Col applicants must submit last 5 OPRs with no gaps in time (includes AF Form 77s, AF Form 475s, & AF Form 707s, if applicable).

LtCol Applicants must have completed SDE as indicated on vMPF RIP.

2. Position Description

THIS POSITION IS **API 5**.

Provides physician input to all Air National Guard (ANG) clinical, occupational, public health, force protection, and fitness medical policies directly to The Air Surgeon. Assists The Air Surgeon in monitoring and ensuring the ANG is medically qualified for deployment, including signature authority as per Air Force Instruction (AFI) or as delegated by policy. Interfaces with Headquarters Air Force (HAF)/SG staff, USAF Major Command (MAJCOM) staff, Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC), Air Force Medical Operations Agency (AFMOA), Air Force Medical Support Agency (AFMSA), Air Force Personnel Center (AFPC), Air National Guard (ANG) Recruiting and National Guard Bureau (NGB) staff in making medical/aeromedical determinations and policy.

Initiates and develops professional clinical policies, modification, and implementation of policies as promulgated by The Air Surgeon, National Guard Bureau, the Air Force Surgeon General, and the Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD) (HA). Implements physical standards actions to certify flying waivers (authorized at command level), physical qualification for accession, retention or discharge, commissioning, prior service waivers, General Officer promotion and executive physicals, and special evaluations, such as recall to Extended Active Duty (EAD). Signature authority for line of duty determinations, validation and extension of incapacitation status. Reviews professional reports and prepares required summaries for processing to higher headquarters and for modification for implementation into ANG policy. Participates in periodic staff visits to ANG field units and Globally Separated Unit (GSU) sites. Provides medical oversight of the medical/aeromedical program, ancillary clinical services and provides clinical analysis of medical intelligence for deployments and field exercises. Oversees ANG provision of medical services to McMurdo Station, Antarctica and ANG Continuing Medical Education (CME) programs to include ICE3, Top Knife, Top Drill, Top Eye, and flight surgeon breakout sessions at periodic aeromedical conferences. Provides guidance to the field through consultation and written log letters and articles on implementation of health policies throughout the ANG. Is responsible for developing the curriculum and delivering instruction to State Air Surgeons in training. Provides medical consultation to the Environmental & Prevention Team and occupational medicine guidance.

3. <u>Application Reminders</u>

Pen/ink changes to any source document, i.e. Report on Individual Personnel (RIP), Evaluations could result in disapproval.

It is your responsibility to ensure your vMPF Personnel RIP is in order prior to application submittal. This includes but not limited to, verifying Duty History, AFSC, Service Dates and ensuring overdue TDY codes are cleared.

4. About Statutory Tours

This is a fully funded Permanent Change of Station (PCS). Visit DFAS website for most current Basic Allowance Housing (BAH) & Basic Allowance Substance (BAS) rates for the duty location listed on this announcement.

All Members assigned to the Statutory Tour program will remain affiliated their State/Territory while serving on Statutory Tour.

All field members to include AGR, Technicians & Drill Status Guardsmen must obtain State TAG approval with application submittal. Members currently assigned to the Statutory Tour program must obtain current Director's approval.

Statutory Tour service time does not count toward Reduced Eligibility Age for Reserve Retirement Pay.

Statutory Tour members may be eligible for the Post 9/11 GI Bill if they serve on active duty Title 10 and/or Title 32 502(f) AGR for 90 days or more, after 11 September 2001. Their eligibility percentage starts at 40% for 90 days to 5 months. It increases 10% every 6 months, maxing out at 100%.
