SUBJECT: Fort George G. Meade Policy Memorandum #37, Notification and Reservation of Allegations of Misconduct by Commissioned Officers, Warrant Officers, and any Soldier in the Grade of E-8 and Above

1. REFERENCES.

a. Army General Order Number 37, dated 18 August 1988.

b. Military District of Washington Memorandum, SUBJECT: Court-Martial Convening Authorities and Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) Command Authority for the U.S. Army Military District of Washington (MDW) General Court-Martial Jurisdiction, dated 11 February 2013.

2. PURPOSE. To ensure prompt notification and disposition of allegations of misconduct committed by officers, warrant officers, and Soldiers in the rank of E-8 and above within the General Court-Martial Convening Authority (GCMCA) of Fort George G. Meade.

3. APPLICABILITY. This policy applies to all commands, units, activities, and personnel, attached under the GCMCA for Fort George G. Meade, pursuant to the MDW Jurisdiction Memorandum, dated 10 September 2013.

4. POLICY.

a. Notification. Pursuant to my authority and obligations as the commander of Fort George G. Meade, I require notification of any alleged misconduct committed by commissioned officers, warrant officers, or Soldiers in the rank of E-8 and above. Within 24 hours of becoming aware of the alleged misconduct, commanders will notify the Commander, Fort George G. Meade.

b. Withholding. Pursuant to my authority and obligations as the commander of Fort George G. Meade, I hereby withhold initial disposition authority over all alleged misconduct committed by commissioned officers, warrant officers, or Soldiers in the rank of E-8 and above.

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5. EXCEPTIONS. A commander may request an exception to this policy when he or she feels the Soldier's offense(s) warrants disposition at his or her command level. A commander requesting such an exception must submit his or her request in writing to the Commander, U.S. Army Garrison, ATTN: IMME-ZA, Fort George G. Meade, Maryland 5000, through the U.S. Army Garrison Office of the Staff Judge Advocate, ATTN: IMME-JA (ATTN: Chief, Military Justice Division), 4217 Roberts Avenue, Fort George G. Meade, Maryland 20755-5030.
