C-Contaminated Sediment Strategic Plan

Description

The Contaminated Sediment Strategic Plan (CSSP) encompasses all Federal navigation channels and is used throughout all 31 U.S. Great Lakes Areas of Concern (AOCs). The program allows the Corps to identify opportunities for collaborative efforts to de-list AOCs. Many of the Beneficial Use Impairments in AOCs relate to the presence of contaminants in the sediments. The CSSP identifies contaminant "hot spots" for removal using the Corps' navigation authorities.

Evaluations

Status

Funds to date have been used to evaluate opportunities for Strategic Navigation Dredging (SND) at Waukegan, IL; Manistique, MI; Ashtabula, OH; Sheboygan, WI; and the St. Clair River, MI. In addition, the sediment physical and chemical data for the U.S. Areas of Concern have been entered into the database for decisionmakers to use in de-listing decisions. FY15 funds were used to train Corps Districts staff in mapping and evaluation of sediment concentration in the sediments. FY16 funds are being used to identify and evaluate new SND opportunities in the Clinton River, Milwaukee Estuary AOC, and other locations. FY17 funds would be used to continue Corps evaluations for SND opportunities and support for delisting decisions.

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
