C-569-Northeastern Minnesota Environmental Infrastructure Assistance

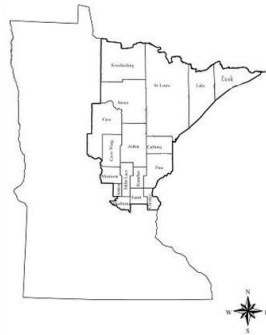
Description

The Program area includes the Minnesota counties of Cook, Lake, St. Louis, Koochiching, Itasca, Cass, Crow Wing, Aitkin, Carlton, Pine, Kanabec, Mille Lacs, Morrison, Beltrami, Hubbard, Wadena, Isanti, and Chisago. Section 569 provides the authority to assist public entities with water-related infrastructure projects. Work may be in the form of design and construction assistance for water-related environmental infrastructure and resource protection and development projects in NE Minnesota, including projects for wastewater treatment and related facilities, water supply and related facilities, environmental restoration, and surface water resource protection and development. The Program is jointly administered by the Detroit District and the St. Paul District, with individual projects managed by the respective Districts.

FY15 funds, along with leftover funds from several other projects were used to develop an agreement with the Western Lake Superior Sanitary District to protect sewer lines along the Lake Superior shoreline. That agreement is planned to be signed in FY16 and the Corps would monitor construction. FY17 funding would be used to continue assisting communities through a ranking and selection process established for the program.
