

COUNTERDRUG

DETECT + INTERDICT + DISRUPT + CURTAIL

Authorities:

Section 112, Title 32, United States Code (32 USC 112)(D), authorizes the National Guard, as a component of the Department of Defense, to conduct counterdrug operations.

32 USC 112 authorizes the Secretary of Defense to provide funds to the state's governor who requests funds for drug interdiction and counterdrug activities to be carried out by National Guard members in that state.

Upon approval from the Secretary of Defense, DOD funds each respective state plan through the Chief, National Guard Bureau (CNGB).

Section 1004 of the FY1991
National Defense
Authorization Act
(P. L. 101-510)
authorizes the Secretary of
Defense to provide an
expanded range of
counterdrug support to any
other department or agency
of the federal government or
any state, local, or foreign law
enforcement agency,
provided that such support
meets specific procedural
criteria.









The National Guard Counterdrug Program's mission is to support the detection, interdiction, disruption, and curtailment of drug trafficking activities and use through the application of military unique skills and resources.

Law Enforcement Support

National Guard Counterdrug Criminal Analysts act as force multipliers for federal, state, local and tribal agencies providing support with link analysis, document exploitation, financial analysis and case construction. Their focus is on the disruption of illicit drug financing, production, transportation and distribution.

National Guard Counterdrug Aviation provides law enforcement agencies with aerial observation, photographic imagery and communication support. Both the Army & Air National Guard have assets available for use in Counterdrug operations.

National Guard Training Center Personnel provide specialized training and facilities for law enforcement agencies, interagency partners and military personnel.

National Guard Federal Operations Personnel provide mobile radar, Airborne Reconnaissance Signals Intelligence, language, transcription, linguistics, criminal analysis, and air surveillance support for counter-narcotics operations in support of CONUS Federal Law Enforcement and Joint Interagency Task Force South programs.

Civil Operations

National Guard Civil Operations Specialists coach community coalitions in the implementation of better processes to help make coalitions more effective in reducing substance abuse.

Substance Abuse / Prevention, Treatment & Outreach

National Guard Counterdrug Substance Abuse and Prevention, Treatment & Outreach Personnel conduct evidence-based prevention education; refer service members to local prevention and treatment services, and conduct outreach activities for family members and community partners.
