THE PARTICULARS

North Texas closes out the 2009 season on the road with a visit to Arkansas State. There is no television for the contest but the game can be heard on the Mean Green Radio Network. Kickoff is set for 2:05 p.m.

THE PRINCIPALS

North Texas is looking to bounce back from another close loss, this one to Army by four points. The Red Wolves are struggling as well having dropped four straight games. North Texas is going after its second road win of the season while Arkansas State is 2-2 at home this season.

THE SERIES

Arkansas State leads the series with North Texas 10-8. It has been a streaky series of late as the Red Wolves have won four straight games against the Mean Green. Before that North Texas had won four straight games until the Red Wolves began their recent run with a win in 2005. Last season Arkansas State held on to win 33-28 in Denton and the year before in 2007 Arkansas State scored a touchdown to win with two seconds left 31-27.

NEXT GAME

The Mean Green's 2009 regular season is complete while Arkansas State has one final game at Western Kentucky next Thursday to close out the year.

A Closer Look at Arkansas State

Head Coach Steve Roberts - He is in his eighth year at Arkansas State and has led the Red Wolves since 2002. In 2005 he was named the Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year and led his team to the 2005 New Orleans Bowl. Before arriving in Jonesboro, Roberts spent two seasons at Northwestern State and led the Demons to 11 wins, including a victory over TCU. He has over 15 seasons under his belt as a head coach and 13 of those have been spent in the state of Arkansas

The Matchup – Both teams enter the game looking to end losing streaks as North Texas has dropped three straight and Arkansas State has lost four in a row. The Mean Green continues to lead the Sun Belt Conference in rushing at 189 yards a game while Arkansas State is second in the league at stopping the run. The Red Wolves have struggled on offense as they rank seventh in the league in scoring and eighth in total offense. Lance Dunbar leads the league in rushing at just over 113 yards a game while Reggie Arnold is seventh at 56.5 yards a game. Jamaal Jackson is tops in the Sun Belt in receptions per game at 6.0 a contest. Freshman Ryan Alpin has started the last two games at quarterback for Arkansas State while senior quarterback Corey Leonard is still eighth in the Sun Belt in total offense.

Media Information Post-Game Interviews

The North Texas locker room is closed to all members of the media. Head coach Todd Dodge and requested players will be available for interviews following a brief cooling off period. Postgame interviews at Fouts Field will be held in the media interview room below the east stands.

Credentials For Media

Those wishing to cover North Texas must contact Eric Capper or Steven Bartolotta for credentials for home and away games. Seating is very limited at Fouts Field and requests for North Texas home games need to be made at least one week prior to the contest.

Media Availability for Players

All player interviews will be conduted following the teams practice on Tuesday afternoon at the Athetic Center. Requests for players should be made in advance through the sports information office. No interviews will be granted on Monday or Wednesday post practice. Special exemptions may be granted to those media wishing to interview a specific student-athlete before parctice at the discretion of the media relations office.

Sun Belt Teleconference

The Sun Belt Conference will conduct a weekly teleconference with each of the eight head coaches each Monday throughout the season. Coach Dodge will be on the call from 11:08-11:14 a.m. each week.

Post-Practice

Dodge will be available to media immediately following Tuesday's practice at the Darrell Dickey Practice Facility. Requests should be made in advance of practice to the media relations office.

Out of Town Media

Dodge and his assistant coaches are also available by request to out-of-town media Monday through Wednesday from 11 a.m.-12 noon. Contact the media relations office to arrange these requests.

Practice Coverage

Media has limited access to North Texas football practice. Viewing is available outside the fence of the practice facility. Video and still photography can be shot during the first 30 minutes of practice. Players and coaches are available for interviews following practice on Tuesday. All requests for interviews must be made in advance through the athletic media relations office.

Senior Salute - This will be the final collegiate game for 12 North Texas seniors, although three will miss this final opportunity with injury. Cornerbacks Adryan Adams and Antione Bush, defensive end Mack Cole, wide receiver Kevin Dickerson, defensive end Eddrick Gilmore, linebacker Kylee Hill, offensive lineman Gabe Hollivay, kicker Jeremy Knott, running back Cam Montgomery, linebacker Tobe Nwigwe and deep snapper Christian Davidson will all close out their North Texas career Saturday. Davidson, Hill and Nwigwe will not make the trip to Jonesboro after suffering season-ending injuries earlier in the year.

Quick Hitters on Arkansas State Matchup - North Texas will face a very stingy defense at Arkansas State, as the Red Wolves lead the Sun Belt Conference in scoring defense allowing 23.3 points per game... North Texas leads the Sun Belt in rushing with an average of 189.4 yards per game. Arkansas State ranks second in the conference in rushing defense, allowing an average of 122.1 yards per game...Arkansas State kickoffs should be interesting as the Red Wolves lead the league in kickoff coverage (16.0 yards per return) and North Texas leads the league in kickoff returns (22.6 yards per return)... The Red Wolves lead the Sun Belt in red zone defense, allowing opponents to score just 71 percent of the time from inside their 20-yard line... In SBC games, Arkansas State is last in the conference in scoring, averaging 19.0 points per game. North Texas ranks eighth in scoring defense, allowing 40.9 points per game... In conference games only, Arkansas State ranks last in total offense (300.2 yards per game) and last in rushing offense (108.7 yards per game)... North Texas is -11 in turnover margin in conference games, gaining six and losing 17... Arkansas State ranks last in the conference in third down conversion percentage in conference games (28.0).

Record Setting Offense - North Texas eclipsed the 4,000-yard mark in total offense for the third straight season, which is the first time that has ever happened in the 94-year history of North Texas football. The Mean Green had a school-record 4,901 yards of total offense in 2007 and followed that with 4,356 yards last season. With one game remaining, North Texas has 4,636 yards and is on pace to have a record-breaking 5,058. Only three times in school history has North Texas had back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense with the other years coming in 1993-94 and 2003-04.

Second Quarter Quandary - North Texas seems to be facing a second quarter slump... but oddly enough, it is only at home. In six home games, North Texas allowed more points (87), and scored less (27) in the second quarter than any other quarter. The 60-point deficit in the second quarter at Fouts Field is more amazing when you consider the Mean Green has either equaled or surpassed its opponent's scoring in every other quarter. In five road games, North Texas has scored more than twice as many points in the second quarter (45) than any other quarter (24 in the first). Below is a look at the scoring difference by quarter in home and away games.

Long Scoring Plays - North Texas has been able to break some long scoring plays this year, including a 68-yard touchdown run by sophomore running back Lance Dunbar last week against Army. There have been a total of 11 touchdown plays of longer than 30 yards this season and nine of those have come in the last seven games. All six of the touchdown plays over 50 yards have come in the last seven games. Dunbar is responsible for eight of the 11 long touchdown plays while junior wide receiver Jamaal Jackson is responsible for two and freshman quarterback Riley Dodge has one. In comparison, in all 12 games last year, North Texas had only five touchdown plays of longer than 30 yards and only one that carried more than 50 yards.

Big Plays in General - The Mean Green has really improved its big-play potential in general this year. In 12 games last year, North Texas had a total of 11 plays from scrimmage that went for 30 yards or more. In 11 games this year, North Texas already has 32 plays that have carried at least 30 yards. Of the 32 plays that have gone 30 yards or more this year, 10 have been rushes. Last year North Texas only had three rushes for over 30 yards.

Quick Scoring Drives - Going hand-in-hand with big plays for the North Texas offense is quick scoring drives. The Mean Green has had 35 touchdown drives this year and the average scoring drive has lasted just 6.2 plays, covering 66.3 yards in just 2:39 of game clock. With 15 touchdown drives this year coming in less than two minutes, there are only 17 FBS teams have more TD drives that quickly. Last season North Texas only had seven touchdown drives in less than two minutes.

Breaking it Down - Most of North Texas' long rushing plays have come on first and second down this season. Of the 38 rushing plays that have gone for 11 yards or more, 35 have come on first and second down. There have been a total of 20 rushing plays that have gone over 20 yards for the Mean Green this season and 19 of those have come on first and second down.

Avoiding Three-and-Out - The Mean Green offense has been fairly successful at avoiding three-and-out series this series' this year. North Texas has 27 possessions where the offense had just three plays and was forced to punt, which is an average of 2.5 per game. That ranks as the 14th-best average among Football Bowl Subdivision teams - led by Idaho which averages just 1.2 three-and-out possession per game. No other Sun Belt Conference team has a better average than the Mean Green. North Texas had a season-high seven three-and-out possessions against Alabama and a season-low zero against Florida Atlantic.

Down and Distance Disparity - There has been an inverse relationship between down and distance and quarterback Riley Dodge's completion percentage this season. On second and third down with short yardage to gain for a first down (three yards or less), Dodge has completed 63 percent of his passes (17-of-27). Facing a long distance to gain for a first down (seven or more yards) Dodge has completed 65 percent of his passes (69-of-105). He is most accurate when the distance to gain is in the middle (4-6 yards) where he has completed 71 percent of his passes (32-of-42).

Conversion Success Rate - Staying ahead of the chains is a big factor in the success of the North Texas offense this season. When North Texas is faced with second down and four yards or less to gain, it has converted a first down 72 percent of the time (46-of-64). When it is faced with second down and five yards or more, it has converted a first down 24 percent of the time (49-of-203). On third down and four yards or less, the Mean Green is successful 67 percent of the time (43-of-64). On third and five or more yards to gain, North Texas is just is successful in converting a first down just 27 percent of the time (24-of-88).

Outgaining Opponents - Despite a 2-9 record, North Texas has outgained seven of its 11 opponents in total offense. In games against Ball State (512-309), Ohio (301-232), Middle Tennessee (470-456), Louisiana-Lafayette (444-295), Western Kentucky (583-425), Florida International (513-258) and Army (447-287) the Mean Green has averaged 467 yards of offense while the opponents have averaged 323 for a difference of 144 yard per game. Since Dodge took over at North Texas in 2007, North Texas is 3-13 when outgaining its opponent in total offense. Last season North Texas lost the only two games when it outgained its opponents (Florida International and Louisiana-Monroe).

Holding Leads - In four of its nine losses this year, North Texas has been unable to protect a double-digit lead. The Mean Green was up 17-6 over Ohio in the third quarter before the Bobcats scored two unanswered touchdowns to take a 20-17 fourth-quarter lead in a game Ohio eventually won in double overtime. Against Louisiana-Lafayette, North Texas led 34-24 early in the fourth quarter but was outscored 14-0 in the last 9:30 of the game to lose 38-34. Against Florida Atlantic, North Texas held a 13-point first half lead, but the Mean Green allowed 23 unanswered points and eventually lost by four, 44-40. Lastly, against Florida International, North Texas was up 28-14 midway through the third quarter before allowing 21 unanswered points to lose 35-28.

No Sack Attack - The North Texas offensive line has done a good job protecting the quarterback, allowing just 11 sacks in as many games. The Mean Green ranks 11th in the nation and first in the Sun Belt Conference with an average of just 1.0 sack allowed per game. When you look at the ratio of the number of passes attempted per sacks allowed, North Texas ranks sixth in the nation with an average of 35.0 passing attempts for each sack allowed.

Holding Leads Part II - Perhaps more frustrating than losing big leads is losing late leads. In five of its nine losses this year, North Texas has held a fourth-quarter lead, only to see the Mean Green snatch defeat from the jaws of victory. Against Ohio, North Texas led 17-13 until midway through the fourth quarter in a game it lost 31-30 in double overtime. At Louisiana-Lafayette, North Texas was up 34-24 in the fourth before surrendering 14 unanswered points. Against Florida Atlantic, the Mean Green led 40-37 until the five-minute mark when the Owls scored the game-winning touchdown. At Florida International the Mean Green was up 28-21 midway through the fourth, but again gave up 14 unanswered points to lose 35-28. Lastly, against Army last week, North Texas led 13-10 until the Black Knights scored a game winning touchdown with under two minutes to play in the game.

Damaging Turnovers - Turnovers have made a huge difference in the end result of four games for North Texas this season. In losses to Ohio, Louisiana-Lafayette, Florida Atlantic and Florida International the Mean Green combined to commit 12 turnovers, while only gaining four. Those four opponents scored on nine of the 12 possessions that resulted from a North Texas turnover. Also in those four games, North Texas threw three interceptions that were returned for touchdowns. Below is a look at the opponent points off turnovers in those four games:

Pick Six Costly - North Texas has thrown three interceptions this season that have been returned for costly touchdowns. Against Ohio, backup quarterback Nathan Tune threw an interception that was returned 69-yards for a score in a game that went to overtime where the Mean Green fell 31-30. At Louisiana-Lafayette, freshman Riley Dodge threw a pick that was returned 70 yards for a score in a game that the Mean Green lost 38-34. Finally, against Florida International with North Texas holding a 14-point second-half lead, Dodge threw a pick six that was the difference in the final score 35-28.

Red Zone Defense - The North Texas defense will be trying to improve its red zone defense this week. The Mean Green has allowed 40 scores on 44 possessions inside the red zone by opponents for a success rate of 91 percent, which ranks 114th nationally. Two of the opponents four failed trips inside the Mean Green two came in the first game of the season, making opponents in the last 10 games 39-of-41 (95 percent). Of the four failed scoring efforts by opponents, two have been missed field goals, one was an interception and one was a fumble. Also concerning is the number of touchdowns allowed from inside the 20-yard line. Of the 40 red zone scores by opponents, 32 have been touchdowns (80 percent).

Fourth Down Unfriendly - North Texas ranks last in the Sun Belt Conference and 114th nationally in fourth down conversion percentage, completing just 18.2 percent of its tries. The Mean Green has converted just 2-of-11 fourth down attempts this season, one coming against Louisiana-Lafayette and one coming against Florida International.

Big Plays Coming from Youngsters - In 11 games, North Texas has 32 plays that have covered 30 yards or more, including 10 rushing plays, 12 passing plays, nine kick returns and one interception return and one punt return. All 32 of those plays have come from underclassmen, including 12 by sophomore running back Lance Dunbar and eight by junior receiver Jamaal Jackson.

Balanced Attack - Mean Green head coach Todd Dodge has always said that his offense has a better chance at being successful if it is balanced between rushing and passing production. After 11 games, North Texas has 2,083 yards rushing and 2,553 yards passing which is a 45 to 55 percent balance. Last season, rushing accounted for 35 percent of the total offense while passing accounted for 65 percent.

What a Rush - The North Texas rushing attack this season is more productive than it has been in some time. North Texas leads the Sun Belt Conference and ranks 26th nationally with an average of 189.4 yards per game on the ground. The 2,083 rushing yards is already more than the Mean Green had in any of the last four seasons. With one game remaining, North Texas is on pace to have 2,273, which would be the sixth-highest single-season total in school history. Behind super sophomore Lance Dunbar, North Texas has had five games where it has rushed for over 200 yards per game, which is more than the Mean Green had in the previous four years combined (four). The Mean Green had exactly one 200-yard rushing game in each of the four years 2005-08. Last year, the best team rushing effort was 203 yards – a total that has been topped five times this year. The last time a North Texas offense had this many 200-yard rushing games in a season was in 2004 when it had seven behind the efforts of freshman Jamario Thomas.

A New Home For The Mean Green - North Texas has called Fouts Field home since 1952, but those days are nearing an end. In 2011 the Mean Green will move into a new stadium located on-campus. Construction is set to begin on the stadium in January of 2010 and the stadium will have a capacity of 30,000 with the ability for future expansion to raise the total to 50,000. North Texas partnered with HKS to build the stadium - the same company that designed the American Airlines Center in Dallas and the new Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas.

Big Guys With Experience - While the Mean Green battled inexperience and youth in 2008, the 2009 North Texas offensive line is about as battled tested as you could want. The starting five have combined for a total of 122 career starts. The good thing about the group of Santiago (32 career starts), Bailey (24 career starts), Johnson (23 career starts), Drake (22 career starts), and Gill (21 career starts) is that only one is a senior (Bailey). In fact of the 10 offensive linemen in the two deep, only two are seniors, while four are juniors, three are sophomores and there is one freshman.

A Good Distributor - One of the areas that Coach Todd Dodge has emphasized this year is getting the ball in the hands of as many different people as possible. The last two seasons, wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald led the nation in receptions with over 110 each year. This year Dodge would like those receptions to be divided between two or even three receivers. So far, the plan is working, with three different wide receivers having over 40 catches. Last season after 11 games, only one receiver (Fitzgerald) had more than 40 catches. In all, 14 different receivers have made at least one catch for the Mean Green this season.

Coaches Up/Coaches Down - North Texas will put three assistant coaches in the press box during games and will have six assistants along with head coach Todd Dodge on the sideline. In the press box will be offensive coordinator Todd Ford, along with defensive coordinator Gary DeLoach. Cornerbacks coach Carlton Buckels and safeties coach Chuck Peterson will join DeLoach in the press box. Linebackers coach David Rausch and defensive line coach Mike Nelson will be on the sidelines. Wide Receiver coach Clayton George and offensive line coach Spencer Leftwich will be on the sidelines along with special teams/running backs coach Shelton Gandy. Graduate assistant coaches Brian Morgan and Kevin Barbay will also be in the press box.

Well Represented in the NFL - North Texas has had more players drafted to play professional football than any other team in the Sun Belt Conference. Since the first NFL draft in 1936, North Texas has had 77 players drafted, including seven players picked in the first round. Arkansas State is second among Sun Belt Schools which have had players drafted with 46. Joe Greene is the highest drafted player ever from North Texas when he was selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers with the fourth overall pick in 1969.

TV Time - North Texas is scheduled to play on television eight times in 2009. The Mean Green will be shown in the Dallas/Fort Worth market on KTXA 21 for the Ohio and Army games as part of two-game deal with the station. The season opener at Ball State was played before a national audience on ESPNU and the game at Alabama was shown across the SEC Regional Network. The game at Louisiana-Lafayette and two home games with Florida Atlantic and Western Kentucky are being shown as part of the Sun Belt Conference package. The game at Troy was broadcast by the Troy ISP Network. KTXA 21 also aired the North Texas games that were broadcast as part of the Sun Belt package.

Charr-ging Them Up - One of the new additions to North Texas this offseason was that of a strength and conditioning coach for football. Aaron Ausmus started the program in January before leaving to take the same position at Tennessee. Todd Dodge then turned to Charr Gahagan to replace Ausmus. Gahagan was at the University of Washington and spent eight seasons at USC before that. He was a three-time national champion in powerlifting while at Louisiana Tech. The results have been noticeable. Defensive lineman Eddrick Gilmore put on 29 pounds in the offseason, going from 240 to 269 in the new program. Offensive lineman Nate Jenkins went from 379 down to 349 pounds this season.

Did You Know - North Texas has its share of players on the roster that have great genes of their own but some have even better bloodlines. Wide receiver Alex Lott is the son of former Oklahoma All Big 8 quarterback Thomas Lott. His older brother just finished up his college career at Rice. Freshman wide receiver Desmond Brigham is the nephew of current Arizona Cardinals wide receiver Jamaica Rector. And if that wasn't enough freshman defensive back Jeremy Phillips is the younger brother of Jason Phillips, last season's Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year for TCU and current Baltimore Raven linebacker.

Following In Footsteps - North Texas head coach Todd Dodge is one of only 56 known major college head coaches who have had the rare opportunity to coach his son in college. There are only three other current sets of father-and-son duos on Football Bowl Subdivision teams, Dan and Cody Hawkins at Colorado, Ricky and Brad Bustle at Louisiana-Lafayette and Steve and Scott Spurrier at South Carolina. Todd and Riley make only the 22nd father-and-son, quarter back-and-coach tandem in FBS history.

Youthful Exuberance - Some of the struggle this year for North Texas can possibly contributed to youth. In this week's projected starting lineup, the Mean Green has just one senior on offense (guard Tyler Bailey) and two seniors on defense (end Eddrick Gilmore and cornerback Adryan Adams). Eight of the 22 starters on offense and defense are either freshmen or sophomores. Of the 60 players who traveled to Florida International last week, 17 were freshmen, 15 were sophomores, 17 were juniors and only 11 were seniors.

Lack of Senioritis - The North Texas roster has only 12 seniors for the 2009 season. Only six teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision have fewer seniors on their roster than North Texas, and only three of those teams (Boise State, Miami (OH), and Idaho) are non-BCS teams. Record Enrollment - The University of North Texas marked its ninth consecutive year of record-breaking student population when the fall 2009 enrollment was announced at 36,206. This year's numbers reflect the largest single-year increase since 2002 and continue to secure North Texas as the fourth-largest university in the state of Texas.

One Overtime Not Enough - North Texas has played in just two overtime games since the NCAA introduced the format in 1996. The Mean Green is 1-1 in its two overtime games, defeating Florida International 25-22 in seven overtimes in 2006 and losing to Ohio 31-30 in two overtimes this year. The Mean Green is the only FBS team that has never had a game decided in the first overtime period.

MEAN GREEN OFFENSIVE INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Dunbar Climbing Single-Season List - Sophomore running back Lance Dunbar is just the ninth player in North Texas history to rush for over 1,000 yards in a season and currently ranks fifth on the single-season rushing leaders list with 1,252 yards. He ranks 14th nationally with 113.8 yards per game and his 16 rushing touchdowns ranks fourth among all FBS running backs. He needs just 46 yards to move into the top four on the single-season list. At his current pace of 113 yards per game he would finish fourth behind only Jamario Thomas (1,801 in 2004), Patrick Cobbs (1,680 in 2003) and Bernard Jackson (1,453 in 1978).

Getting it Dun - Sophomore running back Lance Dunbar has exploded onto the scene since becoming the featured back when he came off the bench to replace starter Cam Montgomery in week four against Middle Tennessee. He has rushed for over 100 yards in six of his seven starts and is one of only four backs in the nation to have more than one 200-yard rushing game. Along with becoming the regular starter at running back, he has established himself as one of the top backs in the nation. Dunbar has 16 of the team's 25 rushing touchdowns and is averaging a league-best 146.1 yards per game against conference opponents. His average of 7.0 yards per carry ranks third in the NCAA among backs with at least 150 attempts. Below is a look at Dunbar's numbers in the first three games compared to the last four games:

Lofty Comparisons - With the emergence of Lance Dunbar this year, he has drawn comparisons with another former young North Texas running back. As a freshman in 2004, Jamario Thomas didn't earn his first start until the third game of the season and went on to lead the nation in rushing with an average of 180.1yards per game. In his first six starts, Thomas rushed for 1,216 yards for an average of 202.7 per game with 11 touchdowns. Dunbar did not earn his first start until the fifth game this year and in his first seven starts he has rushed for 1,054 yards for an average of 150.6 yards per game and 13 touchdowns.

Dodging Bullets - Redshirt freshman Riley Dodge has started nine games as a college quarterback. While he has had his share of first-year struggles, his numbers stack up very well with other former Mean Green freshman quarterbacks. In nine games, Dodge has a completion percentage of 68.0 and a pass efficiency rating of 124.1. Here is a look at how some other Mean Green quarterbacks did in their freshman year:

First Year Receivers - The top three receivers for North Texas this season are all in their first year with the Mean Green. Transfer Jamaal Jackson leads the team in receptions (66), receiving yards (632) and receiving touchdowns (5). True freshman Darius Carey is second on the team in both receptions (55) and receiving yards (510). Transfer Michael Outlaw is third in receptions (41) and receiving yards (473).

Money on the Line - As a group, the offensive line has helped the North Texas offense rank very high this year. The unit ranks 11th in the nation in sacks allowed with just 11, and is one of only five teams nationally to rank in the top 15 in sacks allowed as well as the top 30 in both rushing total offense. The trio of juniors Kelvin Drake, Victor Gill and Esteban Santiago are the leaders and have consistently graded out as the best of the unit. In all, eight different offensive linemen have played in the eight games.

MEAN GREEN DEFENSIVE/SPECIAL TEAMS INDIVIDUAL NOTES

Return Investment - When Shelton Gandy took on his new role as special teams coach during the off season he had his work cut out. The Mean Green finished last season ranked last in the Sun Belt Conference in kickoff returns and kickoff coverage. This season, Gandy has his kickoff return team ranked first in the league and his kickoff coverage team ranked fifth. The Mean Green is averaging 22.6 yards per kickoff return – up from 18.1 a year ago. Covering kicks has been an even bigger improvement, with the Mean Green allowing an average of 18.6 yards per return, which is down from 31.0 yards per return for opponents last year. Junior Jamaal Jackson has established himself as one of the best return guys in the league, averaging 28.1 which would lead the Sun Belt Conference if he met the minimum number of attempts.

Nwigwe Out With Injury - All-Conference linebacker Tobe Nwigwe suffered a foot injury against Florida Atlantic that will force him to miss the remainder of his senior season. Nwigwe had led the Sun Belt all season in tackles and would currently rank 14th nationally with his average of 10.3 stops per game, but does not meet the minimum number of games played since missing the last five. He was on pace to break his personal best of 111 tackles that he had last season.

Robertson Leading the Way - With the departure of Nwigwe, junior Craig Robertson has been the leader of the Mean Green defense. Robertson leads the team and ranks fifth in the Sun Belt in tackles with an average of 8.5 per game (94 total). He posted a career-high with 12 in the season-opener against Ball State and has led the team in tackles in five of the 11 games. With one game remaining he has already tied his career-high in total tackles for the season with 94.

Coming of Age - North Texas still has a very young defensive secondary, with all four starters either in their first or second year with the Mean Green. Sophomores Royce Hill and DaWaylon Cook are starters at cornerback and safety after playing extensively as true freshmen last season. Adryan Adams transferred to North Texas last year, but is in his first year as a full-time starter at cornerback. Fellow transfer Ira Smith is in his first year at North Texas and is the other starter at safety. The foursome has held up admirably in 11 games - they rank second in the Sun Belt Conference in pass defense (214.6 yards per game) and third in pass defense efficiency (129.6 rating), which is dramatically better than last year when the defensive backfield finished dead last in the conference in both categories (275.5 yards per game and 164.4 pass defense efficiency rating).

Cook Coming On - Sophomore safety DaWaylon Cook is feeling comfortable in his second year and his new position. As a true freshman last year, Cook was a backup cornerback and totaled 10 tackles in 11 games. After a year of experience and an offseason move to safety, Cook has become a leader in the secondary. After one tackle in the season opener, Cook has averaged 7.6 tackles in the last 10 games, including a career-best 11 against Alabama. He is second on the team with a career-high 72 tackles and 57 of those are solo stops.

Weighty Up Front - One of the biggest areas, literally, that North Texas addressed in the offseason was the defensive line. The Mean Green brought in six new players to help the defensive line and added a lot of size. Transfers Kelvin Jackson and Shavod Atkinson are the regular starters at defensive tackle, weighing in at 309 and 307 pounds respectively. True freshman defensive tackle Kyle White, who tips the scales at 309 pounds, saw his first action against Alabama. Add 301-pound redshirt freshman Tevinn Cantly to give you the fourth interior defensive lineman that are all playing this year. Last year North Texas didn't play any defensive lineman that weighed 300 pounds or more.

Return Drought Continues - It has been 132 games and counting since North Texas has returned a kickoff for a touchdown. Broderick McGrew was the last Mean Green player to do so when he took a kickoff and returned it 100 yards in a 28-27 loss to Utah State on Nov. 14, 1998. North Texas' current active streak ranks as the ninth-longest in the nation - led by Air Force, which hasn't brought a kick back for a score in 297 games.

HEAD COACH TODD DODGE

Todd Dodge understands. The North Texas head football coach understands that he was


hired to turn around a program that had slumped. He understands that, as he enters his third year, the pace of improvement has not come at the rate that many Mean Green fans had hoped for. But he has not wavered from his plan and the only pressure to hasten the timeline for progress comes from within his own uncompromising commitment to success. Dodge understands his role in the development of the North Texas football program and he is fully invested.

In two years at the helm, Dodge has tried to establish a foundation that would lead to victory. The baseline of success on the field has been set and now Dodge believes he has the pieces in place to show that his work has not been futile. He has quietly assembled a team of coaches and players that he believes can thrive in his system. It has been a two-year process of molding young men and tweaking a staff that will serve as the groundwork for developing his program.



On the field, Dodge's influence has helped the Mean Green to back-to-back years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. It is only the third time in school history that North Texas had consecutive years with over 4,000 yards of total offense. The 4,356 yards of offense in 2008 is the fifth-highest total in school history. Dodge is now at least partially responsible for three of North Texas' top 10 total offensive performances, with 4,901 as a head coach in 2007 and 4,031 as an assistant coach in 1993 added to last year's performance.

One of the best success stories during the Dodge era will always be of wide receiver Casey Fitzgerald. Fitzgerald came to North Texas as a walk-on and spent his first two seasons in obscurity while seeing little action in a run-based offense. In his first year of Dodge's





Dodge, 45, officially assumed control of the North Texas football program on Dec. 26, 2006 - three days after he had coached his Southlake Carroll High School football team to its fourth state championship in five years. As one of the most widely respected high school football coaches in the nation, Dodge led Southlake Carroll to a 79-1 record over his final five years, with the only loss coming by a single point in the 2003 state championship game. Dodge closed his high school career with an amazing 48-game winning streak.

Dodge had already been familiar with the Mean Green, having served as an offensive assistant coach

in 1992 and 1993. During his tenure he helped direct the Mean Green offense to a per-game average of 348 yards and 26 points. He oversaw the progression of quarterback Mitch Maher, who holds numerous Mean Green offensive records, including pass completions, passing yards, and total offense. Maher went on to play for the Canadian Football Leagues' Shreveport Pirates.

Prior to coming to North Texas, Dodge's name had become synonymous with high school football success on the national scale. In addition to winning four class 5A state championships in five years, Southlake Carroll was recognized as national champions by USA Today in 2004 and 2006, and by PrepNation.com in 2005. Dodge amassed a 98-11 record overall at Carroll after taking over in 2000. In 2005, the Dragons set the Texas 5A state record for most points in a single season by tallying 764.

Dodge was named National Coach of the Year by Schutt Sports in 2004 and by USA Today in 2005. In 2006 PrepNation.com named him the Southwest Region coach of the year.

MUNCIE, Ind. (9/3/09) - The North Texas football team left the '08 season in the rear view mirror, downing Ball State 20-10 in the season opener on Thursday night.

The Mean Green (1-0) won just its second season opener since 1997, and its first non-conference road game since 1999, with a gritty performance in front of 16,054 fans at Scheumann Stadium and a national TV audience on ESPNU. The win snapped the Cardinals (0-1) 14-game regular season winning streak that dated back to Nov. of 2007.

Needing to respond to a Ball State fourth-quarter game-tying touch-

down, the Mean Green did just that. On the ensuing drive, Riley Dodge hooked up with Jamaal Jackson for 59 yards to take NT down to the one. Two plays later Dodge found Michael Outlaw in the corner of the end zone to put North Texas up 17-10.

Dodge made the most of his first collegiate action by completing his first 11 passes. The redshirt freshman drove the Mean Green 55 yards before Lance Dunbar punched into the end zone on a three yard dive to open the scoring on their first possession.

He was aided by a potent running game led by Cam Montgomery, who broke lose for 149 yards on 8.8 yards per carry. North Texas piled up 296 rushing yards and racked up 512 total yards.

The defense pitched a first half shutout thanks to third-down stops and a key turnover. Just inside the second quarter Royce Hill jumped in front of a Kelly Page pass on the six yard line and returned it to the house.

Dodge & Co. controlled the edge of the field and the play clock for the entire first half. NT rushed for 160 yards in the half, most coming off left tackle behind captain Victor Gill.

The Mean Green defense held the Cardinals on a lengthy drive midway through the third quarter. Ball State got as far as the 1-yard line before the NT defense forced a short field goal to cut the lead to 10-3.

September 12, 2009 Fouts Field • Denton, Texas

DENTON, Texas (9/12/09) - Ohio connected on a two-point conversion in the second overtime to give the Bobcats a 31-30 victory against North Texas on Saturday night at Fouts Field.

On a rain-soaked field, the Mean Green and the Bobcats both struggled to hold onto the ball. The two teams combined for seven turnovers. Each team threw an interception and both resulted in touchdowns.

North Texas took an early 10-0 advantage, but Ohio pecked away at the lead. The Bobcats took their first lead, 20-17, in the fourth quar-

ter, and North Texas sent it into overtime with a field goal. The two teams exchanged field goals in the first overtime period, and North Texas took the first lead in the second overtime with a touchdown and an extra point.


After North Texas went ahead, 30-23, on a Cam Montgomery touchdown in the second overtime, Theo Scott connected with Taylor Price twice to secure the win. First, Scott hit Price on fourth down from 15 yards out to come within one point of NT, 30-29.

The Bobcats went for the twopoint conversion from the twoyard line after a roughing the passer penalty against North Texas. Scott connected with Price again for the win.

Montgomery rushed for 88 yards on 22 carries in the game. Riley Dodge completed 12 of 20 passes for 117 yards and one touchdown, while Nathan Tune went 9-for-14 for 69 yards. Tune came in the game at the end of the third quarter after Dodge hurt his shoulder and had to come out of the game.

Jeremy Knott tied the game, 20-20, in regulation with an 18-yard field goal with 46 seconds left in the game. The Mean Green had reached the one-yard line off a nine-yard pass from Tune to Montgomery but was unable to get into the endzone on the next two rushes.

Kenny Jackson gave Ohio its first lead of the game, 20-17, with a 69-yard interception return for a touchdown with 8:44 left in the game. It was the first time that North Texas has trailed this season.









TUSCALOOSA, Ala. (9/19/09) - The North Texas football team couldn't keep up with the Crimson Tide, falling to No. 4 Alabama 53-7 on Saturday.

Alabama (3-0) struck early and often, rolling up 523 vards of total offense and scores on nine of their 11 drives. The Crimson Tide defense was as good as advertised, holding the Mean Green (1-2) to 187 total yards and just 61 rushing yards.

Quarterback Nathan Tune led the Mean Green on a smooth scoring drive late in the third. The junior hooked up with Michael Outlaw

> for 32 yards on an improvised roll out, and found Lance Dunbar just two plays later in the left flat. Dunbar rocketed 34 yards untouched into the endzone.

> The touchdown pass was the first in Tune's career, and capped off a 5-play, 78-yard drive. Tune was efficient against the Crimson Tide, completing 16-of-23 attempts for 126 yards and a score.

> The North Texas defense made things interesting out of the gate. On the game's opening play, Sam Owusu-Hemeng's speed rush fired him around the Crimson

Tide left tackle and into quarterback Greg McElroy, who coughed up the football. Brandon Akpunku scooped it up for the Mean Green, leaving the crowd of 92,012 stunned.

Alabama struck first when McElroy, a former Southlake Carroll quarterback under NT head coach Todd Dodge, led the Crimson Tide on a 13-play, 95-yard drive. The junior capped the drive with a two-yard plunge over the right endzone pylon to put Alabama on top 7-0.

McElroy would lead the Crimson Tide on three more touchdown drives, and 352 yards of offense in the opening half alone.

North Texas receiver Darius Carev was the Mean Green's most effective offensive weapon. The freshman caught five passes for 34 yards. James Hamilton found success running the ball late, grinding out 31 yards on seven touches.



Dunbar had a career night. He rushed for 238 yards on 25 carries and scored three times. His long was for 50 yards, coming in the third-quarter comeback. He reached the 100-yard plateau after just 10 carries and 7:41 of game clock. His 238 yards are the most by a North Texas player since Jamario Thomas racked up 291 yards against Idaho on Nov. 13, 2004.

The Mean Green scored three straight times to regain the lead, 40-37, in the fourth quarter for the first time since the first quarter. Carey caught his first touchdown reception of the game in the Mean Green comeback and Dunbar recorded his second and third touchdown runs.

Overall Troy outgained the Mean Green 697-395 in total yards.

In the first quarter Troy took the opening drive 60 yards in six plays and capped it off with a one-yard touchdown run from DuJuan Harris to give the Trojans a 7-0 lead.

Five minutes later it was Harris again, this time scoring on a three-yard run and pushing the Trojans lead to 14-0. It was the first time this season that North Texas had allowed touchdowns on backto-back drives to begin the game.

After a three and out from the Mean Green offense the Trojans would put together a 13-play drive that ended in a 30-yard field goal from Michael Taylor, putting the North Texas offense in a 17-0 hole. The 17 points was the most given up by the Mean Green defense in a first quarter this season.

North Texas would then put together their best drive of the half; a seven play, 75 yard drive that ended with a Dunbar three-yard touchdown making the score 17-7. The score was Dunbar's eighth rushing touchdown in his last three games and his 11th of the season. the 11:47 mark when Tune dropped a screen pass to Dunbar and sophomore took care of the rest, racing 60-yards for the touchdown.

DENTON, Texas (10/31/09) - The North Texas football team defeated WKU, 68-49, tying a school record for most points in a single game, on Saturday afternoon at Fouts Field.

The Mean Green snapped a six-game losing streak to improve to 2-6 overall. NT also broke a 15-game conference losing streak and is now 1-4 in the Sun Belt. This is the Mean Green's first home win since Nov. 24, 2007 against the Hilltoppers.

After tying a school record with 68 points scored last game, the Mean Green was held to six points against ULM. Jeremy Knott scored all the Mean Green's points with two field goals from 30 and 36 yards.

Lance Dunbar carried for 40 yards, putting him at 1,004 for the year. The sophomore is just the ninth player in North Texas history to

rush for over 1,000 yards in a season. Dunbar was held to 14 rushing yards in the first half.

North Texas' offensive output of 268 yards is the second fewest of the season. On the other side, ULM posted 454 total yards of offense. LaGregory Sapp was the offensive leader with seven passes for 187 yards, including two touchdown receptions.

ULM scored on its opening possession and never looked back the rest of the game. Frank Goodin rushed in from the one-yard line for the opening touchdown at 9:29 in the

first quarter and then capped the scoring with a 25-yard touchdown run in the fourth. He finished with 102 yards.

Sapp caught his first touchdown pass near the end of the first half with a 12-yard grab to put ULM ahead, 16-3. At the start of the third quarter, Sapp had an eight-yard reception at the corner of the end zone to make it 23-3. He helped set up the score with a 52-yard catch on the first play of the drive. The wide receiver also had a 46-yard catch at the start of the game.





North Texas had the ball with 1:43 left in the game but quarter-back Riley Dodge's second pass was intercepted to seal the Army win. Dodge threw three interceptions in the game. North Texas committed five turnovers, all of which came inside Army territory.

Dunbar was quiet the first three quarters, but opened the fourth quarter with a 22-yard run. He started NT's second drive of the fourth quarter with a 68-yard touchdown run. He finished the fourth quarter with 110 yards and

rushed for 132 yards in the game.

Dodge completed 31-of-41 passes for 225 yards. He threw one touchdown pass in the first quarter that gave North Texas a 7-0 lead. He moved into fourth place all-time, past Steve Ramsey for passes completed in a season with 202. He also surpassed Joe Milton for 10th place with 1,962 yards passing in a single season. He gained a career-high 90 yards today to move him into fourth place for most yards rushing by a North Texas

As a team, North Texas combined for 447 yards of total offense, compared to Army's 287. The Mean Green took an early 7-0 lead in the first quarter but was shutout in the second and third quarters. Army held a 10-7 lead heading into the fourth quarter.


