COLONEL PATRICIA D. HOFFMAN

Colonel Patricia D. Hoffman is Vice Commander, Jeanne M. Holm Center for Officer Accessions and Citizen Development, Maxwell Air Force Base, Ala. The Holm Center provides command and oversight for approximately 16,000 cadets in 145 detachments of the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps, 1,900 trainees in Officer Training School and more than 120,000 cadets in 878 high schools supporting Air Force Junior ROTC. The Holm Center trains more than 70 percent of the Air Force's line, chaplain, judge advocate and medical officers. The center also provides oversight for the Civil Air Patrol in its role as the Air Force's official auxiliary.

Colonel Hoffman entered the Air Force through Officer Training School, where she graduated first in her class in January 1987. She is an air battle manager with more than 2,400 flying hours in the E-3 AWACS, including 495 combat and combat support flying hours. She has served in a variety of airborne and ground command and control units and has commanded at the squadron, group and wing levels.



Colonel Hoffman deployed to Saudi Arabia for Operation

Desert Storm and to Bosnia-Herzegovina in support of the United Nations Stabilization Force. As commander of the 608th Combat Operations Squadron, Colonel Hoffman led her squadron in Operations Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom, the unit's first wartime deployments. As wing commander, she led the Air Force's only wing with both air (AWACS) and ground (CRC) C2 weapon systems. Colonel Hoffman was the recipient of the 1992 Secretary of the Air Force Leadership Award and is an Olmsted Scholar, having studied "*politikwissenschaft*" (political science) at the Universität Augsburg, Germany.
