

Since 2002, Kansas City District has established an ISO 9001:2008 certified Quality Management System (QMS) whose scope includes project management, planning and engineering studies, design and construction. It supports the Project Management Business Process required by ER 5-1-11, Management, USACE BUSINESS PROCESS. It includes all effort from the inception of the project through study completion and/or construction and it includes construction, support services during construction and services required by the customer during the operational phase.

The Kansas City District's QMS functions to facilitate work sharing, improve customer satisfaction, improve project delivery quality, drive continuous process improvement and reduce cost. It can be viewed as a "wedge" that both holds the gains achieved along the quality journey and prevents good practices from slipping.
