1. General Situation. DCE LA continues to support the State of Louisiana priorities as specified by the Governor and the Federal Coordinating Officer, and monitor DOD units involved in disaster relief operations.

2. Overall Situation. DCE LA, currently located in Baton Rouge, LA, supports federal response and recovery efforts in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina. Priorities are Search and Rescue (SAR), Communications, water-food-ice, healthcare, fuel, and security.

Weather conditions along gulf coast are favorable for air, ground and naval operations for the next 48-72 hours (green) with 20% chance of thunderstorms throughout the period. Primary morgue site at St. Gabriel is operational. Seventy DMORT staff released to the field in support of the Task Force Remains Recovery missions. Release of any information as to

the numbers of casualties is withheld by the state. The first family assistance center is operational in Baton Rouge.

- SP MAGTAF continues search operations in St. Bernard Parish in concert with National Guard and local law enforcements. Elements of the 82nd ABN, 1st CD, SPMAGTAF, and 45th FA Bde ARNG continue search operations in the New Orleans area.
