## Prevention of Sexual Abuse in Children

## Webinar Resources:

Military One Source is a confidential service including non-medical counselling and specialty consultations for military members and their families. They provide guidance and offer referrals for those falling victim to sexual abuse.

The Child Molestation Research and Prevention Institute works in collaboration with Military One Source to assist families with current evidence-based research and education, resources and treatments for children who have suffered sexual abuse, i.e. assault or molestation.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) offers programs to assist families and victims in treatment plans, prevention strategies and offers many resources. The CDC works in collaboration with the World Health Organization and the RAINN program, the world's largest anti-sexual assault organization for child sexual abuse and maltreatment.

The National Child Traumatic Stress Network provides a multitude of resources for traumatic events related to children; family and youth provider partnerships, evidence-based research on a the national level, and live educational events. The site offers public awareness resources, upcoming news and events, i.e. April is National Sexual Assault Awareness Month and National Child Abuse Prevention Month.
