Addendum

The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the University of Management and Technology (UMT) and the Defense Acquisition University (DAU), dated 6 January 2004, shall be amended as follows:

1. The existing list of degrees on the first page shall be replaced with the following expanded list:
 - Master of Science in Management, Project Management major
 - Master of Science in Management, Acquisition Management major
 - Master of Science in Information Technology, IT Project Management major
 - Master of Business Administration (MBA)
 - Master of Public Administration (MPA)
 - Executive Certificate in Project Management
 - Executive Certificate in Acquisition Management
 - Graduate Certificate in Project Management
 - Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA)
 - Doctor of Business Administration (DBA)
2. In the "Required Qualifications of Participants" section of the agreement, the existing statement shall be replaced with the following statement (to reflect the addition of new degrees to the MOU):

The program is available to members of the Defense Acquisition Workforce who possess the following qualifications:

For Master's level degrees (MS in Management, MS in Information Technology, MBA, MPA, and the Graduate Certificate in Project Management), applicants must possess a bachelor's degree from an appropriately accredited university.

For the Executive Certificates, there are no program entry requirements.

For the Bachelor of Business Administration, applicants must possess an associate's degree or have completed at least sixty (60) credit-hours of undergraduate studies at an appropriately accredited university. Alternatively, they can begin studies at UMT at the associate's level, and earn an Associate's degree in Business Administration while on their way to earning the BBA.

For the Doctor of Business Administration, applicants must possess a relevant master's degree with a 3.6 grade point average or higher, or thirty (30) credit-hours of pertinent graduate level coursework, with a 3.6 grade point average or higher. Sixty (60) hours of courses beyond the master's (or 30 credit-hour course load) must be taken to meet the credit-hour requirements of the degree.

3. In the "Credit Transfer Regime" section of the agreement, the first paragraph shall be replaced with the following statement:


UMT's MS and MPA degrees are thirty-three (33) credit-hour programs (semester-based) and its MBA degree is a forty-five (45) credit hour program (semester-based). Students can apply for up to fifteen (15) credit-hours of previous graduate level work (including courses taken at DAU) toward the MS level courses and twenty-one (21) credit-hours toward the MBA. In determining the number of credit-hours that can be transferred, UMT counselors will review student transcripts reflecting prior studies. In respect to DAU courses that can be transferred, see the transfer table at the end of this section.


4. At the end of the "Credit Transfer Regime" section of the agreement, the following statement and table shall be inserted:

When assessing transferability of DAU course credit, UMT takes into account a number of different factors, including appropriateness of the course being reviewed, contact hours with students, level of sophistication of the course, and level of rigor of class assignments. Thus, in determining the number of credit-hours that can be transferred, UMT counselors will examine courses taken at DAU on a course-by-course basis. There is no limit on how many credits can be transferred, provided they do not exceed the total allowed as described above at the outset of this section of the MOU. The following table shows DAU courses that are equivalent to courses offered in UMT's graduate programs and that can result in transfer of credit.

UMT graduate level courses	DAU equivalents, leading to transfer of credit
Mgt 215. Operations, Logistics, and Supply Chain Management	At least two DAU logistics courses, combined with PQM 101, PQM 201A, PQM 201B, or a pertinent academic course on operations management
Mgt 250. Project Management DAU students who have PMP or PgMP Certification will receive credit for Mgt 250	PMP or PgMP Certification
Mgt 251. Planning and Control	PMT 250
Mgt 254. Contracting	A combination of three or more DAU contracting courses whose combined contact hour exposure is 60 hours or greater
Mgt 258. International Project Management	PMT 202 + PMT 304 or an academic course dealing with an international topic (e.g., international marketing, international business, cross-cultural relations)
Mgt 279. Management of Major Programs	ACQ 201A and ACQ 201B; or ACQ 101 plus an academic program management course
