THE PARTICULARS

North Texas closes out its two-game homestand by hosting ULM at Fouts Field. There is no television but the game can be heard on the Mean Green Radio Network with George Dunham and Hank Dickenson. Kickoff is set for 3:05 p.m.

THE PRINCIPALS

North Texas enters the game coming off an offensive outburst with 68 points against Western Kentucky while ULM has lost two straight games after falling to Troy 42-21. The Mean Green ended a six-game losing streak with the win over Western Kentucky. ULM, playing its third straight road game, is just 1-4 on the road this season while North Texas picked up its first home win of the year over the Hilltoppers.

THE SERIES

The series dates back to 1978 and is very tight as ULM leads North Texas 13-12. The Warhawks have won three of the last four meetings with the Mean Green. The last North Texas win came in 2007, a 31-21 victory that was also the first collegiate win ever for Todd Dodge. In Denton North Texas has the edge over ULM, having won 8 of the 12 matchups and three of the last four games at home against ULM.

NEXT GAME

North Texas hits the road to face Florida International while ULM returns home to face Western Kentucky.

A CLOSER LOOK AT ULM

Head Coach Charlie Weatherbie — Weatherbie is in his seventh season at ULM. He guided the Warhawks to a share of the Sun Belt Conference title in 2005. He has led the Warhawks to 29 wins in his time at Monroe. Weatherbie is in his 17th overall year of coaching after two previous stints at Navy and Utah State. While at Navy, in 1996 was the year that saw the Midshipmen win nine games and the Aloha Bowl. At Utah State Weatherbie led the Aggies to their first ever Big West Conference title in 1993 and a Las Vegas Bowl victory.

The Matchup – North Texas and ULM enter the game as the top two rushing teams in the Sun Belt Conference. The Mean Green lead the league with just over 197 yards a game while ULM is averaging 174 yards a game on the ground. Lance Dunbar headlines the ground attack for North Texas as he is the league leader in rushing at 120 yards a game, which is also ninth in the nation. Dunbar is tied for second in the country in scoring, averaging 11.25 points a game. The ULM rushing defense is the best in the Sun Belt and 16th in the nation, allowing just under 100 yards a contest. The Mean Green's offense has gotten on track as they are the top scoring offense in the league. ULM is powered by Frank Goodin who is rushing for 88 yards a game and receiver LaGregory Sapp leads the league in receiving yards per game. North Texas quarterback Riley Dodge is 32nd in the country in total offense with 252 yards a game.

Media Information Post-Game Interviews

The North Texas locker room is closed to all members of the media. Head coach Todd Dodge and requested players will be available for interviews following a brief cooling off period. Postgame interviews at Fouts Field will be held in the media interview room below the east stands.

Credentials For Media

Those wishing to cover North Texas must contact Eric Capper or Steven Bartolotta for credentials for home and away games. Seating is very limited at Fouts Field and requests for North Texas home games need to be made at least one week prior to the contest.

Media Availability for Players

All player interviews will be conduted following the teams practice on Tuesday afternoon at the Athetic Center. Requsts for players should be made in advance through the sports information office. No interviews will be granted on Monday or Wednesday post practice. Special exemptions may be granted to those media wishing to interview a specific student-athlete before parctice at the discretion of the media relations office.

Sun Belt Teleconference

The Sun Belt Conference will conduct a weekly teleconference with each of the eight head coaches each Monday throughout the season. Coach Dodge will be on the call from 11:08-11:14 a.m. each week.

Post-Practice

Dodge will be available to media immediately following Tuesday's practice at the Darrell Dickey Practice Facility. Requests should be made in advance of practice to the media relations office.

Out of Town Media

Dodge and his assistant coaches are also available by request to out-of-town media Monday through Wednesday from 11 a.m.-12 noon. Contact the media relations office to arrange these requests.

Practice Coverage

Media has limited access to North Texas football practice. Viewing is available outside the fence of the practice facility. Video and still photography can be shot during the first 30 minutes of practice. Players and coaches are available for interviews following practice on Tuesday. All requests for interviews must be made in advance through the athletic media relations office.

Quick Hitters on This Week's Matchup - North Texas leads the Sun Belt Conference in rushing offense with an average of 197.9 yards per game. The Mean Green will be facing the league's top rush defense as Louisiana-Monroe is allowing just 99.4 yards per game, including just 74.5 yards per game against Sun Belt opponents... ULM ranks last in the Sun Belt in both red zone offense and red zone defense, scoring just 73.7 percent of the time they are inside the opponent 20-yard line and allowing teams to score 92.3 percent of the time... This game will feature the Sun Belt's top two scorers and two of the league's top running backs. Lance Dunbar of North Texas leads the conference with 15 touchdowns and 120.1 yards rushing per game. The Warhawks' Frank Goodin is second in the league in scoring with 10 touchdowns and third in rushing with an average of 88.4 yards per game... ULM has two of the top three pass rushers in the Sun Belt with Aaron Morgan leading the way with seven quarterback sacks and teammate Troy Evans ranking third with four sacks. The Mean Green has only allowed five quarterbacks sacks in eight games.

Dodge Named Player of the Week - Redshirt freshman quarterback Riley Dodge was named Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Week for his part in North Texas' 68-49 win over Western Kentucky last week. Dodge was responsible for seven touchdowns, including four through the air and three on the ground. He completed 24-of-30 passes for 262 yards with no interceptions. This is the second time this year that Dodge has earned the honor – also doing so in the season-opener against Ball State.

Longest Sun Belt Rivalry - Louisiana-Monroe has the longest history with North Texas among all current Sun Belt Conference teams. This will be the 26th game between the two regional rivals, which dates back to 1978 when Hayden Fry was coaching the Mean Green, and former Heisman Trophy winner John David Crow was the head coach at ULM. The two teams met 13 times as Southland Conference rivals from 1983-94, including once in a Div. I-AA playoff game in 1987. The next-longest rivalry with a current Sun Belt team is Arkansas State which stands at 18 games.

Smoking Hot Scoreboard - The 68 points that North Texas scored in the win over Western Kentucky last week tied the most points ever scored by a North Texas team in the 57-year history of Fouts Field. The last time a North Texas team scored that many points in a game was in 1957 when it defeated Youngstown 68-13 at Fouts. It is still 29 points the school record for points scored in a game, which was set by the 1929 team that hung 97 on Decatur Baptist.

What a Rush - North Texas had a season-high 321 yards rushing in the win over Western Kentucky, which was the fourth time this season that the Mean Green has rushed for over 200 yards in a game. That equals the number of 200-yard rushing games that North Texas had in the previous four years combined. The Mean Green had exactly one 200-yard rushing game in each of the four years 2005-08. Last year, the best team rushing effort was 203 yards – a total that has been topped four times this year. The last time a North Texas offense had this many 200-yard rushing games in a season was in 2004 when it had seven behind the efforts of freshman Jamario Thomas.

Second Quarter Struggles - North Texas has had a hard time in the second quarter lately. In the last three games, the Mean Green has been outscored 68-27 in the second quarter – an average of 22.7 points allowed in the second quarter alone. For the season North Texas has allowed nearly twice as many points in the second quarter (124) than any other quarter (64 in the third).

Long Scoring Plays - In the last four weeks, North Texas has been able to break some long scoring plays, including a season-long 71-yard touchdown run by sophomore running back Lance Dunbar last week against Western Kentucky. There have been a total of eight touchdown plays of longer than 30 yards this season and six of those have come in the last four games. All five of the touchdown plays over 50 yards have come in the last four games. Dunbar is responsible for six of the eight long touchdown plays while junior wide receiver Jamaal Jackson is responsible for the other two. In comparison, in all 12 games last year, North Texas had only five touchdown plays of longer than 30 yards and only one that carried more than 50 yards.

Giving Up Big Plays - The last two weeks, the North Texas defense has unable to stop the big play. In the first six games of the season, the Mean Green defense allowed a total of 26 plays of 20 yards or more for an average of 4.3 per game. In the last two games against Troy and Western Kentucky, the Mean Green has allowed 16 plays of 20 yards or more for an average of 8.0 per game. Of the 16 long plays by opponents in the last two games, 10 have been passing plays and six have been running plays. North Texas allowed three runs of over 40 yards last week against Western Kentucky.

Quick Scoring Drives - Going hand-in-hand with big plays, the North Texas defense has allowed a lot of very quick touchdown drives this season. Of the 35 touchdown drives against the North Texas defense, 13 have come in two minutes or less of game clock. The average touchdown drive by North Texas opponents this year has taken exactly 2:42 of game clock. Last week, Western Kentucky had seven touchdown drives and the average time of those drives was 2:40.

Getting First Half Stops- In the last six games, the North Texas defense has struggled getting stops in the first half. The Mean Green has only forced eight punts in the first half over the last six games after forcing seven punts in the first half during the first two games. In comparison, North Texas has forced 14 punts in the second half over the past six games.

Avoiding Three-and-Out - The Mean Green offense has been doing better at avoiding three-and-out situations the last few games after struggling to sustain drives earlier in the year. In the first four games, the Mean Green had 17 three-and-out possessions for an average of 4.3 per game. In the last four games, the offense has had just six for an average of 1.5 per game. North Texas had only one three-and-out series last week against Western Kentucky.

Outgaining Opponents -Despite a 2-6 record, North Texas has outgained five of its eight opponents in total offense. In games against Ball State (512-309), Ohio (301-232), Middle Tennessee (470-456), Louisiana-Lafayette (444-295) and Western Kentucky (583-425) the Mean Green has averaged 462 yards of offense while the opponents have averaged 343 for a difference of 119 yard per game. Since Dodge took over at North Texas in 2007, North Texas is 3-11 when outgaining its opponent in total offense. Last season North Texas lost the only two games when it outgained its opponents (Florida International and Louisiana-Monroe).

Holding Leads - In three of its six losses this year, North Texas has been unable to protect a double-digit lead. The Mean Green was up 17-6 over Ohio in the third quarter before the Bobcats scored two unanswered touchdowns to take a 20-17 fourth-quarter lead in a game Ohio eventually won in double overtime. Against Louisiana-Lafayette, North Texas led 34-24 early in the fourth quarter but was outscored 14-0 in the last 9:30 of the game to lose 38-34. Lastly, against Florida Atlantic, North Texas held its largest lead of the season when it was up 13-0, but the Mean Green allowed 30 second-quarter points and had to battle back in the second half. North Texas eventually took a 40-37 lead in the fourth quarter, but couldn't stop the Owls late and lost 44-40.

Damaging Turnovers -Turnovers have made a huge difference in the end result of three games for North Texas this season. In losses to Ohio, Louisiana-Lafayette and Florida Atlantic the Mean Green combined to commit 10 turnovers, while only gaining four. Those three opponents scored on seven of the 10 possessions that resulted from a North Texas turnover. Also in those two games, North Texas threw an interception that was returned for a touchdown – one by Nathan Tune against Ohio and one by Riley Dodge against Louisiana-Lafayette. Below is a look at the opponent points off turnovers in those three games:

More Costly Mistakes - In addition to turnovers by the offense, North Texas has made mistakes on special teams and defense that have been costly to the team's success. Against Louisiana-Lafayette, North Texas had a blocked punt returned for a touchdown and had three Ragin' Cajun fourth-down conversion attempts kept alive by penalties – all three of which resulted in touchdowns. In an overtime loss to Ohio the Mean Green defense allowed a touchdown on 4th-and-Goal from the 15-yard line and also roughed the passer to set up the Bobcats winning two-point conversion from the 1-yard line. In a comeback effort against Middle Tennessee, North Texas had a field goal attempt blocked in the first quarter and then trailed by nine points and needed a fourth quarter stop when it committed an unsportsmanlike penalty that kept a drive alive and allowed Middle Tennessee to score on the next play to seal the victory. Against Florida Atlantic, North Texas missed two PAT attempts and kicked three kickoffs out-of-bounds.

No Sack Attack - The North Texas offensive line has done a good job protecting the quarter-back, allowing just five sacks in eight games. The Mean Green ranks fifth in the nation with an average just .6 sacks allowed per game. When you look at the ratio of sacks allowed per pass attempt, North Texas is second in the nation behind only Arizona. Below is a look at the national leaders in sacks allowed per pass attempt:

Red Zone Defense - The North Texas defense will be trying to improve its red zone defense this week. The Mean Green has allowed 33 scores on 36 possessions inside the red zone by opponents for a success rate of 92 percent, which ranks 109th nationally. The last six opponents have scored 32 of the 33 times inside the red zone, including Western Kentucky which was 5-of-5 last week. Even more concerning is the number of touchdowns allowed from inside the 20-yard line. Of the 33 red zone scores by opponents, 25 have been touchdowns. Louisiana-Monroe is tied with North Texas to rank 109th in red zone defense, with the Warhawks giving up 24 scores on 26 opponent possessions inside the 20.

Fourth Down Unfriendly - Converting fourth downs has been a bugaboo for the North Texas offense this year. The Mean Green has only successfully converted 1-of-8 fourth down attempts. The one successful conversion came on a 15-yard run by Lance Dunbar on 4th-and-1 against Louisiana-Lafayette on a drive that was capped by a touchdown. Of the other seven fourth down conversion attempts, four have been unsuccessful rushing plays and three have been unsuccessful passing plays. On six of the eight fourth down plays, the North Texas offense had no gain or was thrown for a loss and on the other unsuccessful attempt it gained one yard.

Big Plays Coming from Youngsters - In eight games, North Texas has 40 plays that have covered 25 yards or more, including nine rushing plays, 14 passing plays, 16 kick returns and one interception return. Of those 40 plays, 39 have come from underclassmen with senior running back Cam Montgomery having the only other one. Sophomore running back Lance Dunbar leads the way with 11 plays of more than 25 yards, including eight runs and three pass receptions.

Balanced Attack - Mean Green head coach Todd Dodge has always said that his offense has a better chance at being successful if it is balanced between rushing and passing production. After eight games, North Texas has 1,583 yards rushing and 1,825 yards passing which is a 46 to 54 percent balance. Last season, rushing accounted for 35 percent of the total offense while passing accounted for 65 percent.

A New Home For The Mean Green - North Texas has called Fouts Field home since 1952, but those days are nearing an end. In 2011 the Mean Green will move into a new stadium located on-campus. Construction is set to begin on the stadium in January of 2010 and the stadium will have a capacity of 30,000 with the ability for future expansion to raise the total to 50,000. North Texas partnered with HKS to build the stadium - the same company that designed the American Airlines Center in Dallas and the new Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas.

Big Guys With Experience - While the Mean Green battled inexperience and youth in 2008, the 2009 North Texas offensive line is about as battled tested as you could want. The starting five have combined for a total of 109 career starts. The good thing about the group of Santiago (30 career starts), Bailey (21 career starts), Johnson (20 career starts), Drake (20 career starts), and Gill (18 career starts) is that only one is a senior (Bailey). In fact of the 10 offensive linemen in the two deep, only two are seniors, while four are juniors, three are sophomores and there is one freshman.

A Good Distributor - One of the areas that Coach Todd Dodge has emphasized this year is getting the ball in the hands of as many different people as possible. The last two seasons, wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald led the nation in receptions with over 110 each year. This year Dodge would like those receptions to be divided between two or even three receivers. So far, the plan is working, with three different wide receivers having over 30 catches. Last season after eight games, only one receiver (Fitzgerald) had more than 30 catches. In all, 13 different receivers have made at least one catch for the Mean Green this season.

Going For A Three-Peat - Todd Dodge has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. The Mean Green has never had three straight seasons of 4,000 or more yards of total offense before. North Texas is also going after its second 3,000-yard passing season in the last three years which has never happened before in school history. At the current pace, the Mean Green is on schedule for 5,112 yards of total offense and 2,736 yards passing.

Coaches Up/Coaches Down - North Texas will put three assistant coaches in the press box during games and will have six assistants along with head coach Todd Dodge on the sideline. In the press box will be offensive coordinator Todd Ford, along with defensive coordinator Gary DeLoach. Cornerbacks coach Carlton Buckels and safeties coach Chuck Peterson will join DeLoach in the press box. Linebackers coach David Rausch and defensive line coach Mike Nelson will be on the sidelines. Wide Receiver coach Clayton George and offensive line coach Spencer Leftwich will be on the sidelines along with special teams/running backs coach Shelton Gandy. Graduate assistant coaches Brian Morgan and Kevin Barbay will also be in the press box.

Well Represented in the NFL - North Texas has had more players drafted to play professional football than any other team in the Sun Belt Conference. Since the first NFL draft in 1936, North Texas has had 77 players drafted, including seven players picked in the first round. Arkansas State is second among Sun Belt Schools which have had players drafted with 46. Joe Greene is the highest drafted player ever from North Texas when he was selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers with the fourth overall pick in 1969.

Following In Footsteps - North Texas head coach Todd Dodge is one of only 56 known major college head coaches who have had the rare opportunity to coach his son in college. There are only three other current sets of father-and-son duos on Football Bowl Subdivision teams, Dan and Cody Hawkins at Colorado, Ricky and Brad Bustle at Louisiana-Lafayette and Steve and Scott Spurrier at South Carolina. Todd and Riley make only the 22nd father-and-son, quarter back-and-coach tandem in FBS history.

Lack of Senioritis - The North Texas roster has only 12 seniors for the 2009 season. Only six teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision have fewer seniors on their roster than North Texas, and only three of those teams (Boise State, Miami (OH), and Idaho) are non-BCS teams.

One Overtime Not Enough - North Texas has played in just two overtime games since the NCAA introduced the format in 1996. The Mean Green is 1-1 in its two overtime games, defeating Florida International 25-22 in seven overtimes in 2006 and losing to Ohio 31-30 in two overtimes this year. The Mean Green is the only FBS team that has never had a game decided in the first overtime period.

MEAN GREEN OFFENSIVE INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Getting it Dun - Sophomore running back Lance Dunbar has exploded onto the scene since becoming the featured back when he came off the bench to replace starter Cam Montgomery in week four against Middle Tennessee. He has rushed for over 100 yards every game since that time and is one of only three backs in the nation to have two, 200-yard rushing games. Along with becoming the regular starter at running back, he has established himself as one of the top backs in the nation. Dunbar has 13 of the team's 21 rushing touchdowns and is averaging a league-best 172.8 yards per game against conference opponents. His average of 7.6 yards per carry ranks first in the NCAA among backs with at least 120 attempts. Below is a look at Dunbar's numbers in the first three games compared to the last four games:

Closing in on 1,000 - With 964 rushing yards going into this week's game against Louisiana-Monroe, Dunbar is just 36 yards away from becoming just the ninth player in North Texas history to rush for 1,000 yards in a game. With six former greats bunched up between 1,016 and 1,154 yards, Dunbar needs just 190 yards to move into the top five in Mean Green history for single-season rushing yards.

Starting Comparisons - With the emergence of Lance Dunbar lately, he is beginning to draw comparisons with another former young North Texas running back. As a freshman in 2004, Jamario Thomas didn't earn his first start until the third game of the season and went on to lead the nation in rushing with an average of 180.1 yards per game. In his first four starts, Thomas rushed for 740 yards for an average of 185.0 per game. Dunbar did not earn his first start until the fifth game this year and in his first four starts he has rushed for 763 yards for an average of 190.8 yards per game.

Dodging Bullets - Redshirt freshman Riley Dodge has started exactly six games as a college quarterback. While he has had his struggles early on, his numbers stack up very well with other former Mean Green freshman quarterbacks. In six games, Dodge has a completion percentage of 67.0 and a pass efficiency rating of 128.9. Here is a look at how some other Mean Green quarterbacks did in their freshman year:

Tuned Up - Backup quarterback Nathan Tune has been called into action four times this year when starter Riley Dodge has left with an injury. Tune came off the bench against Ohio and Florida Atlantic and both times brought the team back from a second-half deficit to take a lead. He started games against Alabama and Troy and had the two-best passing performances of his career. His efficiency rating of 135.0 ranks as the fourth-highest in the Sun Belt Conference this season.

First Year Receivers - The top three receivers for North Texas this season are all in their first year with the Mean Green. Transfer Jamaal Jackson leads the team in receptions (47), receiving yards (466) and receiving touchdowns (4). Fellow transfer Michael Outlaw is third in receptions (30) and second in receiving yards (351). True freshman Darius Carey is second on the team in receptions (32) and third in receiving yards (293).

Money on the Line - As a group, the offensive line has helped the North Texas offense rank very high this year. The unit ranks fifth in the nation in sacks allowed with just five and is one of only four teams nationally to rank in the top 10 in sacks allowed as well as the top 20 in rushing and the top 30 in total offense (Georgia Tech., Stanford and Nevada). Junior guard Kelvin Drake has been a real bright spot after missing all of last season with an injury, Drake leads the team with 28 knockdowns and 11 pancake blocks. In all, eight different offensive linemen have played in the eight games.

MEAN GREEN DEFENSIVE/SPECIAL TEAMS INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Return Investment - When Shelton Gandy took on his new role as special teams coach during the off season he had his work cut out. The Mean Green finished last season ranked last in the Sun Belt Conference in kickoff returns and kickoff coverage. After eight games, Gandy has his kickoff return team ranked first in the league and his kickoff coverage team ranked fourth. The Mean Green is averaging 23.8 yards per kickoff return – up from 18.1 a year ago. Covering kicks has been an even bigger improvement, with the Mean Green averaging a net of 41.9 yards per kickoff, up from 34.0 yards per kickoff last season. Junior Jamaal Jackson has established himself as one of the best return guys in the league, averaging 33.5 after taking over the responsibility as of late.

Nwigwe Out With Injury - All-Conference linebacker Tobe Nwigwe suffered a foot injury against Florida Atlantic that will force him to miss the remainder of his senior season. Nwigwe has led the Sun Belt all season in tackles and currently ranks 14th nationally with his average of 10.3 stops per game, but he will fall off the leaders list when he doesn't meet the required minimum number of games played after this week. He was on pace to break his personal best of 111 tackles that he had last season.

Robertson Leading the Way - With the departure of Nwigwe, junior Craig Robertson has been the leader of the Mean Green defense. Robertson leads the team and ranks seventh in the Sun Belt in tackles with an average of 9.0 per game (72 total). He posted a career-high with 12 in the season-opener against Ball State and has been consistent with at least eight in every game. He is on pace to set a career-high in total tackles for the season, which he set last year with 94.

Coming of Age - North Texas still has a very young defensive secondary, with all four starters either in their first or second year with the Mean Green. Sophomores Royce Hill and DaWaylon Cook are starters at cornerback and safety after playing extensively as true freshmen last season. Adryan Adams transferred to North Texas last year, but is in his first year as a full-time starter at cornerback. Fellow transfer Ira Smith is in his first year at North Texas and is the other starter at safety. The foursome has held up admirably in eight games - they rank second in the Sun Belt Conference in pass defense efficiency with a rating of 126.8, which is dramatically better than last year when the defensive backfield allowed opponents an efficiency rating of 164.8.

Cook Coming On- Sophomore safety DaWaylon Cook is feeling comfortable in his second year and his new position. As a true freshman last year, Cook was a backup cornerback and totaled 10 tackles in 11 games. After a year of experience and an offseason move to safety, Cook has become a leader in the secondary. After one tackle in the season opener, Cook has averaged 8.1 tackles in the last seven games, including a career-best 11 against Alabama. He is third on the team with 57 tackles and 45 of those are solo stops.

Weighty Up Front -One of the biggest areas, literally, that North Texas addressed in the offseason was the defensive line. The Mean Green brought in six new players to help the defensive line and added a lot of size. Transfers Kelvin Jackson and Shavod Atkinson are the regular starters at defensive tackle, weighing in at 309 and 307 pounds respectively. John Weber is also a transfer who can play both tackle and end and weighs 288 pounds. True freshman defensive tackle Kyle White, who tips the scales at 309 pounds, saw his first action against Alabama. Add 301-pound redshirt freshman Tevinn Cantly to give you the fourth interior defensive lineman that are all playing this year. Last year North Texas didn't play any defensive lineman that weighed 300 pounds or more.

Return Drought Continues - It has been 129 games and counting since North Texas has returned a kickoff for a touchdown. Broderick McGrew was the last Mean Green player to do so when he took a kickoff and returned it 100 yards in a 28-27 loss to Utah State on Nov. 14, 1998. North Texas' current active streak ranks as the seventh-longest in the nation - led by Air Force, which hasn't brought a kick back for a score in 283 games.

HEAD COACH TODD DODGE

Todd Dodge understands. The North Texas head football coach understands that he was

hired to turn around a program that had slumped. He understands that, as he enters his third year, the pace of improvement has not come at the rate that many Mean Green fans had hoped for. But he has not wavered from his plan and the only pressure to hasten the timeline for progress comes from within his own uncompromising commitment to success. Dodge understands his role in the development of the North Texas football program and he is fully invested.

In two years at the helm, Dodge has tried to establish a foundation that would lead to victory. The baseline of success on the field has been set and now Dodge believes he has the pieces in place to show that his work has not been futile. He has quietly assembled a team of coaches and players that he believes can thrive in his system. It has been a two-year process of molding young men and tweaking a staff that will serve as the groundwork for developing his program.



On the field, Dodge's influence has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. Dodge is now at least partially responsible for three of North Texas' top 10 total offensive performances, with 4,901 as a head coach in 2007 and 4,031 as an assistant coach in 1993 added to last year's performance.

One of the best success stories during the Dodge era will always be of wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald. Fitzgerald came to North Texas as a walk-on and spent his first two seasons in obscurity while seeing little action in a run-based offense. In his first year of Dodge's

offense, Fitzgerald broke every North Texas singleseason receiving record and after just two years in his system, he is now the school's all-time leading receiver with 229 career catches (224 in his final two years under Dodge).



Dodge, 45, officially assumed control of the North Texas football program on Dec. 26, 2006 - three days after he had coached his Southlake Carroll High School football team to its fourth state championship in five years. As one of the most widely respected high school football coaches in the nation, Dodge led Southlake Carroll to a 79-1 record over his final five years, with the only loss coming by a single point in the 2003 state championship game. Dodge closed his high school career with an amazing 48-game winning streak.

Dodge had already been familiar with the Mean Green, having served as an offensive assistant coach

in 1992 and 1993. During his tenure he helped direct the Mean Green offense to a per-game average of 348 yards and 26 points. He oversaw the progression of quarterback Mitch Maher, who holds numerous Mean Green offensive records, including pass completions, passing yards, and total offense. Maher went on to play for the Canadian Football Leagues' Shreveport Pirates.

Prior to coming to North Texas, Dodge's name had become synonymous with high school football success on the national scale. In addition to winning four class 5A state championships in five years, Southlake Carroll was recognized as national champions by USA Today in 2004 and 2006, and by PrepNation.com in 2005. Dodge amassed a 98-11 record overall at Carroll after taking over in 2000. In 2005, the Dragons set the Texas 5A state record for most points in a single season by tallying 764.

Dodge was named National Coach of the Year by Schutt Sports in 2004 and by USA Today in 2005. In 2006 PrepNation.com named him the Southwest Region coach of the year.





MUNCIE, Ind. (9/3/09) - The North Texas football team left the '08 season in the rear view mirror, downing Ball State 20-10 in the season opener on Thursday night.

The Mean Green (1-0) won just its second season opener since 1997, and its first non-conference road game since 1999, with a gritty performance in front of 16,054 fans at Scheumann Stadium and a national TV audience on ESPNU. The win snapped the Cardinals (0-1) 14-game regular season winning streak that dated back to Nov. of 2007.

Needing to respond to a Ball State fourth-quarter game-tying touchdown, the Mean Green did just that.



On the ensuing drive, Riley Dodge
hooked up with Jamaal Jackson for
59 yards to take NT down to the
one. Two plays later Dodge found
Michael Outlaw in the corner of the
end zone to put North Texas up 17-10.
Dodge made the most of his first

collegiate action by completing his first 11 passes. The redshirt freshman drove the Mean Green 55 yards before Lance Dunbar punched into the end zone on a three yard dive to open the scoring on their first possession.

He was aided by a potent running game led by Cam Montgomery, who broke lose for 149 yards on 8.8 yards per carry. North Texas piled up 296 rushing yards and racked up 512 total yards.

The defense pitched a first half shutout thanks to third-down stops and a key turnover. Just inside the second quarter Royce Hill jumped in front of a Kelly Page pass on the six yard line and returned it to the house.

Dodge & Co. controlled the edge of the field and the play clock for the entire first half. NT rushed for 160 yards in the half, most coming off left tackle behind captain Victor Gill.

The Mean Green defense held the Cardinals on a lengthy drive midway through the third quarter. Ball State got as far as the 1-yard line before the NT defense forced a short field goal to cut the lead to 10-3.

September 12, 2009 Fouts Field • Denton, Texas

DENTON, Texas (9/12/09) - Ohio connected on a two-point conversion in the second overtime to give the Bobcats a 31-30 victory against North Texas on Saturday night at Fouts Field.

On a rain-soaked field, the Mean Green and the Bobcats both struggled to hold onto the ball. The two teams combined for seven turnovers. Each team threw an interception and both resulted in touchdowns.

North Texas took an early 10-0 advantage, but Ohio pecked away at the lead. The Bobcats took their first lead, 20-17, in the fourth quar-

> ter, and North Texas sent it into overtime with a field goal. The two teams exchanged field goals in the first overtime period, and North Texas took the first lead in the second overtime with a touchdown and an extra point.


After North Texas went ahead, 30-23, on a Cam Montgomery touchdown in the second overtime, Theo Scott connected with Taylor Price twice to secure the win. First, Scott hit Price on fourth down from 15 yards out to come within one point of NT, 30-29.

The Bobcats went for the twopoint conversion from the twoyard line after a roughing the passer penalty against North Texas. Scott connected with Price again for the win.

Montgomery rushed for 88 yards on 22 carries in the game. Riley Dodge completed 12 of 20 passes for 117 yards and one touchdown, while Nathan Tune went 9-for-14 for 69 yards. Tune came in the game at the end of the third quarter after Dodge hurt his shoulder and had to come out of the game.

Jeremy Knott tied the game, 20-20, in regulation with an 18-yard field goal with 46 seconds left in the game. The Mean Green had reached the one-vard line off a nine-yard pass from Tune to Montgomery but was unable to get into the endzone on the next two rushes.

Kenny Jackson gave Ohio its first lead of the game, 20-17, with a 69-yard interception return for a touchdown with 8:44 left in the game. It was the first time that North Texas has trailed this season.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. (9/19/09) - The North Texas football team couldn't keep up with the Crimson Tide, falling to No. 4 Alabama 53-7 on Saturday.

Alabama (3-0) struck early and often, rolling up 523 yards of total offense and scores on nine of their 11 drives. The Crimson Tide defense was as good as advertised, holding the Mean Green (1-2) to 187 total yards and just 61 rushing yards.

Quarterback Nathan Tune led the Mean Green on a smooth scoring drive late in the third. The junior hooked up with Michael Outlaw

for 32 yards on an improvised roll out, and found Lance Dunbar just two plays later in the left flat. Dunbar rocketed 34 yards untouched into the endzone.

The touchdown pass was the first in Tune's career, and capped off a 5-play, 78-yard drive. Tune was efficient against the Crimson Tide, completing 16-of-23 attempts for 126 yards and a score.

The North Texas defense made things interesting out of the gate. On the game's opening play, Sam Owusu-Hemeng's speed rush fired him around the Crimson

Tide left tackle and into quarterback Greg McElroy, who coughed up the football. Brandon Akpunku scooped it up for the Mean Green, leaving the crowd of 92,012 stunned.

Alabama struck first when McElroy, a former Southlake Carroll quarterback under NT head coach Todd Dodge, led the Crimson Tide on a 13-play, 95-yard drive. The junior capped the drive with a two-yard plunge over the right end-zone pylon to put Alabama on top 7-0.


McElroy would lead the Crimson Tide on three more touchdown drives, and 352 yards of offense in the opening half alone.

North Texas receiver Darius Carey was the Mean Green's most effective offensive weapon. The freshman caught five passes for 34 yards. James Hamilton found success running the ball late, grinding out 31 yards on seven touches.





back Levi Brown throwing for a school record 469 yards on 27-of-44 passing, the most passing yards allowed by a North Texas defense since they joined the Sun Belt Conference in 2001.

Overall Troy outgained the Mean Green 697-395 in total yards.

In the first quarter Troy took the opening drive 60 yards in six plays and capped it off with a one-yard touchdown run from DuJuan Harris to give the Trojans a 7-0 lead.

Five minutes later it was Harris again, this time scoring on a three-yard run and pushing the Trojans lead to 14-0. It was the first time this season that North Texas had allowed touchdowns on backto-back drives to begin the game.

The 68 points scored tied for the most points in school history.






