

Updated / Restated Guidance to Facility Security Officers on:
**How to Identify the Government Customer When Requesting an
Investigation for a Personnel Security Clearance (PCL) in JPAS**
(JANUARY 2008)

The Defense Security Service (DSS) requests immediate assistance in assuring that all of your requests for personnel security investigations (PSIs) in the Joint Personnel Adjudication System (JPAS) include:

- The identification of the government customer requiring the personnel security clearance (PCL) in accordance with the identification table below
AND
- The contract number

Background -

In September 2007, DSS provided updated guidance to Facility Security Officers (FSOs) on how to identify the government customer in the contract number field when requesting PCLs to allow DSS to identify the actual sources of investigative clearance requirements. We thank those who followed this guidance.

However, recent DSS analysis of user input to the contract number field indicates that the guidance is still not being consistently followed in approximately two-thirds of the e-QIP submissions into JPAS.

Accurate data entry of the source of the investigative requirement for a clearance is essential to DSS' capability to effectively manage and validate industry's PSI submissions with the government customers.

We have restated / updated the guidance here for your ease of reference and immediate implementation. Industrial Security Representatives will also make this a matter of special interest during inspections.

Instruction -

The correct standardized format for contract number is as follows:

One Word Government Identifier (Table begins on Page 3) - Contract Number

1) When writing the contract number please include the full contract number in all capital letter.

For example: NAVY N0001906D0014

2) If the contract number is classified please still list the contracting agency then list the type of classification. (CLASSIFIED, CIRCLE A, YANEE WHITE, etc). If the agency is also classified just list CLASSIFIED.

For example: DHS CLASSIFIED *or if agency is classified as well:* CLASSIFIED

3) If the person requesting the investigation works on multiple contracts please list their primary contracting agency and contract number.

4) When requesting an investigation for SCI or SAP access, include "SCI" or "SAP" between the name of the Government customer and the contract number

For example: NAVY SAP N0001906D0014

5) Investigations for key management personnel of a cleared company should reflect the contractor's primary classified contract and associated government customer.

6) For a company in process for a facility clearance, the key management personnel clearances should reflect the government customer sponsoring the company's facility clearance and the associated contract.

Examples of Recent *Incorrect* Inputs –

Incorrect Examples:	Reason Why:
DA1234-05-D-7819	No contracting agency.
CLASSIFIED	Possibly incorrect, if the contract number is classified but the contracting agency is not, please list the contracting agency then "CLASSIFIED"
NAVY - 645B	Contract number is very short, make sure you're using the whole number and not just a portion.
DA1234-05-D-7819 ARMY	Contracting agency improperly placed at the end.
VARIOUS	Do not list "various" or "multiple" – list the primary contracting activity for the person requesting the investigation.
NONE	Should at least list "OTHERDOD" or "OTHERNONDOD"
ARMYa123405a7819	No dash between agency and contract number, contract number does not have dashes and is not capitalized.
1E7P7	CAGE Codes are not contract numbers, do not list CAGE Codes.
E-Borders	Contract names are not contract numbers, do not list contract names.
Unknown	Contract number should be known. If it is unknown what the contract number requiring the clearance is then there is no reason to issue a clearance. If no contract number applies see rule for "NONE" above.
DOT - TO-436	Task Orders (TOs/DOs) are not complete contract numbers – please list full contract number followed by Task Order if needed.
AIR FORCE - F123-05-D-1234	Incorrect agency identifier, should be "AF" - see tables below.
COASTGUARD - DH123-05-D-1234	Subordinate agencies should be listed using the governing agency from the table below, in this example "DHS" should be listed.

One Word Government Identifier for the Government contracting agencies (GCAs).
