#### **USACE Permit Action**

- Administrative Authorities: Section 404 of the Clean
   Water Act and Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act
- Compliance with applicable federal laws:
  - ▶ Magnuson-Stevens Act (Essential Fish Habitat EFH)
  - ▶ National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA)
  - Coastal Zone Management Act
  - Section 401 of the Clean Water Act
  - ► Endangered Species Act (ESA)




# **Endangered Species Act of 1973**

#### **Legal Intent of the Act**

Sec. 2(b) – The purposes of [the] Act are to provide a means whereby the ecosystems upon which endangered species and threatened species depend may be conserved [and] to provide a program for the conservation of such endangered species and threatened species...



# **Endangered Species Act**

- Endangered species any species which is in danger of extinction throughout all or a significant portion of its range. [ESA §3(6)]
- Threatened species any species which is likely to become an endangered species within the foreseeable future throughout all or a significant portion of its range. [ESA §3(20)]
- Listed species any species of fish, wildlife or plant which has been determined to be endangered or threatened under the ESA. [50 CFR §402.02]
- Critical Habitat specific areas within the geographic range of a listed species which support physical and biological features essential to the conservation of the species, and which may require special management. [ESA §3(5)(A)]

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


• Sec. 7(a)(1) of the Act directs federal agencies to utilize their authorities to further the purposes of the Act by carrying out conservation programs for listed species.

  - ▶ 184 plant species




Salt marsh harvest mouse (Reithrodontomys raviventris, Endangered)


Critical Habitat for listed species in California


▶ 123 plant and animal species have designated or proposed

critical habitat in the State of California




California tiger salamander (Ambystoma californiense)






USACE makes an **Effects Determination** and requests to initiate the appropriate type of consultation with the responsible agency







Effects Determination Categories

#### ▶ No Effect

- The agency's determination when the proposed action will not affect listed species or critical habitat.
- No Consultation
- ▶ Not Likely to Adversely Affect
  - The agency's determination when a proposed actions effects on listed species are expected to be discountable, insignificant, or beneficial.
  - Informal Consultation / Service Concurrence Required

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#### Effects Determination Categories

#### ► Likely to Adversely Affect

- The appropriate conclusion if any adverse effects to listed species may occur as a direct or indirect result of a proposed action.
- Formal Consultation / Biological Opinion / Incidental Take Permit

#### Jeopardy

- The appropriate conclusion when the proposed action is expected to Jeopardize the continued existence of a listed species.
- Take is Prohibited

#### Adverse Modification of Critical Habitat

- The appropriate conclusion when the proposed action is expected to result in the destruction or adverse modification of critical habitat.
- Adverse Modification is Prohibited

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
Effects Determination Categories: Proposed Species

#### Jeopardy

- The appropriate conclusion when the proposed action is expected to Jeopardize the continued existence of a proposed species.
- Conference / Conference Opinion

#### ► Adverse Modification of Critical Habitat

- The appropriate conclusion when the proposed action is expected to result in the destruction or adverse modification of proposed critical habitat.
- Conference / Conference Opinion




# **Making Effect Determinations**


- Be proactive...You can influence the consultation...
  - Consider the federal process in your design/application
  - List the species and designated critical habitat you considered
  - Consider direct/indirect effects, survey data, habitat suitability, species consultation areas
  - Use resources to accurately project effects
  - Remember there are limited survey windows for some species

## **Formal Consultation\***

- A written request to initiate formal consultation shall:
  - Describe proposed action
  - Describe affected area
  - List affected species or critical habitat
  - Describe the affect on listed species or critical habitat and analyze cumulative effects
  - Include relevant reports, environmental impact statement, environmental assessment or biological assessment
  - Include other relevant available information on the action, the affected listed species or critical habitat

\*(50 CFR 402.14)



# **Application Information**

- A completed ENG 4345 application form does not satisfy the consultation requirement of Section 7 of the ESA.
- Nationwide Permits General Condition 18:
  - ► Pre-Construction Notifications must include:
    - Name(s) of listed species that might be affected
    - Documentation demonstrating compliance with ESA
  - ▶ No work shall start until Section 7 is satisfied
