- The Illinois Army National Guard's top Soldier said he was motivated to win by the love of his family and of a hometown still recovering from a devastating 2013 tornado.

Seven Soldiers from across the state met at the Illinois National Guard's Marseilles Training Area in Marseilles, Illinois April 9 for a four-day competition to determine the best enlisted Soldier and non-commissioned officer in the Illinois Army National Guard.

This year's winners are both members of

the 444th Chemical Company in Galesburg, Illinois.

Spc. Paul Born of Washington, Illinois, took honors as Illinois' enlisted Soldier of the Year and Sgt. Christopher Morris of Springfield, Illinois, took the spot as Illinois' NCO of the Year.

"I knew that I had to train hard," said Born. "My motivation to win came from the love of my family and the love for my hometown." Born's hometown of Washington, Illinois was devastated by a tornado in November 2013.
