QUICK HITTERS

Welcome To Conference USA! - After 13 seasons in the Sun Belt Conference, North Texas will make the jump to Conference USA this fall. C-USA, which is based locally in Irving, features attractive television packages, elevated competition and a host of regional rivalries. In the Sun Belt, NT had only two league opponents within 350 miles of Denton and no other teams from the Lone Star state. C-USA features four schools within that driving radius, as well as three in-state rivals in UTEP, Rice and UTSA. Tulsa, Louisiana Tech and Tulane round out NT's C-USA West Division foes.

New League, Same Results - North Texas has plenty of reasons to be confident about the move to Conference USA. Over the last 10 seasons, the Mean Green is 26-15 (63.4 percent) against its future C-USA rivals, including a perfect combined 6-0 mark against Rice, Tulsa and Charlotte.

Man On A Mission - Tony Mitchell was selected with the 37th overall pick (2nd Round, 7th Pick) by the Detroit Pistons, which made him the highest NBA Draft pick in North Texas history. Mitchell rewrote NT's shot-blocking records with 157 blocks in just 55 games (2.8 per game). A unanimous preseason All-American prior to the 2012-13 season, Mitchell averaged 13.7 points and 9.3 rebounds per game while shooting 49.0 percent from the floor for his career. The Dallas native showed his range with 48 career 3-pointers on 34.0 percent shooting.

Banged Up - Only two teams in the country experienced more injuries in 2012-13 than North Texas. Mean Green players combined to miss 82 collective games due to injury, which trailed only IUPUI and Utah State. NT lost Brandan Walton for the year just one minute into the season opener, and four additional players missed significant time with injuries. North Texas played with just seven scholarship players in multiple games last season.

Instant Veterans - North Texas turned into a veteran team practically overnight with the additions of Vetrail Vaughns (George Mason) and Kelvin Gaines (Cincinnati), who will both graduate from their previous schools before their arrivals in Denton. Gaines will have two years of eligibility remaining with the Mean Green.

20 More Years Of Hoops Experience - Vertrail Vaughns and Kelvin Gaines aren't the only new veterans who will suite up for NT. When you add in senior Brandan Walton (missed 2012-13 to injury), T.J. Taylor (Marquette, Paris JC, Oklahoma), Armani Flannigan (Central Wyoming State), Maurice Aniefiok ('Ole Miss) and Collin Voss (Northern Oklahoma, Central Michigan) the Mean Green will be adding 20 years of collegiate experience (including redshirt seasons) to its roster for 2013-14.

Lane On Lockdown - Tony Benford is all about tough defense, especially in the paint. In 2012-13, North Texas broke the school record for blocked shots with 153, and the squad's defensive field goal percentage inside the 3-point arc of 44.3 was the lowest in the Sun Belt.

Nation's Top Assistant - Associate head coach Rob Evans was named the nation's top mid-major assistant coach in the April edition of Hoop Scoop magazine. Evans is a veteran of 205 victories and six postseason bids in 14 years as a head coach at Arizona State and Ole Miss, where he earned the SEC Coach of the Year and College Insider National Coach of the Year honors in 1997. A standout player at New Mexico State himself, Evans and head coach Tony Benford are actually cousins.

Upgrades - North Texas put the finishing touches on a host of multimillion dollar facility upgrades this offseason. In April, the Mean Green unveiled the Ernie Kuehne Basketball Practice Facility, which features a brand new hardwood floor, five baskets, state-of-the-art security and locker rooms. The Super Pit also received a 16-x-26 foot center-hung Daktronics video board, and a new custom sound system.

Hard Place To Play - These offseason facilities upgrades will only help enhance the game-day experience for North Texas fans at the Super Pit, a place that the Mean Green has been nearly unbeatable. NT is 83-24 (77.6 percent) at the Super Pit since 2006-07.

First-Class Staff - It's hard to keep a great coaching staff together for long, and North Texas learned that lesson in 2013. Bart Lundy, Tony Benford's first hire upon his arrival in Denton, has taken the head coaching position at Queen's University of Charlotte. Benford looked to the same coaching tree to fill Lundy's void in former Marquette assistant Scott Monarch, a 20-year coaching veteran. The NT staff collectively owns over 100 years of collegiate coaching experience, and still features Associate Head Coach Rob Evans, who has 205 head coaching wins and 14 postseason appearances at Arizona State and Ole' Miss. Assistant coach David Anwar spent the last six seasons at Nebraska, and is a 13-year collegiate coaching veteran. Director of Operations Jeff Luster has a 20-plus year college basketball career, and rounds out the staff.

Winning Ways - The Mean Green has averaged 20 wins per year over the last seven seasons, including five straight 20-win seasons from 2007-11. NT won the 2007 and 2010 Sun Belt titles, and played in the NCAA Tournament in both of those seasons.

TONY BENFORD HEAD COACH

A veteran of 21 years in NCAA Division-I basketball and 14 postseason appearances, Tony Benford has transformed the culture of North Texas basketball with his hard-working defense-first approach that made the Mean Green one of the nation's toughest teams.

In 2012-13, North Texas broke the school record for blocked shots with 153, and the squad's defensive field goal percentage inside the 3-point arc of 44.3 was the lowest in the Sun Belt. This season, Benford looks to build on this foundation as he leads the Mean Green into its first season in Conference USA.

Before coming to North Texas, Benford served as the associate head coach at Marquette under Buzz Williams. In his four years at Marquette, Benford helped recruit and coach six All-Big East players, including 2012 Big East Player of the Year Jae Crowder.

Tabbed by Basketball Times, Fox Sports and Hoop Scoop as one of the country's top assistant coaches, Benford also spent time at Nebraska (2006-08), Arizona State (1998-06) and New Mexico (1992-98) developing some of the nation's most talented players.

In his career Benford recruited and coached five NBA first-round draft picks: Garland, Texas; Ike Diogu (Arizona St., '05), Charles Smith (New Mexico, '97), Kenny Thomas (New Mexico, '99), Lazar Hayward (Marquette, '10) and Jimmy Butler (Marquette, '11), as well as three second-round picks in Eddie House (Arizona St., '00), Tommy Smith (Arizona St., '03) and Jeff Pendergraph (Arizona St., '09).

A native of Hobbs, N.M., Benford played collegiately at Texas Tech and was the catalyst for the Red Raiders Southwest Conference regular-season and tournament titles in 1985, and their 1986 SWC Tournament championship. He earned All-Southwest Conference and SWC Tournament MVP honors as a senior. The Boston Celtics selected Benford in the fourth round of the 1986 NBA Draft, and he played professionally in Holland for the 1986-87 season.

With Williams and Benford at the helm at Marquette, the Golden Eagles have reached the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 in each of the last two years. Marquette was ranked No. 11 in the final AP poll of 2012, and ranked 31st in the country in scoring offense with an average of 75.4 points per game. MU won at least 20 games and reached the NCAA Tournament in each of Benford's four years with the program.

Before arriving at Marquette, he had spent the previous two campaigns at Nebraska under head coach Doc Sadler. The Huskers collected 37 total victories in the two seasons, highlighted by a trip to the National Invitation Tournament in 2008. The squad posted 20 wins in 2007-08, just the 12th 20-win campaign in the program's 112-year history. North Texas forward Alonzo Edwards was recruited to Nebraska by Benford prior to transferring to Denton.

Benford served on the Arizona State bench as an assistant coach for his first six years in Tempe before being named associate head coach for his last two seasons with the Sun Devils. Benford helped the Sun Devils to four postseason appearances during his tenure, including earning a spot in the second round of the 2003 NCAA Tournament. While at ASU, Benford recruited Keith Wooden and George Odufuwa to Phoenix before the pair transferred to North Texas and went on to start a combined 143 games for the Mean Green.

In six seasons with New Mexico, Benford helped the Lobos reach five NCAA Tournament bids while winning 73.2 percent of their games (139-51 record). New Mexico picked up a pair of Western Athletic Conference tournament titles in 1993 and 1996, and a regular-season championship in 1994. During his stint with the Lobos, Benford coached the top four scorers in program history, including all-time leading scorer in Kenny Thomas.

As a prep all-star, Benford was a Converse All-American and the New Mexico Player of the Year after pouring in 27.5 points per game as a senior at Hobbs High School. He led Hobbs to the state title in his final season, earning MVP honors of the state championship tournament after posting 29 points in the title game.

ROB EVANS ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

A veteran of more than 40 years in college basketball, former Arizona State and Mississippi head coach Rob Evans has joined Tony Benford and the North Texas coaching staff as associate head coach.

As a head coach, Evans led six of his 14 teams to postseason bids, and owns a 205-201 overall record in helping to rebuild the ASU and Ole Miss programs. Evans comes to North Texas after four years as an assistant at Arkansas followed by a one-year stay at TCU in 2012.

In April of 2013, Hoop Scoop named Evans the nation's No. 1 mid-major assistant coach.

The move to North Texas reunites Evans and Benford, who share a 30-plus year friendship in basketball. Evans recruited Benford to play at Texas Tech, and later the duo coached the Sun Devils together for eight seasons (1998-06) - the last two of which saw Benford promoted to associate head coach. In 2003, Arizona State recorded its first 20-win season since 1995, and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. ASU also qualified for the NIT in 2000, 2002 and 2005.

"We are very fortunate to have a coach of the caliber of Rob Evans at our program," Benford said. "He has been my mentor for years, and his success in over four decades of college basketball speaks for itself. Rob Evans is one of the most respected coaches in the nation on and off the floor, and I couldn't be more excited to be working with him again."

At Ole Miss, Evans took over a program with just one winning season in the previous nine years and only one NCAA Tournament bid in its history. He led the Rebels to a 14-13 mark in 1994 during his second season, marking the program's first winning season in seven years, followed by SEC Western Division titles and back-to-back NCAA Tournament bids for the first time in 1997 and 1998. The consecutive 20-win seasons were the first for Ole Miss since 1937 and 1938. Evans was named SEC Coach of the Year and CollegeInsider.com National Coach of the Year in 1997.

He led the Rebels to a pair of SEC Western Division titles and NCAA Tournament bids before guiding ASU to postseason tournament appearances in three of his last five years.

"I have a tremendous amount of affection and respect for Tony Benford and what he has started at North Texas, I couldn't be more excited to be on board," Evans said. "We have shared a tremendous relationship ever since I recruited him to play for Texas Tech, and when he was a part of my staff at Arizona State and that continues today now that he is one of the best and brightest up-and-coming coaches in the business. My wife, Carolyn, and I are re-

ally looking forward to moving to Denton and getting started."

From 2007-11 Evans served as an assistant at Arkansas. Among the highlights during his tenure with the Razorbacks included reaching the finals of the SEC Tournament and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in his first season with the program in 2008.

The Hobbs, N.M., native was a collegiate assistant for 24 years before taking over the Ole Miss program. He was an assistant to Eddie Sutton at Oklahoma State in 1991 and 1992 after spending 15 years at Texas Tech (1976-90). He started his coaching career by spending seven seasons under Lou Henson at New Mexico State (1969-75), his alma mater.


As an assistant at New Mexico State, Evans helped the Aggies earn four NCAA Tournament bids in seven years with a trip to the Final Four in 1970. He also coached the freshman teams to a combined record of 90-15 during his tenure. Eight of his teams at Texas Tech won 17 or more games with three Southwest Conference Tournament titles and three NCAA Tournament bids, while Oklahoma State reached the Sweet 16 both years with Evans on staff.

Evans was a standout athlete prior to his time on the sidelines. He was the first All-American at Lubbock Christian College in 1966, and was named a Distinguished Alumnus by the university in Oct. of 2004.

He went on to star at New Mexico State, where he captained the Aggies to a pair of NCAA Tournament berths. NMSU's 1967 team lost to Elvin Hayes and Houston in the NCAA Tournament, while the 1968 squad beat Dick Motta and Weber State before falling to eventual national champion UCLA and Lew Alcindor.

A multi-sport star, Evans was drafted out of high school by the Colt 45s, which eventually became the Houston Astros. Following college, he signed as a free agent with the Dallas Chaparrals of the American Basketball Association and with the Oakland Raiders as a receiver.

Evans, who was selected NMSU's most outstanding athlete in 1967 and has been named to the school's all-time basketball team, was inducted into the Aggie Athletic Hall of Fame in 1993. In 1991, he was elected by his peers to be president of the National Association of Assistant Basketball Coaches, was inducted into the Lubbock Christian Hall of Fame in 1990, the Las Cruces, N.M., Hall of Fame in 1989, presented the Texas Tech Outstanding Achievement Award for 1986-87 and selected as NMSU's School of Education Alumnus of the Year in 1994.





DAVID ANWAR ASSISTANT COACH

David Anwar brings a tireless work ethic and a veteran resume of 13 collegiate coaching years to the North Texas basketball staff.

North Texas' recruiting specialist since 2012, Anwar spent the previous six seasons with Nebraska, including five years as an assistant coach and one season as the director of basketball operations in 2010-11.

The move to Denton reunited Benford and Anwar, who spent the 2006-07 and 2007-08 seasons together at Nebraska as assistant coaches under Doc Sadler.

"Every coach that we have brought on board here at North Texas is a person that I fully trust, and has great loyalty," Benford said. "David Anwar fits that bill perfectly. He has always shared great relationships with his players, has done a great job on the floor and has recruited Texas very well. We are very fortunate to have coach Anwar."

Anwar worked with the wings and post players for most of his time at Nebraska, helping the Huskers to the postseason in three of the last five seasons. He played a major role in NU ranking among the top 25 nationally in scoring defense in both 2007-08 and 2008-09.

The Huskers also showed the ability to score from long distance in 2009-10, as Eshaunte Jones (40-of-92, 43.5 percent), Ryan Anderson (54-of-126, 42.9 percent) and Brandon Ubel (11-of-21, 53.4 percent) helped Nebraska set a school record and rank 15th nationally in 3-point percentage (39.7 percent).

"I'm very excited to be working with coach Benford again," Anwar said. "He's one of the nation's top up-and-coming coaches, and a first-rate recruiter and coach. Most importantly, I look forward to working with a close friend."

Working primarily with the Nebraska guards in his first year, Anwar's guidance helped the Huskers power to the second-highest 3-point total in school history with 244 treys in 2006-07.

Off the court, Anwar was instrumental in recruiting, helping Nebraska reel in arguably its top-rated class in the Big 12 era. The Huskers' eight-man recruiting class for 2007 was ranked among the top 25 in the nation by at least three major scouting services, including ESPN.com's Bob Gibbons (21st), CSTV.com's Van Coleman (12th) and Hoop-ScoopOnline.com's Clark Francis (5th).

Prior to Nebraska, Anwar served two seasons under Sadler at UTEP as the Miners' director of operations. He was responsible for the program's budget, scheduling and practice management. Anwar also oversaw the administrative staff and assisted with special projects, camps and on-campus recruiting while helping Sadler and the Miners reach the 2005 NCAA Tournament and 2006 NIT.

Before joining the UTEP program, Anwar served as an assistant coach at Arkansas-Fort Smith for four seasons, including the final three under Sadler. Anwar had on-court and practice responsibilities and also served as the recruiting coordinator. Arkansas-Fort Smith earned a 101-29 record with Anwar on the bench, including a pair of top-seven national finishes in 2001 (fifth) and 2002 (seventh). The team won the Bi-State Conference East league title each of his three seasons under Sadler and produced numerous all-conference players on the court and in the classroom.

Anwar has helped several programs earn a successful record of academic success, including helping more than 20 players move on to four-year schools from Arkansas-Fort Smith.

Earlier in his career, Anwar helped more than 40 high school and prep players earn a spot on Division I or II rosters while serving as a coach in his native Philadelphia and in Massachusetts.

A native of Philadelphia, Anwar earned a bachelor's degree in special education and sociology from Fitchburg State in 1998 and added a master's degree in sports management/sports leadership from Virginia Commonwealth in 2004.



SCOTT MONARCH ASSISTANT COACH

North Texas head basketball coach Tony Benford announced the addition of 20-year collegiate coaching veteran Scott Monarch to his staff.

Monarch, who was named the head coach at Claffin University in May, spent four years alongside Benford on Buzz Williams' coaching staff at Marquette, and has abundant ties to the Texas basketball scene. Monarch was previously the head coach at Panola College in Carthage, Texas for six years, and also spent time at Tyler Junior College.

"We are all extremely excited to have Scott Monarch join our staff here at North Texas," Benford said. "He's a veteran head coach that brings a great deal of wisdom and basketball insight to the court, but he's also a trusted friend that our players will really enjoy playing for. He was vital addition to our staff at Marquette, and was the lead recruiter on both Jimmy Butler and Jai Crowder. Scott understands the Texas, Metroplex and regional junior college recruiting scenes as well as anyone, and I couldn't be happier that he is joining the Mean Green family."

Monarch served as Marquette's director of basketball operations in 2008-09, but moved into an assistant coaching role for the next three seasons. He previously served under Williams at NT's former Sun Belt rival New Orleans in 2006-07.

He arrived in Milwaukee after serving as an assistant coach at Tyler Junior College. He helped guide the Apaches to an overall record of 25-3 and the program's first outright league title in 21 years. TJC advanced to the quarterfinals of the Region XIV Tournament and posted a 19-3 league slate en route to a final national ranking of 10th in the country.

"I'm tremendously excited to be coming to the University of North Texas," Monarch said. "I am familiar with the University and the entire North Texas region, and for me to work back in the area means a lot for me personally and professionally. Tony Benford and I worked really closely together at Marquette, and the opportunity to work with him once again at North Texas was too much to pass up. It's more than just recruiting and basketball to Tony, because he helps players really grow up as individuals. I have a tremendous amount of respect for Tony, and I

have learned a great deal from him. As a father, Tony Benford is who I would want my son to play for."

He had spent the previous six seasons as the head coach at Panola College in Carthage, Texas. Monarch left the program as the school's all-time winningest coach, posting a 63 percent winning percentage. He was named the 2003 National Junior College Athletic Association Region XIV Coach of the Year after leading the Ponies to the regular season conference championship.

"Scott Monarch's combination of enthusiasm and thoroughness is unmatched in our industry!" said Marquette head coach Buzz Williams. "He played an integral role in setting the foundation of our program. Because I saw it on a daily basis for four years, the relationship dynamic of coach Benford and Scott will lead to great success for North Texas."

During his career, Monarch has helped guide 42 players to NCAA Division I programs from the junior college ranks and nearly 20 to all-conference accolades. He also coached the all-time scoring leader in junior college history, Omar Thomas.

Monarch, who received his master's degree from Baylor in 1991 after earning his undergraduate degree from Mississippi Valley State in 1986, has also served as an associate head coach at Tennessee State (1999-2000) and Kentucky Wesleyan (1996-98).

At Kentucky Wesleyan, Monarch was part of a program that reached the 1998 NCAA Division II national championship game. He also recruited and helped develop four players who would later be first-team All-Americans. Two of those standouts became National Players of the Year.

Monarch served as an assistant coach at Grambling State in 1998-99.

He started his career at McLennan Community College in 1993 and coached there for three seasons. He then went on to spend three seasons at Navarro College.

Monarch and his wife, Lacey, have three children: Samantha, Kacey and Scott Jr.





JEFF LUSTER DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS

A 21-year veteran of college basketball, Jeff Luster has been the North Texas basketball program's director of operations since Sept. 14, 2010.

Luster is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Mean Green, which includes travel logistics, meals, camps and budgeting, as well as video operations and special projects.

Since his arrival, Luster has helped the Mean Green reach the finals of the Sun Belt Conference Tournament twice, and post a pair of 20 win seasons.

An original member of Neil Dougherty's staff at TCU, Luster spent six seasons with the Horned Frogs before arriving at NT, including three years as the director of basketball operations and three as an assistant coach.

Overall, Luster has spent 21 years in college basketball as a player, coach and operations director. Prior to his stay at TCU, he served at Colorado as the director of basketball operations for the 2001-02 season, and was also an assistant at Air Force in 1999-00.

He served as the associate head coach at his alma mater, Tabor College (Kan.), where Luster helped lead the Bluejays to the 2001 NAIA Sweet 16 in his lone season.

A standout player in his own right, Luster was a Second-Team All-Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference guard. He graduated from Tabor in 1996 with his bachelor's in physical education while spending the 1995-96 campaign as a student assistant coach.

Luster also spent a season each at Central College (Kan.), McPherson College (Kan.) and Lamar Community College (Kan.) as an assistant coach in between his two stays at Tabor.

Born June 2, 1971, in Colorado Springs, Colo., Luster graduated from Littleton High School in 1990. He and his wife, Shay, have three children: Taylor, Payton and Cooper.
