[Military One Source](#) is a confidential service including non-medical counselling and specialty consultations for military members and their families. They provide guidance and offer referrals for those falling victim to sexual abuse.

The [Child Molestation Research and Prevention Institute](#) works in collaboration with Military One Source to assist families with current evidence-based research and education, resources and treatments for children who have suffered sexual abuse, i.e. assault or molestation.

The [Centers for Disease Control and Prevention](#) (CDC) offers programs to assist families and victims in treatment plans, prevention strategies and offers many resources. The CDC works in collaboration with the [World Health Organization](#) and the [RAINN](#) program, the world's largest anti-sexual assault organization for child sexual abuse and maltreatment.
