

AAFES: Shopping Center







- The building pad is approximately 80% completed with crane roads being installed to allow for steel erection to begin
- Foundation work to include the pouring of footers to begin around 1 April ending in 60 days
- More than 20,000 cubic yards of fill dirt have been removed from the pad site
- Installation of storm and sanitary lines around the building parameter is underway
- Temp parking locations complete to include handicap parking in both locations.





AAFES: 32 Gate Mapes EXPRESS



- Construction trailer for the general contractor, Commercial Construction is in place at the site with temporary electrical hook-up completed on Tuesday.
- Contractor was issued a Limited Notice to Proceed on 8 March. No earth work can be done until the unlimited Notice to Proceed is issued.
- Contractor can begin doing selective demolition work to include removal of sports fence, scoreboard, and some trees as long as no land is disturbed.
- Contractor has been issued the following permits: excavation, pavement demolition and Maryland Department of the Environment.
- Waiting on NPDES (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System) permit to be issued which should be around 19 April. Can't operate any equipment on the site to displace soil until the permit is issued.
- A pre-construction meeting is being planned for some time during the second week of April.
- Projected timeline for construction is 7-8 months with completion occurring in December 2013.
