Recent Events

Students Present Research Results at U.S. Strategic Command (9 May 16). DAAA student researchers visited the Command and presented their findings to more than 100 staff members and senior-level leaders. Among the subjects they covered were nuclear proliferation, deterrence in cyberspace, deterrence in space, and deterrence of Violent Extremist Organizations. Students engaged directly with subject matter experts and received feedback from USSTRATCOM professionals, DoD policymakers, and other attendees. USSTRATCOM personnel benefitted from learning about the new ideas and thinking of this up-and-coming generation of scholars. The plan is for a similar event in May 17.

UNO Student Research Team Wins General Larry D. Welch Deterrence Writing Award. Mr. Kevin Holohan, Mr. Harrison Johnson, and Ms. Behtany Walter won First Place in the Junior Division of the 2016 Gen Welch Deterrence Writing Award Competition for their submission entitled "Russian Intentions and Capabilities in the Arctic, and Implications for U.S. Foreign Policy". The writing competition is co-sponsored annually by USSTRATCOM and the STRATCOM Consultation Committee. Members of the winning team received their awards and \$500 from ADM Cecil Haney and Mr. Gary Gates during the USSTRATCOM Deterrence Symposium. The 2017 Call-for-Papers was issued 19 Sep 16. 2016 U.S. Strategic Command Deterrence Symposium (27-28 Jul 16). More than 600 government, academic, and industry security professionals from 14 nations participated in the 7th annual Deterrence Symposium held in Omaha, Nebraska at the La Vista Conference Center. The two-day forum featured keynote addresses by Mr. Brian McKeon (Acting Under Secretary of Defense for Policy, General Curtis Scaparrotti (Commander, U.S. European Command), General Joseph Votel (Commander, U.S. Central Command), Sir Peter Watkins (Director General Security Policy, UK MOD), Ambassador Masafumi Ishii (Ambassador of Japan to NATO), and U.S. Congressman Jeff Fortenberry (Nebraska). The Symposium included a panel comprised of five members of the Academic Alliance. Dr. Emile Nakhleh (UNM) moderated the panel. Dr.Damon Coletta (USAFA), Dr. Matthew Kroenig (Georgetown), Dr. Robert Oberst (Nebraska Wesleyan), and Dr. Darius Watson (Bellevue) were the panelists. 
USSTRATCOM Leadership Visit to Stanford University (9 Dec 16). For the several years, senior USSTRATCOM leaders have visited Stanford University to engage with faculty and students and to demonstrate support to the University for its role in deterrence research and sponsorship of national security fellows. The collaborative relationship between STRATCOM and Stanford predates the Academic Alliance.

Academic Alliance Advisory Board Meeting (Fall 2016). Due to scheduling conflicts, the date of the inaugural Advisory Board meeting has been delayed until mid-Fall. Each member of the board (typically a senior administrator) will serve a two year term, meeting at least once a year with USSTRATCOM senior leaders to discuss Alliance goals and objectives. Current members are: Bellevue University, Nebraska Wesleyan University, Iowa State University, Kansas State University, and National Defense University. However, we're exploring the desirability of increasing the number of board members because the number of DAAA members has increased faster than originally planned. The board meeting enables senior member officials to interact with USSTRATCOM leaders to shape the Alliance and promote awareness of programs and initiatives.
