


U.S. Army Mission and Installation Contracting Command Brigadier General Jeffrey A. Gabbert Commanding General

Brigadier General Jeffrey A. Gabbert is the commanding general, Mission and Installation Contracting Command, Joint Base San Antonio-Fort Sam Houston, Texas. The MICC, a subordinate command to the U.S. Army Contracting Command, provides Army commands, installations and activities with responsive contracting solutions and oversight through more than 1,500 Soldiers and Army civilians at three brigades, one field directorate office and 32 field-level contracting offices located throughout the nation.

Prior to arriving at the MICC, Brigadier General Gabbert served as the Special Assistant to the ACC commanding general at Redstone Arsenal, Ala.
