Enabling Objectives

 List eligibility requirements for Officer commissioning programs in accordance with Enlisted to Officer Commissioning Programs Application Administrative Manual, OPNAVINST 1420.1 (Series)

Purpose

 Provide opportunities for enlisted personnel to obtain a commission in the U.S. Navy

Basic Requirements

- Must be a U.S. Citizen
- Physical
- Age
- Testing

Recommended by Commanding Officer

Naval Academy

- Provides 4 years of college education
- Must be 17 and not older than 23 on 1 July of entrance year
- Unmarried, no legal responsibility to support others

Naval Academy Preparatory School

- Provides intensive instruction and preparation for the academic, military, and physical training curriculum at the Naval Academy
- Offered in a direct appointment to the Naval Academy
- Must be no older than 22 as of 1 July of the entrance year

Seaman to Admiral 21 (STA-21)

- Minimum 1000 SAT/41 ACT
- 2 phases
 - 8 weeks at NSI
 - 36 months at NROTC university
- Receive full pay and allowance

Medical Enlisted Commissioning Program

- Provides opportunity to earn nursing degree and commission
- 36 months to complete degree
- Minimum 1000 SAT/42 ACT
- Can be up to 42 years old

Officer Candidate School

- Commissioning Program for Sailors who posses a Bachelors degree
- 12 weeks of officer candidate indoctrination and training
- 22 different fields available

Other Commissioning Opportunities

- Medical Service Corps In-Service Procurement Program (MSC-IPP)
- Limited Duty Officer (LDO)
- Chief Warrant Officer (CWO)
