Interagency and International Services (IIS) is the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) program providing technical assistance to non-Department of Defense (DoD) federal agencies, state and local governments, tribal nations, private U.S. firms, international organizations, and foreign governments. Most IIS work is funded on a reimbursable basis. The Corps provides planning, engineering, design, construction management, environmental services, and technical assistance related to water, natural resources, building and infrastructure. Assistance can vary from providing highly specific technical advice to complete program management services.
