THE PARTICULARS

North Texas travels to Miami to take on Florida International. There is no television for the game but it can be heard on the Mean Green Radio Network. Kick-off is set for 6 p.m.

THE PRINCIPALS

North Texas heads back on the road to face an FIU team with an identical record. Both teams are coming off tough losses, the Mean Green to ULM and FIU to MTSU on the road. The Golden Panthers are playing just their fourth home game of the season, as they are 1-2 at home on the year. North Texas has two of its final three games away from home and is 1-3 on the road this season.

THE SERIES

North Texas and FIU have each won two games as the series is tied at 2-2. The two teams first met in 2005 in Miami, a 13-10 North Texas win. A year later an epic seven-overtime battle put the two teams into the record books as the Mean Green outlasted FIU that night 25-22. The Golden Panthers have won the last two meetings against North Texas.

NEXT GAME

North Texas returns home to close out the home portion of its schedule with a battle against Army while FIU plays its final non-conference game of the year against the No. 1 team in the land in Florida.

A CLOSER LOOK AT FIU

Head Coach Mario Cristobal – He is in his third season at FIU and has strong ties to the South Florida area. He arrived at FIU after coaching three seasons at his alma mater Miami. Prior to coaching at Miami, he was at Rutgers from 2001-03 and helped lay the foundation for the program's resurgence. At FIU, Cristobal led the Golden Panthers to a 5-7 season in 2008, which tied for the most wins in school history at FIU. Cristobal was named the SBC Coach of the Year by The Sporting News after his success last season.

The Matchup – North Texas and FIU enter the game with two struggling defense's. The Mean Green continues to lead the Sun Belt Conference in rushing while FIU ranks 118th in the country in stopping the run. The Golden Panthers total defense ranks 118th in the country. North Texas has fallen to 107 in total defense and 116 in scoring defense. Lance Dunbar continues to lead the Sun Belt Conference in rushing with 111 yards a game. Jamaal Jackson has emerged on the kickoff return front as he is averaging over 30-yards a return, ninth in the country. Royce Hill is ranked 25th for North Texas while T.Y. Hilton for FIU is the 2nd leading return man in the nation. FIU also has the top punt return unit in the Sun Belt Conference this season, averaging 13 yards a return. The magic number this season for FIU has been 20 points as there two wins have been when holding their opponent under that number while they are 0-7 when allowing 20 points or more this year.

Media Information Post-Game Interviews

The North Texas locker room is closed to all members of the media. Head coach Todd Dodge and requested players will be available for interviews following a brief cooling off period. Postgame interviews at Fouts Field will be held in the media interview room below the east stands.

Credentials For Media

Those wishing to cover North Texas must contact Eric Capper or Steven Bartolotta for credentials for home and away games. Seating is very limited at Fouts Field and requests for North Texas home games need to be made at least one week prior to the contest

Media Availability for Players

All player interviews will be conduted following the teams practice on Tuesday afternoon at the Athetic Center. Requsts for players should be made in advance through the sports information office. No interviews will be granted on Monday or Wednesday post practice. Special exemptions may be granted to those media wishing to interview a specific student-athlete before parctice at the discretion of the media relations office.

Sun Belt Teleconference

The Sun Belt Conference will conduct a weekly teleconference with each of the eight head coaches each Monday throughout the season. Coach Dodge will be on the call from 11:08-11:14 a.m. each week.

Post-Practice

Dodge will be available to media immediately following Tuesday's practice at the Darrell Dickey Practice Facility. Requests should be made in advance of practice to the media relations office.

Out of Town Media

Dodge and his assistant coaches are also available by request to out-of-town media Monday through Wednesday from 11 a.m.-12 noon. Contact the media relations office to arrange these requests.

Practice Coverage

Media has limited access to North Texas football practice. Viewing is available outside the fence of the practice facility. Video and still photography can be shot during the first 30 minutes of practice. Players and coaches are available for interviews following practice on Tuesday. All requests for interviews must be made in advance through the athletic media relations office.

Quick Hitters on FIU Matchup - North Texas enters this week's game as the top rushing team in the Sun Belt Conference, averaging 184.7 yards per game. Florida International ranks eighth in the league in rushing defense, allowing an average of 242.9 yards per game... Florida International is the only team in the Sun Belt that doesn't average over 100 yards rushing per game (92.8)... North Texas it tops in the Sun Belt in passing completion percentage at 66.1 percent, while FIU is last at 52.8 percent... FIU ranks last in the conference in quarterback sacks allowed, giving up an average of 3.4 per game. The North Texas defense has had only four sacks in the last four games.

Comparing Common Opponents - North Texas and Florida International have played six common opponents this season, including five Sun Belt Conference teams and No. 2-ranked Alabama. Against those six common opponents, FIU has averaged 26.7 points per game while North Texas has averaged 27.0 points per game. The Golden Panthers have allowed an average of 35.8 points against those teams while the Mean Green has given up an average of 43.3. North Texas holds the advantage in total offense and total defense, averaging 391.2 yards of offense to 352.2 for FIU and 475.0 yards of defense compared to 501.0 yards for FIU.

Could Be a Special Game - Special teams could play a big part in the game this week with Florida International. North Texas leads the Sun Belt Conference in kickoff returns with an average of 23.6 yards per return. In league games, FIU has been spectacular in kickoff coverage, leading the Sun Belt by allowing an average of 15.9 yards per return. The Golden Panthers also lead the conference in punt return average at 13.0 per attempt. The Mean Green is last in the league in net punting, averaging just 32.4 per attempt, which includes an average punt return of 11.2 yards by opponents.

From 68 to Six in One Week -A little over a week ago, North Texas tied a Fouts Field record by scoring 68 points in a win over Western Kentucky – scoring nine touchdowns in a game for the first time since 1957. Just seven days later, the Mean Green offense couldn't reach paydirt one time in a 33-6 loss to Louisiana-Monroe. It was the first time under third-year head coach Todd Dodge that North Texas didn't score a touchdown against a Sun Belt opponent. It was also the lowest scoring output by a Mean Green team at home since a 35-0 loss to Middle Tennessee in 2006. Coming into last week's game with ULM, North Texas had averaged 33.7 points per game at home under Dodge.

Getting Out of the Gate -In four road games this year, North Texas has struggled getting the offense going early. The Mean Green has been outscored 38-10 in the first quarter on the road, scoring its only touchdown during that time in the season opener at Ball State. In the last three away games at Alabama, Louisiana-Lafayette and Troy, the Mean Green has been outscored 38-3 in the first quarter.

Limiting Fumbles -After losing nine fumbles in the first six games of the year, North Texas is now riding a three-game stretch without losing a single fumble. The Mean Green has not lost a fumble since backup quarterback Nathan Tune turned it over late in the first half against Florida Atlantic – a streak of 226 offensive plays and counting. Interestingly, of the nine total fumbles that North Texas has lost this season, seven have come at home and only two have happened on the road.

What a Rush - North Texas had a season-high 321 yards rushing in the win over Western Kentucky, which was the fourth time this season that the Mean Green has rushed for over 200 yards in a game. That equals the number of 200-yard rushing games that North Texas had in the previous four years combined. The Mean Green had exactly one 200-yard rushing game in each of the four years 2005-08. Last year, the best team rushing effort was 203 yards – a total that has been topped four times this year. The last time a North Texas offense had this many 200-yard rushing games in a season was in 2004 when it had seven behind the efforts of freshman Jamario Thomas.

Second Quarter Quandary - North Texas has had a hard time in the second quarter lately. In the last four games, the Mean Green has been outscored 78-27 in the second quarter – an average of 19.5 points allowed in the second quarter alone. For the season North Texas has allowed nearly twice as many points in the second quarter (134) than any other quarter (74 in the third).

Only at Home? - The second quarter struggles seem to be much more prevalent at home than on the road. Through the first nine games, the second quarter is the Mean Green's lowest scoring quarter at home (5.4 points per game) and its highest scoring quarter on the road (7.8 points). The overall scoring discrepancy between home games and road games is also glaring, with the Mean Green averaging 33.0 points per game at Fouts Field and 21.8 points per game away from home.

Long Scoring Plays - North Texas has been able to break some long scoring plays this year, including a season-long 71-yard touchdown run by sophomore running back Lance Dunbar against Western Kentucky. There have been a total of eight touchdown plays of longer than 30 yards this season and six of those have come in the last five games. All five of the touchdown plays over 50 yards have come in the last five games. Dunbar is responsible for six of the eight long touchdown plays while junior wide receiver Jamaal Jackson is responsible for the other two. In comparison, in all 12 games last year, North Texas had only five touchdown plays of longer than 30 yards and only one that carried more than 50 yards.

Giving Up Big Plays - The last three weeks, the North Texas defense has unable to stop the big play. In the first six games of the season, the Mean Green defense allowed a total of 26 plays of 20 yards or more for an average of 4.3 per game. In the last three games against Troy, Western Kentucky and Louisiana-Monroe the Mean Green has allowed 24 plays of 20 yards or more for an average of 8.0 per game. Of the 24 long plays by opponents in the last three games, 16 have been passing plays and eight have been running plays. North Texas allowed four passes of over 30 yards last week against ULM.

Quick Scoring Drives - Going hand-in-hand with big plays, the North Texas defense has allowed a lot of very quick touchdown drives this season. Of the 39 touchdown drives against the North Texas defense, 13 have come in two minutes or less of game clock. The average touchdown drive by North Texas opponents this year has taken 2:51 of game clock. Last week, the average touchdown drive for ULM lasted 3:22.

Avoiding Three-and-Out - The Mean Green offense had been doing better at avoiding three-and-out situations before last week's loss to Louisiana-Monroe. In the four games leading up to the ULM game, the Mean Green was averaging just 1.5 three-and-out possessions per game. Against the Warhawks, North Texas had three.

Outgaining Opponents -Despite a 2-7 record, North Texas has outgained five of its nine opponents in total offense. In games against Ball State (512-309), Ohio (301-232), Middle Tennessee (470-456), Louisiana-Lafayette (444-295) and Western Kentucky (583-425) the Mean Green has averaged 462 yards of offense while the opponents have averaged 343 for a difference of 119 yard per game. Since Dodge took over at North Texas in 2007, North Texas is 3-11 when outgaining its opponent in total offense. Last season North Texas lost the only two games when it outgained its opponents (Florida International and Louisiana-Monroe).

Holding Leads -In three of its seven losses this year, North Texas has been unable to protect a double-digit lead. The Mean Green was up 17-6 over Ohio in the third quarter before the Bobcats scored two unanswered touchdowns to take a 20-17 fourth-quarter lead in a game Ohio eventually won in double overtime. Against Louisiana-Lafayette, North Texas led 34-24 early in the fourth quarter but was outscored 14-0 in the last 9:30 of the game to lose 38-34. Lastly, against Florida Atlantic, North Texas held its largest lead of the season when it was up 13-0, but the Mean Green allowed 30 second-quarter points and had to battle back in the second half. North Texas eventually took a 40-37 lead in the fourth quarter, but couldn't stop the Owls late and lost 44-40.

Damaging Turnovers - Turnovers have made a huge difference in the end result of three games for North Texas this season. In losses to Ohio, Louisiana-Lafayette and Florida Atlantic the Mean Green combined to commit 10 turnovers, while only gaining four. Those three opponents scored on seven of the 10 possessions that resulted from a North Texas turnover. Also in those two games, North Texas threw an interception that was returned for a touchdown – one by Nathan Tune against Ohio and one by Riley Dodge against Louisiana-Lafayette. Below is a look at the opponent points off turnovers in those three games:

No Sack Attack - The North Texas offensive line has done a good job protecting the quarterback, allowing just eight sacks in nine games. The Mean Green ranks eighth in the nation with an average of just .9 sacks allowed per game. When you look at the ratio of sacks allowed and passes attempted, North Texas ranks fifth in the nation. Below is a look at the national leaders in sacks allowed per pass attempt:

Red Zone Defense - The North Texas defense will be trying to improve its red zone defense this week. The Mean Green has allowed 36 scores on 40 possessions inside the red zone by opponents for a success rate of 90 percent, which ranks 109th nationally. The last six opponents have scored 35 of the 37 times inside the red zone. Even more concerning is the number of touchdowns allowed from inside the 20-yard line. Of the 36 red zone scores by opponents, 28 have been touchdowns (78 percent). Florida International ranks eighth in the Sun Belt in red zone offense, with a scoring success rate of 78.4 percent.

Fourth Down Unfriendly -Converting fourth downs has been a bugaboo for the North Texas offense this year. The Mean Green has only successfully converted 1-of-9 fourth down attempts. The one successful conversion came on a 15-yard run by Lance Dunbar on 4th-and-1 against Louisiana-Lafayette on a drive that was capped by a touchdown. Of the other eight fourth down conversion attempts, four have been unsuccessful rushing plays and four have been unsuccessful passing plays. On seven of the nine fourth down plays, the North Texas offense had no gain or was thrown for a loss and on the other unsuccessful attempt it gained one yard.

Big Plays Coming from Youngsters -In nine games, North Texas has 45 plays that have covered 25 yards or more, including nine rushing plays, 16 passing plays, 18 kick returns and one interception return and one punt return. Of those 45 plays, 44 have come from underclassmen with senior running back Cam Montgomery having the only other one. Junior wide receiver leads the way as the big play man, with nine kick returns and four receptions of more than 25 yards. Sophomore running back Lance Dunbar is close behind with 11.

Balanced Attack

Mean Green head coach Todd Dodge has always said that his offense has a better chance at being successful if it is balanced between rushing and passing production. After nine games, North Texas has 1,662 yards rushing and 2,014 yards passing which is a 45 to 55 percent balance. Last season, rushing accounted for 35 percent of the total offense while passing accounted for 65 percent.

A New Home For The Mean Green

North Texas has called Fouts Field home since 1952, but those days are nearing an end. In 2011 the Mean Green will move into a new stadium located on-campus. Construction is set to begin on the stadium in January of 2010 and the stadium will have a capacity of 30,000 with the ability for future expansion to raise the total to 50,000. North Texas partnered with HKS to build the stadium - the same company that designed the American Airlines Center in Dallas and the new Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas.

Big Guys With Experience

While the Mean Green battled inexperience and youth in 2008, the 2009 North Texas offensive line is about as battled tested as you could want. The starting five have combined for a total of 114 career starts. The good thing about the group of Santiago (31 career starts), Bailey (22 career starts), Johnson (21 career starts), Drake (21 career starts), and Gill (19 career starts) is that only one is a senior (Bailey). In fact of the 10 offensive linemen in the two deep, only two are seniors, while four are juniors, three are sophomores and there is one freshman.

A Good Distributor - One of the areas that Coach Todd Dodge has emphasized this year is getting the ball in the hands of as many different people as possible. The last two seasons, wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald led the nation in receptions with over 110 each year. This year Dodge would like those receptions to be divided between two or even three receivers. So far, the plan is working, with three different wide receivers having over 30 catches. Last season after nine games, only one receiver (Fitzgerald) had more than 30 catches. In all, 14 different receivers have made at least one catch for the Mean Green this season.

Going For A Three-Peat - Todd Dodge has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. The Mean Green has never had three straight seasons of 4,000 or more yards of total offense before. North Texas is also going after its second 3,000-yard passing season in the last three years which has never happened before in school history. At the current pace, the Mean Green is on schedule for 4,900 yards of total offense and 2,686 yards passing.

Coaches Up/Coaches Down - North Texas will put three assistant coaches in the press box during games and will have six assistants along with head coach Todd Dodge on the sideline. In the press box will be offensive coordinator Todd Ford, along with defensive coordinator Gary DeLoach. Cornerbacks coach Carlton Buckels and safeties coach Chuck Peterson will join DeLoach in the press box. Linebackers coach David Rausch and defensive line coach Mike Nelson will be on the sidelines. Wide Receiver coach Clayton George and offensive line coach Spencer Leftwich will be on the sidelines along with special teams/running backs coach Shelton Gandy. Graduate assistant coaches Brian Morgan and Kevin Barbay will also be in the press box.

Well Represented in the NFL -North Texas has had more players drafted to play professional football than any other team in the Sun Belt Conference. Since the first NFL draft in 1936, North Texas has had 77 players drafted, including seven players picked in the first round. Arkansas State is second among Sun Belt Schools which have had players drafted with 46. Joe Greene is the highest drafted player ever from North Texas when he was selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers with the fourth overall pick in 1969.

Following In Footsteps -North Texas head coach Todd Dodge is one of only 56 known major college head coaches who have had the rare opportunity to coach his son in college. There are only three other current sets of father-and-son duos on Football Bowl Subdivision teams, Dan and Cody Hawkins at Colorado, Ricky and Brad Bustle at Louisiana-Lafayette and Steve and Scott Spurrier at South Carolina. Todd and Riley make only the 22nd father-and-son, quarter back-and-coach tandem in FBS history.

Lack of Senioritis -The North Texas roster has only 12 seniors for the 2009 season. Only six teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision have fewer seniors on their roster than North Texas, and only three of those teams (Boise State, Miami (OH), and Idaho) are non-BCS teams.

Record Enrollment - The University of North Texas marked its ninth consecutive year of record-breaking student population when the fall 2009 enrollment was announced at 36,206. This year's numbers reflect the largest single-year increase since 2002 and continue to secure North Texas as the fourth-largest university in the state of Texas.

One Overtime Not Enough - North Texas has played in just two overtime games since the NCAA introduced the format in 1996. The Mean Green is 1-1 in its two overtime games, defeating Florida International 25-22 in seven overtimes in 2006 and losing to Ohio 31-30 in two overtimes this year. The Mean Green is the only FBS team that has never had a game decided in the first overtime period.

MEAN GREEN OFFENSIVE INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Dunbar over 1,000 - Sophomore running back Lance Dunbar became just the ninth player in North Texas history to rush for over 1,000 yards in a season when he eclipsed the mark last week against Louisiana-Monroe. His 1,001 yards on the ground this season ranks as the 11th-highest single-season rushing performance in North Texas history. With three games remaining, Dunbar needs just 153 yards to move into the top five single-season rushers list. At his current average of 111.2 yards per game, he would finish fourth behind only Jamario Thomas (1,801 in 2004), Patrick Cobbs (1,680 in 2003) and Bernard Jackson (1,453 in 1978).

Getting it Dun - Sophomore running back Lance Dunbar has exploded onto the scene since becoming the featured back when he came off the bench to replace starter Cam Montgomery in week four against Middle Tennessee. He has rushed for over 100 yards in four of his five starts and is one of only three backs in the nation to have two, 200-yard rushing games. Along with becoming the regular starter at running back, he has established himself as one of the top backs in the nation. Dunbar has 13 of the team's 21 rushing touchdowns and is averaging a league-best 150.7 yards per game against conference opponents. His average of 7.0 yards per carry ranks second in the NCAA among backs with at least 140 attempts. Below is a look at Dunbar's numbers in the first three games compared to the last four games:

Starting Comparisons - With the emergence of Lance Dunbar lately, he is beginning to draw comparisons with another former young North Texas running back. As a freshman in 2004, Jamario Thomas didn't earn his first start until the third game of the season and went on to lead the nation in rushing with an average of 180.1 yards per game. In his first five starts, Thomas rushed for 998 yards for an average of 199.6 per game with eight touchdowns. Dunbar did not earn his first start until the fifth game this year and in his first five starts he has rushed for 803 yards for an average of 160.6 yards per game and 10 touchdowns.

Dodging Bullets - Redshirt freshman Riley Dodge has started seven games as a college quarterback. While he has had his struggles early on, his numbers stack up very well with other former Mean Green freshman quarterbacks. In seven games, Dodge has a completion percentage of 65.3 and a pass efficiency rating of 121.3. Here is a look at how some other Mean Green quarterbacks did in their freshman year:

First Year Receivers - The top three receivers for North Texas this season are all in their first year with the Mean Green. Transfer Jamaal Jackson leads the team in receptions (50), receiving yards (506) and receiving touchdowns (4). True freshman Darius Carey is second on the team in both receptions (41) and receiving yards (365). Transfer Michael Outlaw is third in receptions (31) and receiving yards (357).

Money on the Line - As a group, the offensive line has helped the North Texas offense rank very high this year. The unit ranks eighth in the nation in sacks allowed with just eight and is one of only six teams nationally to rank in the top 10 in sacks allowed as well as the top 30 in rushing and the top 40 in total offense. Junior guard Kelvin Drake has been a real bright spot after missing all of last season with an injury, Drake leads the team with 31 knockdowns and 12 pancake blocks. In all, eight different offensive linemen have played in the eight games.

MEAN GREEN DEFENSIVE/SPECIAL TEAMS INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Return Investment - When Shelton Gandy took on his new role as special teams coach during the off season he had his work cut out. The Mean Green finished last season ranked last in the Sun Belt Conference in kickoff returns and kickoff coverage. After nine games, Gandy has his kickoff return team ranked first in the league and his kickoff coverage team ranked fifth. The Mean Green is averaging 23.6 yards per kickoff return – up from 18.1 a year ago. Covering kicks has been an even bigger improvement, with the Mean Green allowing an average of 22.0 yards per return, which is down from 31.0 yards per return for opponents last year. Junior Jamaal Jackson has established himself as one of the best return guys in the league, averaging 30.1 which would lead the Sun Belt Conference if he met the minimum number of attempts.

Nwigwe Out With Injury - All-Conference linebacker Tobe Nwigwe suffered a foot injury against Florida Atlantic that will force him to miss the remainder of his senior season. Nwigwe has led the Sun Belt all season in tackles and currently ranks 14th nationally with his average of 10.3 stops per game, but he will fall off the leaders list when he doesn't meet the required minimum number of games played after this week. He was on pace to break his personal best of 111 tackles that he had last season.

Robertson Leading the Way - With the departure of Nwigwe, junior Craig Robertson has been the leader of the Mean Green defense. Robertson leads the team and ranks third in the Sun Belt in tackles with an average of 9.2 per game (83 total). He posted a career-high with 12 in the season-opener against Ball State and has been consistent with at least eight in every game, including 11 last week against ULM. He is on pace to set a career-high in total tackles for the season, which he set last year with 94.

Coming of Age -North Texas still has a very young defensive secondary, with all four starters either in their first or second year with the Mean Green. Sophomores Royce Hill and DaWaylon Cook are starters at cornerback and safety after playing extensively as true freshmen last season. Adryan Adams transferred to North Texas last year, but is in his first year as a full-time starter at cornerback. Fellow transfer Ira Smith is in his first year at North Texas and is the other starter at safety. The foursome has held up admirably in eight games - they rank fourth in the Sun Belt Conference in pass defense efficiency with a rating of 131.7, which is dramatically better than last year when the defensive backfield allowed opponents an efficiency rating of 164.8.

Cook Coming On - Sophomore safety DaWaylon Cook is feeling comfortable in his second year and his new position. As a true freshman last year, Cook was a backup cornerback and totaled 10 tackles in 11 games. After a year of experience and an offseason move to safety, Cook has become a leader in the secondary. After one tackle in the season opener, Cook has averaged 8.0 tackles in the last eight games, including a career-best 11 against Alabama. He is second on the team with 63 tackles and 50 of those are solo stops.

Weighty Up Front - One of the biggest areas, literally, that North Texas addressed in the offseason was the defensive line. The Mean Green brought in six new players to help the defensive line and added a lot of size. Transfers Kelvin Jackson and Shavod Atkinson are the regular starters at defensive tackle, weighing in at 309 and 307 pounds respectively. John Weber is also a transfer who can play both tackle and end and weighs 288 pounds. True freshman defensive tackle Kyle White, who tips the scales at 309 pounds, saw his first action against Alabama. Add 301-pound redshirt freshman Tevinn Cantly to give you the fourth interior defensive lineman that are all playing this year. Last year North Texas didn't play any defensive lineman that weighed 300 pounds or more.

Return Drought Continues - It has been 130 games and counting since North Texas has returned a kickoff for a touchdown. Broderick McGrew was the last Mean Green player to do so when he took a kickoff and returned it 100 yards in a 28-27 loss to Utah State on Nov. 14, 1998. North Texas' current active streak ranks as the 10th-longest in the nation - led by Air Force, which hasn't brought a kick back for a score in 284 games.

HEAD COACH TODD DODGE

Todd Dodge understands. The North Texas head football coach understands that he was

hired to turn around a program that had slumped. He understands that, as he enters his third year, the pace of improvement has not come at the rate that many Mean Green fans had hoped for. But he has not wavered from his plan and the only pressure to hasten the timeline for progress comes from within his own uncompromising commitment to success. Dodge understands his role in the development of the North Texas football program and he is fully invested.

In two years at the helm, Dodge has tried to establish a foundation that would lead to victory. The baseline of success on the field has been set and now Dodge believes he has the pieces in place to show that his work has not been futile. He has quietly assembled a team of coaches and players that he believes can thrive in his system. It has been a two-year process of molding young men and tweaking a staff that will serve as the groundwork for developing his program.



On the field, Dodge's influence has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. Dodge is now at least partially responsible for three of North Texas' top 10 total offensive performances, with 4,901 as a head coach in 2007 and 4,031 as an assistant coach in 1993 added to last year's performance.

One of the best success stories during the Dodge era will always be of wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald. Fitzgerald came to North Texas as a walk-on and spent his first two seasons in obscurity while seeing little action in a run-based offense. In his first year of Dodge's

offense, Fitzgerald broke every North Texas singleseason receiving record and after just two years in his system, he is now the school's all-time leading receiver with 229 career catches (224 in his final two years under Dodge).



Dodge, 45, officially assumed control of the North Texas football program on Dec. 26, 2006 - three days after he had coached his Southlake Carroll High School football team to its fourth state championship in five years. As one of the most widely respected high school football coaches in the nation, Dodge led Southlake Carroll to a 79-1 record over his final five years, with the only loss coming by a single point in the 2003 state championship game. Dodge closed his high school career with an amazing 48-game winning streak.

Dodge had already been familiar with the Mean Green, having served as an offensive assistant coach

in 1992 and 1993. During his tenure he helped direct the Mean Green offense to a per-game average of 348 yards and 26 points. He oversaw the progression of quarterback Mitch Maher, who holds numerous Mean Green offensive records, including pass completions, passing yards, and total offense. Maher went on to play for the Canadian Football Leagues' Shreveport Pirates.

Prior to coming to North Texas, Dodge's name had become synonymous with high school football success on the national scale. In addition to winning four class 5A state championships in five years, Southlake Carroll was recognized as national champions by USA Today in 2004 and 2006, and by PrepNation.com in 2005. Dodge amassed a 98-11 record overall at Carroll after taking over in 2000. In 2005, the Dragons set the Texas 5A state record for most points in a single season by tallying 764.

Dodge was named National Coach of the Year by Schutt Sports in 2004 and by USA Today in 2005. In 2006 PrepNation.com named him the Southwest Region coach of the year.





MUNCIE, Ind. (9/3/09) - The North Texas football team left the '08 season in the rear view mirror, downing Ball State 20-10 in the season opener on Thursday night.

The Mean Green (1-0) won just its second season opener since 1997, and its first non-conference road game since 1999, with a gritty performance in front of 16,054 fans at Scheumann Stadium and a national TV audience on ESPNU. The win snapped the Cardinals (0-1) 14-game regular season winning streak that dated back to Nov. of 2007.

Needing to respond to a Ball State fourth-quarter game-tying touch-



down, the Mean Green did just that. On the ensuing drive, Riley Dodge hooked up with Jamaal Jackson for 59 yards to take NT down to the one. Two plays later Dodge found Michael Outlaw in the corner of the end zone to put North Texas up 17-10.

Dodge made the most of his first collegiate action by completing his first 11 passes. The redshirt freshman drove the Mean Green 55 yards before Lance Dunbar punched into the end zone on a three yard dive to open the scoring on their first possession.

He was aided by a potent running game led by Cam Montgomery, who broke lose for 149 yards on 8.8 yards per carry. North Texas piled up 296 rushing yards and racked up 512 total yards.

The defense pitched a first half shutout thanks to third-down stops and a key turnover. Just inside the second quarter Royce Hill jumped in front of a Kelly Page pass on the six yard line and returned it to the house.





TUSCALOOSA, Ala. (9/19/09) - The North Texas football team couldn't keep up with the Crimson Tide, falling to No. 4 Alabama 53-7 on Saturday.

Alabama (3-0) struck early and often, rolling up 523 yards of total offense and scores on nine of their 11 drives. The Crimson Tide defense was as good as advertised, holding the Mean Green (1-2) to 187 total yards and just 61 rushing yards.

Quarterback Nathan Tune led the Mean Green on a smooth scoring drive late in the third. The junior hooked up with Michael Outlaw

for 32 yards on an improvised roll out, and found Lance Dunbar just two plays later in the left flat. Dunbar rocketed 34 yards untouched into the endzone.

The touchdown pass was the first in Tune's career, and capped off a 5-play, 78-yard drive. Tune was efficient against the Crimson Tide, completing 16-of-23 attempts for 126 yards and a score.

The North Texas defense made things interesting out of the gate. On the game's opening play, Sam Owusu-Hemeng's speed rush fired him around the Crimson

Tide left tackle and into quarterback Greg McElroy, who coughed up the football. Brandon Akpunku scooped it up for the Mean Green, leaving the crowd of 92.012 stunned.




