



FOCUS Fixed-Rate Tuition Plan

The FOCUS fixed-rate tuition plan offers students the opportunity to lock in their tuition rate, for a maximum of five years, instead of paying the regular tuition rate, which is subject to increase annually. The FOCUS Fixed Tuition Plan ensures a total tuition and mandatory fee cost of \$7,650 per year for 30 credit hours. The FOCUS Fixed Tuition Plan helps students and their families plan for the cost of a college education. The plan also provides an incentive for students to earn a degree in a timely manner. **\$30,600 Total cost for 4-year degree**


