"CHECK LIST" FOR USE IN PREPARING BLOCK 13 OF THE DoD IG SUBPOENA REQUEST FORM WHEN INVESTIGATING A COMPLEX PROCUREMENT FRAUD CASE

- 1. Identify all parties involved in the fraud scheme, both business entities and individuals, by:
 - a. name;
 - b. by role/function; *i.e.*, prime contractor, tier one subcontractor, tier two subcontractor, competitor, subcontractor's owner, subcontractor's purchasing manager, prime contractor's contract administrator, Government Contracting Officer (CO)/purchase agent/Contracting Officer's Representative (COR)/Contracting Officer's Technical Representative (COTR), Quality Assurance Representative (QAR).
- 2. Identify all of the contract(s) at issue by:
 - a. contract number;
 - b. contract type; *i.e.*, fixed price, cost reimbursement, incentive fee, indefinite delivery indefinite quantity (IDIQ), time and materials (T&M).
- 3. Identify when (ideally the month and year) the fraud scheme started and when it ended, if it has ended.
 - a. Explain how you determined/established these dates.

- 4. With regard to the alleged false claim(s)/statement(s) which form the basis for the criminal/civil fraud investigation, identify/describe:
 - a. to whom the false claim(s)/statement(s) were made; *i.e.*, the CO, COR, COTR, QAR, DFAS paying agent, Small Business Administration(SBA);
 - b. who made/submitted the false claim(s)/statement(s); either the business entity or the individual(s), or if possible, both;
 - c. the false claim(s)/statement(s), itself; *i.e.*, representation regarding the origin of the material provided, representation regarding compliance with Buy America Act, representation regarding qualification of workers performing work, quantity of material supplied;
 - d. what is the basis/bases for your conclusion(s) that the claim(s)/statement(s) is false (*i.e.*, credible evidence that a crime has been committed)?
- 5. If you are seeking a document/category of documents that the Government should already have in its possession; *i.e.*, the contract(s) at issue, contract specifications, vouchers and supporting information submitted to DFAS by the contractor in order to get paid, explain why either:
 - a. those documents are not available from the Government's files; or
 - b. the Government's copy of those documents is insufficient/inadequate for your investigative requirements.

- 6. Cross check the information set forth in Block 13 with the specific document requests you have set forth in Block 30 to ensure that the Block 13 write-up contains sufficient information so that:
 - a. the reader can understand how/why each specific document/category of documents you are seeking to obtain via subpoena fits into your investigation; *i.e.*, why each specific document/category of documents you are seeking is relevant to your investigation and/or helps prove an element of the criminal or offense at issue;
 - b. to the extent that the existing Block 13 write-up does **NOT** make this linkage between the specific document/category of documents you are seeking to obtain via subpoena and your case clear, add additional verbiage in Block 13 to more fully explain the relevance of the document/category of documents to your investigation.

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
