## SHARP VICTIM ADVOCATE AND FILING REPORTS

The Victim Advocate is a trained professional who provides non-clinical advocacy services and support to Soldiers and family members experiencing Sexual Assault.

The Victim Advocates are on-call 24-hours-a-day, 7-days-a-week to provide crisis intervention, safety planning, nonjudgmental support, assistance in securing medical treatment for injuries, information on legal rights and proceedings and referrals to military and civilian resources.

Victim Advocates provide/explain reporting options — Restricted and Unrestricted Reports.

Victim Advocates attend medical examinations where the Sexual Assault Forensic Exam kit is conducted.

Victim Advocates attend investigative interviews, assist a victim before, during and after a legal interview.

Victim Advocates provide support before and after meetings of the victim and his/her supervisor (military) that centers on awareness and prevention, training and education, victim advocacy, response, reporting and accountability. Army policies promote sensitive care for victims of Sexual Assault and accountability for those who commit these crimes.



### RESTRICTED SEXUAL ASSAULT REPORT:

Restricted reporting offers Soldiers and Family members (except underage children) the option to report a sexual assault without having to notify law enforcement. This option is only available if you report the incident to your victim advocate, medical care facility or sexual assault response coordinator.

### UNRESTRICTED SEXUAL ASSAULT REPORT:

Unrestricted reporting is the military's preferred reporting method because it provides the widest latitude to help and protect victims of sexual assault. Through this option, details of the incident are kept confidential and are only disclosed on a need to know basis. An Unrestricted report triggers an investigation so that offenders may be held accountable and the safety of the victim is ensured.

### THE ARMY SEXUAL HARASSMENT/ASSAULT RESPONSE & PREVENTION

Reinforces the Army's commitment to eliminating incidents of sexual assault through a comprehensive program that centers on awareness and prevention, training and education, victim advocacy, response, reporting and accountability. Army policies promote sensitive care for victims of sexual assault and accountability for those who commit these crimes.

In order to stop sexual harassment, the aggrieved is encouraged to report the inappropriate behavior to the chain of command through the unit SHARP Victim Advocate (VA). Once you have spoken with your SHARP VA it is strictly your choice to choose an Informal or Formal reporting option.

If you are a civilian employee, report the behavior to your supervisor or to the Equal Employment Opportunity Office.

If the behavior persists, file a formal sexual harassment complaint through the Sexual Assault Response Coordinator. If you are a civilian employee, report the incident to your Equal Employment Opportunity Office. AR-600-20, Appendix D. /AR 690-600.

Individuals who desire to file a sexual harassment complaint should take the following steps:

- Informal complaints: Report inappropriate behavior without initiating a full investigation. This may be appropriate for minor infractions where the individual simply wants the behavior stopped. Commander involvement with resolutions and punitive actions where applicable. No strict timelines and constraints.
- Formal complaints require strict timelines and constraints. The complainant will specify in detail the incident and swears to the accuracy of the information.
- Civilian personnel must consult with the organizations servicing Equal Employment Opportunity Office.
