Description

Navy Career Tools are web-based applications designed to support and enhance Sailor career management and professional development This information sheet identifies the online applications that you must use to support Sailors, Sailor careers, and command career information programs. If you do not routinely use ALL of the applications listed below, both you and your Sailors will miss the many opportunities and advantages provided.

Sailor Career Development

Eight online applications form the basic Command Career Counselor Toolbox. It is your responsibility to use these tools to ensure Sailors are afforded every opportunity to achieve a successful Navy career and subsequent transition to civilian life.

Required Actions

- Use applications identified in the CCC Toolbox to support Sailor careers and manage command career information programs.
- Direct Sailors to the Sailor Career Toolbox and be prepared to instruct them in how to use their toolset to develop and manage their careers.
- Use resources provided by command personnel, including your Command Master Chief, Training Officer, and Education Services Officer.
- Use information provided by websites, including Navy Knowledge Online (NKO), Naval Personnel Command (NPC), Navy College, and Navy Fleet and Family Support Center (FFSC). See the last page for a recommended list of official websites providing Navy career information and resources.

Pay and Personnel Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs)

Description

Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for more than 30 common pay and personnel transactions identify the individual systems, users, and step-by-step procedures required to complete PASS processes correctly and on time.

- SOPs begin with the individual Sailor, transition through designated support personnel – CPC, PSD Clerk, PSD Supervisor, etc. – and then return to the Sailor for final verification that the transaction was completed properly. Additional SOP user roles include the CCC, ESO and Disbursing Officer, when appropriate.
- Every SOP identifies the specific tasks and individual steps that each user must complete, providing transparency throughout the entire process.
- Pull down menus allow users to filter SOPs by user role.
- References, policy documents, forms and checklists, user aids, best practices, and sources of support ensure you have the information and resources you need to execute each SOP properly.

Required Actions

- Per <u>NAVADMIN 043/15</u>, all PSDs and all Navy commands are required to access and use the SOPs.
- SOPs include include actions required of Sailors, CPCs and other command stakeholders.
- Submit suggestions, recommendations, questions or issues regarding the SOPs to Mr. Wayne Ross, wayne.ross@navy.mil.

IMPORTANT!

Users who have not established a MPTE Portal account will see a red "Login Error" box in the top right corner of the screen. This error does NOT prevent anyone from accessing the SOP, as the user will be logged in under a generic DOD user ID.

When trying to access the interactive SOPs and the page comes up blank or only partially populated, please follow the following steps in Intenet Explorer (IE):

- Open Internet Explorer
- Press the Alt key, then press the 'T' key
- Choose "Compatibility View "settings from the menu
- Be sure that <u>navy.mil</u> is in the Compatibility View Box. If not, click add
- Place a check in the box for Display all websites in Compatibility View
- Click Close
- Exit from IE completely, restart and go back to the SOP
- The issue should be resolved



BUPERS OnLine (BOL)

Description

- BUPERS Online is a single point of entry application for logging into numerous web-based applications maintained by the Naval Personnel Command in Millington, TN. As applications are added, you will login once, and then be able to pass from application to application without the need for multiple logins.
- Log in to BOL via https://www.bol.navy.mil using your CAC and CAC-enabled computer.



Required Actions

- Establish BOL account for yourself and your Team.
- Use BOL to view the Official Military Personnel File (OMPF) for members of your command.
- Review EVAL reports.
- Review PRIMS information.
- Track Sailor reenlistment bonuses, advancement/selection results, and Fleet Reserve/Retirement applications.



Career Information Management System (CIMS)

Description

CIMS automates Career Counselor office procedures and simplifies processes supporting the command's career information program.

Using CIMS, the CCC can create and maintain Command Career Counselor records, prepare for Career Development Boards (CDBs), view Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) scores, access Selective Reenlistment Bonus (SRB) and retirement calculators, obtain a variety of lists and reports, and print certificates for reenlistment and retirement.

- Track Sailor EAOS/PRD and CDB status by generating individual reports, then exporting them into your CCC Tickler.
- Generate Individual Career Development Plan (ICDP).
- Assign command sponsor; track sponsor information.
- Generate reports for command leadership review.
- Update contact information for prospective losses.
- Input Sailor Electronic Service Record (ESR) Administrative Remarks (Page 13), as necessary. (See CIMS User Guide, Section 19, for guidance.)

NOTE: An afloat version of CIMS is available on ships with NSIPS Web Afloat server installed.



Career Management System-Interactive Detailing (CMS-ID)

Description

CMS-ID provides Sailors the ability to explore future job opportunities, identify career enhancing jobs that meet professional and personal goals, and identify the specific skills and abilities required to perform jobs they desire.

Required Actions

- (CCC Role) View Sailor Personnel and Career data; view Sailor Career Intentions; monitor Sailor Applications; provide assistance, if required.
- When CMS-ID is unavailable to Sailors, obtain current REQ data, submit Job Applications, and obtain Application Results on their behalf.
- Download and post the CMS-ID schedule 4-6 months ahead of time to support Sailors' future planning.
- Ensure Sailors review data on the CMS-ID <u>Sailor Info</u> tab beginning 18 months prior to Projected Rotation Date (PRD). Support Sailor efforts to update personnel and career data.
- Validate automatic C-WAY Reenlistment application submission for Sailors who are 12 months from PRD. Ensure the corporate data inputted is correct and accurately reflects the Sailor entering the negotiation window.
- Use CMS-ID Reports (e.g., Career Intentions) to inform and update command leadership.
- (CMD Role) Support command review of incoming Sailor applications and submit comments to Detailers.
- (CMD Role) Enter contact information for key personnel at your command and provide a link to your command's web site. This information is viewable by all CMS-ID users and supports Sailor job search and decision making.



Career Waypoints (C-WAY)

Description

Career Waypoints (C-WAY) is the IT system that supports key Sailor decisions during career management processes including:

- Reenlistment (formerly PTS/Perform to Serve)
- PACT Designation (formerly REGA/Rating Entry for General Apprentice)
- Rating Conversion
- Transition between Active Component (AC) and Reserve Component (RC)

C-WAY provides a comprehensive assessment of Sailors and their eligibility and/or qualification for Navy enlisted ratings or jobs. Using C-WAY, Counselors screen Sailors for ratings based on individual aptitude (ASVAB/AFCT scores), moral/legal status, and medical/physical status, while taking into account needs of the Navy.

Required Actions

- Use C-WAY PACT Designation module to screen undesignated Sailors prior to requesting Rating Entry Designation, Apprenticeship change, Navy Wide Advancement Exam quota, or "A" School assignment.
- Use C-WAY Reenlistment module to validate Sailor qualifications and to submit applications as directed by current policy directives.
- Ensure CDBs are conducted (15-24 months prior to PRD/SEAOS).
- Ensure C-WAY Reenlistment applications are completed when generated by the system.
- Review C-WAY Reenlistment monthly results and update Sailor applications as necessary to increase retention opportunities.
- Ensure counseling is conducted for all Sailors who have not been selected for INRATE/Conversion approval after two reviews/looks.
- Ensure Sailors not selected for Reenlistment are provided counseling on the benefits of Reserve Affiliation.
- Validate automatic C-WAY Reenlistment application submission for Sailors who are 12 months from PRD and have less than 24 months contract remaining. Ensure corporate data is correct and accurately reflects the Sailor entering the negotiation window.
- When counseling Sailors, use the Enlisted Community Manager's Rating Health Slides to determine whether conversion or rating entry is advantageous based on rating health and year group. Go to http://www.public.navy.mil/bupers-npc/enlisted/community/Pages/default.aspx.



Tools

Fleet Training Management and Planning System (FLTMPS)

Description

FLTMPS integrates manpower, personnel, training and education (MPTE) information into a single reporting system. FLTMPS enables access to numerous reports to assist in monitoring and managing training requirements, unit manning, Sailor personnel records, and Sailor training status.

Using FLTMPS, Counselors can view Sailor's Administrative Data, NECs, Career History, Education, Language Skills, and Quals/ Certs. Available reports include Advancement, Time-in-Rate Eligible, Projected Gains/Losses, Career Status Bonus, Education Summary, and Dependent Care Plan, among others. All reports can be printed and/or downloaded into Excel documents for viewing at a later date.

Officer Personnel Information System (OPINS)

Description

Using OPINS, Counselors input Sailor requests for SRB, STAR, Career Status Bonus (CSB), and transfer to the Fleet Reserve. Log in to OPINS at https://miap.csd.disa.mil using CAC and CACenabled computer.

Required Actions

- Use OPINS to view servicemember's career history and other information.
- Log in to the system at least once per month to prevent suspension of your account access. (If your account has not been accessed for three months, it will be deleted and you will have to repeat the access request process.)



Transaction Online Processing System (TOPS)

Description

TOPS enables designated command personnel to communicate safely and efficiently with Personnel Support Detachment (PSD) representatives via the Internet. Customer commands submit, track and receive feedback on pay and personnel related transactions.

TOPS uses secure network protocol to protect Sailors' Personal Identifying Information (PII) when transferring personnel documents used to update NSIPS.

Required Actions

- Use TOPS as directed by NAVADMIN 044/09.
- Use TOPS to submit personnel documents to PSD, CSD or NOSC for subsequent data entry into NSIPS and OMPF.
- Direct Sailors to monitor OMPF and ESR and verify documentation of personal, personnel, and career data.



Transition Assistance Program (DD Form 2648 and 2648-1)

Description

To ensure Sailors fully understand their eligibility and how to access services and benefits, Career Counselors provide a legally-mandated, pre-separation counseling session to transitioning Sailors who have been on active duty for more than 180 days. Counseling is conducted no later than 90 days prior to projected separation/retirement date. Sailors separated or retired due to disability receive counseling regardless of length of service.

Per NAVADMIN 300/11, Career Counselors will document all preseparation counseling via online DD Form 2648 and 2648-1.

Required Actions

- Attend the DOD Pre-Separation Training Course as soon as operationally possible. Participating command/units incur no costs for tuition, airline travel, lodging, meals, hotel shuttle, or per diem. Contact CNIC Force Career Counselor for a course quota.
- Establish access to the Transition Assistance Program online tool from OPNAV N17.
- Review the Verbatim Script for Pre-Separation Counseling checklist (DD Form 2648 & 2648-1).
- Counsel separating Sailors, utilizing the Verbatim Script for Pre-Separation Counseling.
- Generate a DD Form 2648 or 2648-1 Pre-Separation Counseling Checklist on each separating Sailor who has more than 180 days of active service.
- Ensure Sailor is scheduled and attends Transition GPS.



Voluntary Education (VOLED) / Navy College Program (NCP)

Description

The Navy College Program (NCP) can help Sailors achieve education goals and make productive use of their off-duty time. NCP is administered at local installation Navy College Offices (NCO) and off-site via the Virtual Education Center (VEC). Navy VOLED is a network of professional education counselors, education technicians, and supporting program managers that provide educational services for Navy personnel at fleet and shore commands worldwide. NCP ensures on base and on board education programs are compatible with operating schedules concurrently supporting fleet readiness & mission accomplishment.

- Tuition Assistance/GEV/AEV/Other
- NCPACE
- USMAP
- Testing Services (CLEP, DSST, ACT, SAT etc.)
