OCTOBER'S SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES President of the Republic of Korea (POTROK) Visit to U.S. (Oct. 14-16)

President Park, Geun-hye visited the White House, Pentagon, Korean War Memorial, NASA's Space Flight Center,



and the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS). At the Pentagon, Secretary of Defense Carter and President Park discussed challenges posed by North Korea and the importance of continued Alliance cooperation and coordination to deter and, if necessary, defeat the North Korean threat.

At the While House joint press conference, President Obama reaffirmed the U.S. commitment to defend the Republic

of Korea. President Park stated that the ROK-U.S. Alliance is moving toward a comprehensive global Alliance. They also reaffirmed that both nations will never accept North Korea as a nuclear weapons state. The two nations' joint fact sheet states that the U.S. and the ROK have an advanced partnership into "New Frontiers of Cooperation" such as cyber, space, climate change, and global health.

Second Infantry Division's (2ID)
Warfighter Exercise (Sept. 29 – Oct. 9)
2ID conducted this major annual exercise
to assess warfighting functions and mission command capabilities. This marked
the first exercise since 2ID integrated
into the ROK-U.S. Combined Division
to assess interoperability. Participating
units included the 210th Field Artillery
Brigade, 2nd Combat Aviation Brigade,
8th Military Police Brigade, and 71st
Ordnance Group. Fort Leavenworth's
Mission Command Training Program
observers came to Korea to assess exercise objectives.



Seoul International Aerospace and Defense Exhibition (ADEX) (Oct. 19-25)

The Seoul ADEX is one of Northeast Asia's largest air shows with participation from 32 nations and 370 companies. Seoul ADEX plays a major role in helping Korea develop its aerospace and defense industry. Top Air Force chiefs from 12 countries attended at the Seoul K-16 airport, and also met with ROK Air Force leadership to discuss defense

industry cooperation.

U.S. static displays included the F-16, A-10, KC-135, and E-3 aircraft. Aerial demonstrations included the F-22 Demonstration Team from Langley Air Force Base, Virginia, and the C-17 Demonstration Team from Hickam AFB, Hawaii. Osan Air Base's 5th Reconnaissance Squadron also provided U-2 flybys.
