

Lt. Col. (Retired) Scott Fedorchak is currently an instructor of physics at Campbell University, Buies Creek, N.C. He graduated and received his commission as a second lieutenant from the United States Military Academy, West Point, N.Y., with a concentration in physics and nuclear engineering. He has a master of science in business administration from Boston University, Boston, Mass., and a master of science in physics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Cambridge, Mass.
