Sgt. Maj. Marvin E. Henley began his military career Feb. 21, 1989. He enlisted into the U.S. Army under the Delayed Entry Program and attended One Station Unit Training (OSUT) at Fort Knox, Kentucky, and was awarded the MOS 19K (M1 Armor Crewman). He later reclassified and attended Advanced Individual Training (AIT) at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, and was awarded the MOS 56M (Religious Affairs Specialist). Henley assumed responsibility as the U.S. Army Europe Chief, Religious Affairs Sergeant Major July 29, 2015.
