In all countries it is compulsory to carry motor vehicle insurance and the original vehicle registration document. In many countries emergency equipment must be in the car, not in the trunk, and reflective jackets are required if the driver (and often passengers as well) leave the vehicle on a carriageway. All countries can assess on-the-spot fines. Radar detectors are forbidden in all countries listed and most other European countries. In some countries the use of GPS-based navigation systems which have maps indicating the location of traffic monitoring cameras is prohibited as well.

- 2: Compulsory if visibility is poor
- 3: Must be worn by driver only, on motorways and major roads or where parking is prohibited
