on a lengthy drive midway through the third quarter. Ball State got as far as the 1-yard line before the NT defense forced a short field goal to cut the lead to 10-3.

### **September 12, 2009** Fouts Field • Denton, Texas

DENTON, Texas (9/12/09) - Ohio connected on a two-point conversion in the second overtime to give the Bobcats a 31-30 victory against North Texas on Saturday night at Fouts Field.

On a rain-soaked field, the Mean Green and the Bobcats both struggled to hold onto the ball. The two teams combined for seven turnovers. Each team threw an interception and both resulted in touchdowns.

North Texas took an early 10-0 advantage, but Ohio pecked away at the lead. The Bobcats took their first lead, 20-17, in the fourth quar-

> ter, and North Texas sent it into overtime with a field goal. The two teams exchanged field goals in the first overtime period, and North Texas took the first lead in the second overtime with a touchdown and an extra point.


After North Texas went ahead, 30-23, on a Cam Montgomery touchdown in the second overtime, Theo Scott connected with Taylor Price twice to secure the win. First, Scott hit Price on fourth down from 15 yards out to come within one point of NT, 30-29.

The Bobcats went for the twopoint conversion from the twoyard line after a roughing the passer penalty against North Texas. Scott connected with Price again for the win.

Montgomery rushed for 88 yards on 22 carries in the game. Riley Dodge completed 12 of 20 passes for 117 yards and one touchdown, while Nathan Tune went 9-for-14 for 69 yards. Tune came in the game at the end of the third quarter after Dodge hurt his shoulder and had to come out of the game.

Jeremy Knott tied the game, 20-20, in regulation with an 18-yard field goal with 46 seconds left in the game. The Mean Green had reached the one-vard line off a nine-yard pass from Tune to Montgomery but was unable to get into the endzone on the next two rushes.

Kenny Jackson gave Ohio its first lead of the game, 20-17, with a 69-yard interception return for a touchdown with 8:44 left in the game. It was the first time that North Texas has trailed this season.





### **September 19, 2009** Bryant-Denny Stadium • Tuscaloosa, Alabama

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. (9/19/09) - The North Texas football team couldn't keep up with the Crimson Tide, falling to No. 4 Alabama 53-7 on Saturday.

Alabama (3-0) struck early and often, rolling up 523 yards of total offense and scores on nine of their 11 drives. The Crimson Tide defense was as good as advertised, holding the Mean Green (1-2) to 187 total yards and just 61 rushing yards.

Quarterback Nathan Tune led the Mean Green on a smooth scoring drive late in the third. The junior hooked up with Michael Outlaw

for 32 yards on an improvised roll out, and found Lance Dunbar just two plays later in the left flat. Dunbar rocketed 34 yards untouched into the endzone.

The touchdown pass was the first in Tune's career, and capped off a 5-play, 78-yard drive. Tune was efficient against the Crimson Tide, completing 16-of-23 attempts for 126 yards and a score.

The North Texas defense made things interesting out of the gate. On the game's opening play, Sam Owusu-Hemeng's speed rush fired him around the Crimson

Tide left tackle and into quarterback Greg McElroy, who coughed up the football. Brandon Akpunku scooped it up for the Mean Green, leaving the crowd of 92,012 stunned.

Alabama struck first when McElroy, a former Southlake Carroll quarterback under NT head coach Todd Dodge, led the Crimson Tide on a 13-play, 95-yard drive. The junior capped the drive with a two-yard plunge over the right endzone pylon to put Alabama on top 7-0.


McElroy would lead the Crimson Tide on three more touchdown drives, and 352 yards of offense in the opening half alone.

North Texas receiver Darius Carev was the Mean Green's most effective offensive weapon. The freshman caught five passes for 34 yards. James Hamilton found success running the ball late, grinding out 31 yards on seven touches.



DENTON, Texas (9/26/09) - Middle Tennessee quarterback Dwight Dasher threw two touchdown passes and rushed for two of his own to lead the Blue Raiders to a 37-21 victory against North Texas on Saturday night at Fouts Field.

Middle Tennessee jumped out to a 30-7 halftime lead and held on for the victory despite being outscored, 14-7 in the second half by the Mean Green. North Texas scored two touchdowns in the third quarter but was unable to continue the offensive output in the fourth. NT was hurt by five turnovers in the game.

Dodge scored the first one on a four-yard scamper, while Dunbar posted his second rushing touchdown of the day with an 18-yard sprint. The Mean Green defense held Middle Tennessee to just one first down in the third quarter.

North Texas started the game on a positive note with Royce Hill returning the opening kickoff 73 yards to the Middle Tennessee 25yard line. The Mean Green was unable to get a first down, attempted a field goal but had it blocked.





Dunbar had a career night. He rushed for 238 yards on 25 carries and scored three times. His long was for 50 yards, coming in the third-quarter comeback. He reached the 100-yard plateau after just 10 carries and 7:41 of game clock. His 238 yards are the most by a North Texas player since Jamario Thomas racked up 291 yards against Idaho on Nov. 13, 2004.

Nathan Tune stepped into the game in the second quarter after Riley Dodge went down with an ankle injury. Tune completed 13 of 17 passes for 129 yards and one touchdown

pass. His touchdown pass to Darius Carey in the third quarter helped spark the Mean Green comeback.

The Mean Green scored three straight times to regain the lead, 40-37, in the fourth quarter for the first time since the first quarter. Carey caught his first touchdown reception of the game in the Mean Green comeback and Dunbar recorded his second and third touchdown runs.

TROY, Alabama (10/24/09) - The Mean Green football team was unable to slow down an explosive offensive attack of the Troy Trojans and dropped their sixth straight contest 50-26 Saturday afternoon.

North Texas sophomore running back Lance Dunbar was a bright spot once again for the Mean Green. For the third straight contest Dunbar rushed for over 100 yards (14 carries-111 yards) and scored three touchdowns (2 rushing, 1 receiving).

However, the story of the afternoon was Troy senior quarter-



back Levi Brown throwing for a school record 469 yards on 27-of-44 passing, the most passing yards allowed by a North Texas defense since they joined the Sun Belt Conference in 2001.

Overall Troy outgained the Mean Green 697-395 in total yards.

In the first quarter Troy took the opening drive 60 yards in six plays and capped it off with a one-yard touchdown run from DuJuan Harris to give the Trojans a 7-0 lead.

Five minutes later it was Harris again, this time scoring on a three-yard run and pushing the Trojans lead to 14-0. It was the first time this season that North Texas had allowed touchdowns on backto-back drives to begin the game.

After a three and out from the Mean Green offense the Trojans would put together a 13-play drive that ended in a 30-yard field goal from Michael Taylor, putting the North Texas offense in a 17-0 hole. The 17 points was the most given up by the Mean Green defense in a first quarter this season.

North Texas would then put together their best drive of the half; a seven play, 75 yard drive that ended with a Dunbar three-yard touchdown making the score 17-7. The score was Dunbar's eighth rushing touchdown in his last three games and his 11th of the season. the 11:47 mark when Tune dropped a screen pass to Dunbar and sophomore took care of the rest, racing 60-yards for the touchdown.


