From October 2004 to March 2008, Mr. Heesacker served as the Nuclear Quality Division Head. He was responsible for providing PSNS & IMF with continuing assessments of the commands nuclear organizations, operations, and the quality of the commands Naval nuclear work.

From 2003 to October 2004, Mr. Heesacker served as the Senior Integration Manager responsible for all aspects of the pilot project ultimately successful in the integration/consolidation of Puget Sound Naval Shipyard and the Naval Intermediate Maintenance facility.

From 2000 to 2003, Mr. Heesacker served as the command's Chief Information Officer responsible for implementing the command's information resource management goals established corporately by NAVSEA in alignment with the NAVSEA strategic business plan.
