- 1 Military Senior Contingency Contracting Team
- 19 Defense Acquisition Workforce Improvement Act Level III certified professionals
- Oversees 16 Administrative Contracting Officers
- Oversees 140 Contracting Officer Representatives
- Averages 2,700 contract actions annually
- Averages \$700 million contract obligations annually
- Supports 3 branches: Military; Civil Works; and Hazardous, Toxic and Radioactive Waste
- Maintains Afghanistan Engineering Reach-back Contracting Cell
- Provides Multiple Contract Vehicles: Multiple Award Task Order Contracts; Single Award Task Order Contract; Blanket Purchase Agreement; and Procurement Oriented Construction Activities
