



# NGB Joint Enabling Team

## Highlights

### JET Capabilities:

- Establishes a link between NGB, supported and supporting states
- Assists with the collection, reporting and sharing of information to the NGCC
- Coordinates with federal, state, local and other NG resources to facilitate required support (EMAC, JIEE, etc.)

### JET Does Not:

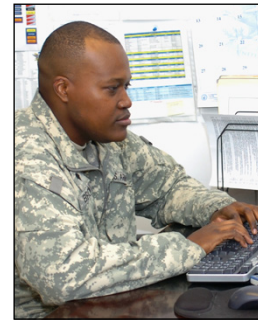
- Provide evaluation of Defense Support to Civil Authority (DSCA) functions (i.e. Joint Reception, Staging, Onward Movement, and Integration (JRSOI))
- Supplementation of State JOC White Cells

### JET Tiered Response:

- Tier 1 Response and or Training Exercise: State requests JET
- Tier 2 Response: State requests a NGB JET to assist with large or small events that require a wider range of expertise
- Tier 3 Response: State requests an NGB JET with Support Cell to assist with severe events
- JET composition is tailored to the State's request

### JET Equipment:

- Laptops with wireless internet capabilities
- Satellite Communications
- GPS



## Providing requested support to states during crisis

**Mission:** The mission of the National Guard Bureau Joint Enabling Team (NGB JET) is to ensure critical NGB Joint Staff, Army (ARNG) and Air National Guard (ANG) expertise is available at the request of a state to support training exercises or a Tier I, II and or III crisis event.

As a training event or a tiered crisis develops, a state's operations (J3) and or J3 Director of Military Support (DOMS) can submit a request for JET support through the Joint Information Exchange Environment (JIEE) to the National Guard Coordination Center (NGCC). The JETs will initiate movement within 24 hours of decision and deploy with mission critical communications equipment. The JET and communications suite will not impose a burden on the State's Joint Operations Center (JOC).

Based on the state's need, NGB can currently staff four JETs composed of elements from Personnel (J1), Intelligence (J2), Operations (J3), Logistics (J4), Communications (J6), Public Affairs, ANG, and ARNG representatives. NGB has the capability to stand up a fifth JET as required.

The NGB JET is developing its mission capability to include Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC) coordination and submission. In addition, the NGB JET is continually refining the working relationships with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), their Defense Coordinating Officers (DCOs) and Emergency Preparedness Liaison Officers (EPLOs).

NGB JET has deployed to a number of natural disasters and National Special Security Events (NSSEs):

- Hurricane Isaac August 2012
- Republican National Convention August 2012
- Democratic National Convention September 2012
- Super Storm Sandy October 2012
- Presidential Inauguration January 2013
