

# AIR NATIONAL GUARD READINESS CENTER

## SUMMARY

The Air National Guard (ANG) is administered by the National Guard Bureau, a joint bureau of the departments of the Army and Air Force, and is the principal organization in Washington, D.C. that operates on behalf of the 54 states and territories of the National Guard (NG), working to ensure the almost half-a-million NG Soldiers and Airmen are trained and resourced to meet the needs of our Nation and the various governors in times of war and domestic emergency.

## THE AIR DIRECTORATE

The Air Directorate of the National Guard Bureau is comprised of the Office of the Director, Air National Guard, the Air National Guard Readiness Center, various integrated staffs in Headquarters Air Force, and throughout the Nation at Air Force major commands and direct reporting units. Its mission is to support the Director, Air National Guard with formulating, developing, and coordinating all policies, plans and programs affecting our 105,700 NG Airmen at 89 ANG Wings, from Guam to the U.S. Virgin Islands.

## THE DUAL MISSION OF THE AIR NATIONAL GUARD

The Air National Guard's federal mission is to maintain well-trained, well-equipped units available for prompt mobilization during war and provide assistance during national emergencies (such as natural disasters or civil disturbances). During peacetime, the combat-ready units and support units are assigned to most Air Force major commands to carry out missions compatible with training, mobilization readiness, humanitarian and contingency operations such as Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan.

When Air National Guard units are not mobilized or under federal control, they report to the governor of their respective state, territory (Puerto Rico, Guam, Virgin Islands) or to the commanding general of the District of Columbia National Guard. Each of the 54 National Guard organizations is supervised by the adjutant general of the state or territory. Under state law, the Air National Guard provides protection of life, property and preserves peace, order and public safety. These missions are accomplished through emergency relief support during natural disasters such as floods, earthquakes and forest fires; search and rescue operations; support to civil defense authorities; maintenance of vital public services and counterdrug operations.

## ANGRC HISTORY

The Air National Guard Readiness Center (ANGRC) is based at Joint Base Andrews, Maryland. Its mission is to ensure the combat readiness of Air National Guard units and act as a liaison between the National Guard Bureau (NGB) and the individual states and territories on Air National Guard Operational activities.

The ANGRC traces its roots to the Vietnam War, during which the Air Guard provided airlift support to American forces in Southeast Asia. By 1972, growing global Air Guard responsibilities led to the establishment of the Air National Guard Air Operations Center (AOC) IN 1974. In an effort to ensure a separation of operational activities between the ANG and NGB staff, the ANG Support Center was created on Andrews AFB, Maryland in 1976. In 1992 the ANG Support Center was re-designated as the Air National Guard Readiness Center (ANGRC).

## ANGRC MISSION

ANGRC Mission: Provide resources, policy oversight, guidance and support to ensure 89 ANG wings and all Geographically Separated Units across 54 states, territories and the District of Columbia are trained and equipped across the full spectrum of operations (homeland and global).

## 201st MSS (T10 Administrative Control)

Exercises elements of administrative control (ADCON) over Air National Guard of the United States members/units supporting domestic or foreign operations or while in training in a Title 10 status; coordinates actions with commanders who have operational control (OPCON) and Specified ADCON of attached forces.

## ANGRC COMMANDER AND STAFF

The Commander of the Air National Guard Readiness Center (ANGRC/CC), a one-star general, serves as the Principal Advisor to the Director, Air National Guard for operational/training/ execution matters. The ANGRC staff liaises with and provides guidance to ANG field units in the execution of budget, base support, and operational matters.
