(1) Describe the purpose of this DoD information system or electronic collection and briefly describe the types of personal information about individuals collected in the system.

SQRIPT (Student Qualification Requirement Information Performance Tracking System) is a GOTS (Government Off-the-Shelf) web application with underlying database structures that records and houses short-term training data input across the eight ASTC (Aviation Survival Training Center) sites. SQRIPT provides an interface to ASTCs in order to meet their requirements of training management. SQRIPT tracks the NSTI (Naval Aviation Survival Training Institute) program, which includes mishap data, high-risk training for NSTI Instructors (Dunker, LPC (Low Pressure Chamber), etc), student qualifications, and air crew data as dictated by OPNAVINST 3710.7. The need to record, track and report on BUMED SOP (Bureau of Medicine Standard Operating Procedure) data was started at the beginning of derived training curriculums. SQRIPT will pull data from and push data to Corporate Enterprise Training Activity Resource System (CeTARs).

The types of PII collected in the system include name, address, marital status, birth date, social security number, gender, medical and mishap information and military records which include status of student qualifications and class.

(2) Briefly describe the privacy risks associated with the PII collected and how these risks are addressed to safeguard privacy.

SQRIPT is at risk because all systems may be vulnerable to unauthorized intrusion and hacking. There are risks that SQRIPT, with its collection of PII, could be compromised. Because of this possibility, appropriate security and access controls listed in this PIA have been put in place such as the use of DoD CAC certificates, secure data transmission and national DoD security standards.
