

# Fact Sheet

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## U.S. Army Europe by the Numbers

- 60,000+: Soldiers (U.S. and allied) train at the Joint Multinational Readiness Center at Hohenfels annually
- 30,000+: Soldiers in USAREUR by 2017, concentrated in seven communities after currently scheduled transformation efforts are complete
- 27,000+: Troops of the International Security Assistance Force come from our European Allies
- 20,000+: European ally & partner nation personnel participated in multinational exercises since 2005
- 5,200+: Multinational graduates with specialized functional training from the Combined Arms Training Center at the Joint Multinational Training Command in Grafenwoehr since 2003
- 3,400+: European ally & partner nation personnel scheduled to participate in FY13 multinational exercises
- 2,400+: Soldiers from 22 countries trained on counter-improvised explosive device skills at the Joint Multinational Training Command in Grafenwoehr
- 1,200+: Multinational drivers trained to operate Mine Resistant Ambush Protected vehicles at the Joint Multinational Readiness Center in Hohenfels
- 1,000+: Personnel from 26 countries developed counterinsurgency intelligence, analysis and operational skills with the assistance of USAREUR personnel and facilities
- 750+: Multinational graduates from Warrior Leader Course at Joint Multinational Training Command in Grafenwoehr in 2012
- \$112 million: Annual savings once the Heidelberg, Mannheim and Darmstadt garrisons are closed and consolidated with the USAREUR HQ and its military intelligence and signal assets in Wiesbaden
- 72: Security Force Assistance Teams from 16 countries trained at the Joint Multinational Readiness Center in Hohenfels in 2012 in support of NATO's International Security Assistance Force
- 51: Countries in the USAREUR Area of Responsibility
- 38: Nations participated in USAREUR-led exercises in 2012
- 26: Of 49 nations contributing to the coalition forces of International Security Assistance Force are NATO Allies from Europe
- 21: European nations have a state partner in the U.S. National Guard
- \$10.24 billion: Facilities (Plant Replacement Value (PRV)) returned by USAREUR since FY06
- 700+: Sites reduced in USAREUR from peak 1980s posture in Europe
- 21: Joint and combined Army exercises in 2012 that included participation from USAREUR personnel
- 7: U.S. Combatant Commanders supported by the US Army in Europe (in addition to NATO): EUCOM, AFRICOM, TRANSCOM, STRATCOM, SOCOM, CYBERCOM, and CENTCOM
- 4: Major mission rehearsal exercises conducted in 14 countries with 44 participating nations to prepare forces for deployment to combat in 2012
- 3: Of 4 non-US veto-wielding permanent members of the United Nations Security Council (France, Russia, United Kingdom) are from the USAREUR area of responsibility.
- 2: Distinct types of brigade combat teams remain in Europe – Stryker and Airborne
- 1: The only Combat Training Center located outside of the continental U.S. is the Joint Multinational Readiness Center in Hohenfels
