The Fort Leonard Wood Primary Care Clinic renovation consists of a 39,000 square feet alteration to the existing clinic space and 21,590 square feet of clinical addition. The clinic updates included new facilities for family care, pediatrics, pharmacy, internal medicine, respiratory therapy/cardiology services and an acute medical illness building.

The exterior of the addition was constructed to match the existing hospital. Construction required the seamless transition for patients to be admitted, or required additional medical services to the existing hospital. The Primary Care Clinic project was designed in accordance with the criteria prescribed for medical facilities, anti-terrorism standards and in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and Architectural Barriers Act Accessibility Guidelines.

The building was completed in the fall of 2011 and became fully operational in the spring of 2012. The total cost for the Fort Leonard Wood Primary Care Clinic renovations was approximately \$17.9 million.
