- Fire Crews
- Mobile Kitchen Units
- Mobile Communication Centers
- Helicopter Recon / Rescue
- Swift Water Rescue Technicians
- Bull Dozers & Specialized Heavy Equipment

CAL FIRE Activation

When requesting CAL FIRE resources, DWR would place the specific Resource Request(s) through the CAL FIRE Headquarters Duty Chief at (916) 327-3063. CAL FIRE will fill / commit the closest available resources for the following:

- Preparation / Standby
- Advance Deployment
- Emergency Flood-Fighting
- Search Rescue Recon Recovery

CAL FIRE will assign an Agency Representative to coordinate with DWR appointed contact person

CAL FIRE Fire Crews

CAL FIRE Crews will be ordered in 2 ways;

Single Resource – 1 Crew Captain and 14-17 Crewmembers. Possibility with a CDCR Officer

Strike Team – 1 Strike Team Leader, 2 Fire Crews, 1 CDCR Supervisor, and 2 Correctional Officers.





CAL FIRE Conservation Camps

- 39 Camps Statewide
- Potentially 196 Fire Crews available
- 13-17 crew members with 1 Fire Captain per crew (avg. 15 personnel + Captain = 2,976 workers)
- 24 / 7 coverage...will vary with the season. There is a minimum of two crew's per camp on the weekends and normal week day coverage available 24 / 7 throughout the year.

Fire Crew Operations

- Tasks which require <u>large</u> numbers of personnel to complete
- Sand bagging
- Sacking boils
- Tarping levee's
- Search and Rescue
- Emergency Incident Management
- Emergency Logistical Support

CAL FIRE Logistics

DWR will be responsible for supplying:


- Assigned Contact person
- Flashlight batteries
- Personal Floatation Devices (PFD)
- Sandbags and sand
- Rope for lifelines
- Sledges and files to sharpen small tools
- Rain gear and rubber boots (when needed)

CAL FIRE Logistics

Additional items needed:

- Restroom facilities
- Feeding for Fire Crews
- Sleeping area for Fire Crews (will depend on distance from the Conservation Camp)
- Lodging for Crew Captains
- Environmental tent for CDCR Staff

CAL FIRE Pre-flood Service





CAL FIRE Pre-Flood Services

Pre-flood services can be performed for any government agency or qualified non-profit organization, including reclamation districts, as work projects.

- Invoiced as standard project rate of \$200 per day plus administration fees
- Requires *minimum* of two days advanced notice to implement
- Project will need to be inspected by Admin Captain and CDCR Supervisor prior to crew work
