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Requirements for the Bachelor of Business Administration degree with a major in Accounting include the following:

1. **Hours Required and General/College Requirements:** A minimum of 121 semester hours, of which 42 must be at the 3000D level or above (advanced), and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Business Administration degree.
2. **Pre-Business Requirements:** Students must have completed at least 45 credit hours of the pre-business program to be admitted into the major. Enrollment in upper-division courses is restricted until the following courses are complete with a C or above and a cumulative 2.7 UNT GPA.
 - a. ENGL 1313D- Computer Assisted Writing I
 - b. ENGL 1323D- Computer Assisted Writing II
 - c. ECON 1100D- Microeconomics
 - d. ECON 1110D- Macroeconomics
 - e. MATH 1190D- Business Calculus
 - f. COMM 1010D- Intro to Communications (exempt from grade of C or higher rule)
 - g. BCIS 2610D- Intro to Computers in Business
 - h. ACCT 2010D- Accounting Principles I
 - i. ACCT 2020D- Accounting Principles II
 - j. DSCI 2710D- Data Description & Analysis with Spreadsheets
3. **Accounting Duplication Policy:** Accounting courses may not be taken more than twice whether at UNT or at another college or university. If the required grade is not made by the second attempt, the student cannot be in any major that requires advanced Accounting coursework. Students may not retake certain Accounting courses once they have completed (with a grade of C or better) a course for which it is a prerequisite.
4. **Advanced Accounting GPA Policy:** Accounting majors must have a 2.5 GPA in all ACCT 3000D and ACCT 4000D level courses taken at UNT or their equivalent taken at other colleges and universities. If this GPA is not met, the student will be required to retake the most recent Accounting course.
5. **Other Requirements:** Students who have courses that “double-dip,” which count for both core and major, may be required to take additional electives to meet the 120 semester hour requirement

Frequently Asked Questions

What does it mean to have a Bachelor of Business Administration degree?

A Bachelor of Science degree and Bachelor of Art degree are very similar and are typically viewed as equal in status. Some degrees may be designated as a Bachelor of Business Administration to signify a broad foundation in business with a major in a specific field of study.

Does UNT Dallas have any online degree programs?

There are no Business degrees that are 100% online. While some programs may have a few courses that are offered online, the majority of Business courses are in a classroom setting.

Is a minor required for a Business degree?

A minor is not required for Business students. However, a student can choose to pursue a minor, if desired, which would add between 12-21 credit hours to the degree program.

Can I get experiential credit towards my degree program based on current or previous employment?

Experiential credit is not granted or applicable to Business programs. However, a student may seek to get internship credit for a new job, position, or project that is gained while the student is taking courses at UNT Dallas.

Is an internship required for my degree?

An internship is not required for any BBA degree, although a student may seek internship credit. Internships are only applicable after the junior year as there are specific criteria that a student must meet. Advisor and department approval required. Credit for a current or previous work experience is not applicable. See advisor for more details.
