The Kansas City District was the construction agent for the Fort Leavenworth, Kansas renovation project of Building 465. The project resurrected a deteriorated historic structure (U.S. Disciplinary Barracks hospital) and transformed it into a stateof-the-art academic facility with classrooms and office space for the Army's Civilian Education System.

Fort Leavenworth exists as the Intellectual Center of the Army and Building 465 greatly enhances the installation's leadership education capability with modern and technologically advanced classrooms. The facility is equipped with a wireless network allowing centralized imaging computing devices for over 300 students and faculty from one central location.

The renovation cost of Building 465 at Fort Leavenworth was approximately \$16 million and was completed in 2011.
