## STEVEN L. ANDRASCHKO CHAIRMAN, ARMY CLEMENCY AND PAROLE BOARD ARMY REVIEW BOARDS AGENCY (ARBA)



Mr. Steven L. Andraschko was assigned as the Chairman, Army Clemency and Parole Board on 23 October 2011. In this capacity, he is responsible for the oversight and conduct of Army Clemency and Parole Board hearings for Soldiers confined in Army Corrections System facilities and those transferred to the Federal Bureau of Prisons for incarceration, as well as Soldiers on parole or mandatory supervised release. He is also responsible for monitoring the behavior of all former Soldiers under supervision by U.S. Probation Officers. The Army Clemency and Parole Board conducts over 700 clemency and parole board hearings annually.

Mr. Andraschko started his civilian career in August 2007 when he was selected as the first Deputy Director of the U.S. Army Corrections Command.

Mr. Andraschko served as a Military Police officer in the U.S. Army, beginning his military service in 1976 - he retired as a Colonel in September 2005. His career included assignments in Europe and throughout the United States in various command and staff positions. He commanded the 704<sup>th</sup> Military Police Battalion and Fort Lewis Regional Correctional Facility, and completed a Brigade command tour as the Commandant, U.S. Disciplinary Barracks, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. He culminated his career as a Board Member, Military Review Boards, ARBA.

Mr. Andraschko holds a Bachelor's degree in Sociology from South Dakota State University, and a Master's degree in Criminal Justice from the University of Nebraska – Omaha. He is a graduate of the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College, the Joint/Combined Staff Officer's School, and the U.S. Air War College, class of 1997. He is a Certified Corrections Executive and member of the American Correctional Association and a member of the Association of Paroling Authorities International.
