Corps of Engineers Recreation

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is the leading provider of water-based outdoor recreation in the nation. More than 420 lakes and river projects in 44 states provide a diverse range of recreational opportunities. Visitors of all ages can enjoy outdoor activities like hiking, wildlife viewing, boating, fishing, camping and hunting. For those more adventurous there is snorkeling, windsurfing, whitewater rafting, mountain biking and geocaching. A visit to a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' recreation area can strengthen family ties and friendships, connect people to nature and create unforgettable memories that will last a lifetime.

Nationwide Reservation System

Campsite and Picnic Shelter Reservations at Corps of Engineers lakes and rivers can be made by phone 1-877-444-6777, internet www.Recreation.gov or in person at some campgrounds or local management offices.





Fees

The Corps of Engineers charges a fee for camping and may charge a separate fee for use of swimming beaches, boat launching ramps and group use. Some areas leased to others may have a different fee system. For specific details regarding fees at any location contact the local management office.

Annual Day Use Pass

Annual day use passes can be purchased at Corps of Engineers locations where day use fees are charged for beach and boat ramp usage. The pass is valid nationwide at any Corps of Engineers location and is good for one year from the date of purchase.

Fee Discount Programs

America the Beautiful - the National Parks and Federal Recreation Land (ATB) Senior and Access Passes, Golden Age and Access cardholders receive a 50 percent reduction in fees including camping and day use fees and on the purchase of an annual day use pass. These cards are not available for sale at Corps of Engineers locations. A list of nationwide locations where these cards are sold is available at http://store.usgs.gov/pass/PasslssuanceList.pdf. Military Discounts

The U.S. military and their dependents can obtain a free ATB Annual Pass for Military. Active duty military personnel qualify for a fee waiver for Corps of Engineers day use if they present a Department of Defense ID (CAC Card) or ATB Annual Pass for Military. To obtain a camping fee waiver, a military member must show their mid- or post-deployment (reintegration) leave orders in addition to their CAC card or ATB Military Pass.

- Keep your pet on a leash.




Tips for Your Safety

While recreating in the outdoors always expect the unexpected. One careless moment can result in a lifetime of regret.

- Life jackets come in many styles and colors; choose the right one for you and wear it.
- Watch your children because it only takes seconds to drown.
- Swim in designated areas and always with a companion.
- Plan ahead and be prepared.
- Check the weather in advance.
- File a trip plan with someone you know.
- Invest in a marine band radio.
- Boat sober and stay alert.
- Be courteous to others and follow the navigation rules on the water.
- Be aware of natural hazards such as submerged stumps, logs, dikes, rocks and sandbars that are not always visible.

Nestled in Alabama's southwest hill country, the lake encompasses over 60 miles of the Alabama River and offers extensive opportunities for water-related recreation. The Black Warrior and Tombigbee Lakes consist of six lakes with a combined total length of 457 miles and 39,800 acres of water for boaters to enjoy. The Tenn-Tom Waterway is an outdoor enthusiasts' paradise.





Our goal is to enhance the public's understanding of the multidimensional role of the U.S. Army and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Particular emphasis is on water resources development that affects the lives of all the residents of Hawaii and the people of the Pacific. The Pacific Regional Visitor Center is located on the second floor of historic Battery Randolph at Fort DeRussy, Waikiki. Battery Randolph is listed on the National Register of Historic Sites and is one of 16 coastal fortifications built by the Corps of Engineers between 1906 and 1917 for the protection of Honolulu and Pearl Harbors.

Lives and property are safer today along the Clearwater River because of flood protection created by Dworshak Dam. It is the highest straight-axis concrete gravity dam in North America at 717 feet. The dam created a 54 mile long reservoir surrounded by lush, forested mountains that awaits your discovery with boating, hiking, wildlife watching, picnicking, camping, hunting and fishing.

Sitting on the Pend Oreille River 90 miles upstream from where it enters the mighty Columbia River, is Albeni Falls Dam. Waters of the Pend Oreille stretch 65 miles through a glacially carved, U-shaped valley that separates three lofty mountain ranges: the Cabinets, the Selkirks and the Coeur d'Alene's. Lake Pend Oreille is one of the largest and deepest natural lakes in the western United States, plunging to a depth of 1,237 feet at its deepest. A wide variety of recreation opportunities and experiences await you.



At the upper and lower entrances of the Keweenaw Waterway Project on the Portage River in the Keweenaw Peninsula, Houghton County, Michigan, are two harbors of refuge. Recreational areas managed by State and local agencies at the upper entrance include boating, swimming and picnic facilities. The lower entrance, Portage Entry, has a restroom facility and a boat launch.

The St. Marys River flows between Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan and Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, Canada. Four of the five world famous Soo Locks are located on the Michigan side. Visitors view lake freighters and ocean-going ships traverse the locks between Lake Superior to the north and Lake Huron to the south. At the visitor center a large relief map of the Great Lakes region as well as other interesting exhibits, maps and photographs are on display.

Fort Peck Dam is one of the ten largest earth-filled dams in the world. The dam spans across the Missouri River from bluff to bluff covering four miles. Fort Peck Lake is a Montana treasure for its size and outdoor opportunities. Six recreation areas within a few miles of the dam, as well as numerous other recreation areas, are dispersed along the 134-mile long reservoir.

Nestled in the mountains of northwestern Montana lies one of the state's best-kept secrets. Libby Dam provides a delicate balance between flood protection, hydropower, recreation and environmental stewardship. Visit the interactive exhibits in our visitor center. Picnicking, camping and fishing are also popular in the warmer seasons. Tours of Libby Dam are available available year-round by appointment.
