New Convoy Live Fire Exercise with M1151 and mounted M249

Relevant, realistic training, conducting 8 Individual Task and 3 Battle Drills was accomplished with the pilot run orchestrated by the 266th Task Force during Log Warrior rotation 10-05. The training was a success two fold. One, the use of strictly M1151 during the Convoy Live Fire Exercise was the BDE first look and simulation of reality in reference to the current operational picture in the CJOA. Soldiers engaged targets from the turret of the M1151 and dismounted the vehicle which can compare to a convoy encountering a block ambush and down vehicle in theater. Second, the training was conducted safely without losing its sense of realism. The Soldiers really enjoyed thissample of the future of the Convoy Live Fire Exercise at Log Warrior. The USSOCOM Combat Convoy C.A.L.L Handbook supports that this training is indeed relevant due to the Soldiers being required reacting to contact, mount and dismount vehicle, and fire the M249
