Uniformed and civilian, an Army Professional is an expert certified within the Profession and bonded with comrades in a shared identity and culture of sacrifice and service to the Nation.

Commitment

To the mission despite risk, challenge, and adversity.

Recommended for Warrant Officers.




The High Ground

Become a rising Platoon Sergeant who faces formidable challenges in both garrison and deployed environments. **Recommended for Sergeant to Sergeant First Class.**


