# **CORE CURRICULUM: MUSIC COURSES AVAILABLE TO ALL STUDENTS**

### Satisfies the University Core Curriculum Requirement: VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS (3 hrs)

MUMH 1600. **Music in Human Imagination**. 3 hours. An introduction to critical issues in music from a multicultural perspective with emphasis on developing listening skills and critical thinking. Open to majors in other fields.

MUMH 2040. **Music Appreciation**. 3 hours. Music masterpieces; elements of music, form and design; relation of music to other areas of cultural development; live and recorded performances. For non-music majors.

MUMH 3000. **Nineteenth-Century Music**. 3 hours. (*Required for Music Minor*.) Music in Romantic Humanism; lectures, recordings, art works and live performances. For non-music majors.

MUMH 3010. **Twentieth-Century Music**. 3 hours. (*Required for Music Minor*.) Music since Impressionism; changing currents in culture and society. Lectures, recordings, art works and live performances. For non-music majors.

#### Satisfies the University Core Curriculum Requirement: HUMANITIES (2011 or later) (3 hrs)

MUET 3030. **Music Cultures of the World**. 3 hours. Survey of music cultures of Africa, the Americas, Asia, and Oceania. Music traditions are studied from a perspective that emphasizes music as an integral part of society and culture. May be taken for any major.

#### Satisfies the University Core Curriculum Requirement: DISCOVERY (2011 or later) (3 hrs)

MUAG 1500. **Occupational Health: Lessons from Music**. 3 hours. A practical course designed to inform and help students prevent occupation-related injuries. The four subject areas that will be addressed are hearing, vocal health, musculoskeletal, and mental health issues. Open to majors in all fields.

## Satisfies the University Core Curriculum Requirement: CAPSTONE (2011 or later) (3 hrs)

MUET 3020. **Popular Music in American Culture**. 3 hours. Historical development of popular musical styles, including Tin Pan Alley, Blues, Country and Western, Big Band Swing, 1950s Rock and Roll, Rhythm and Blues, Soul, the British Invasion, Art Rock, Punk, Reggae and Heavy Metal. These musical styles will be explored as part of the socio-cultural complex in which they developed.
